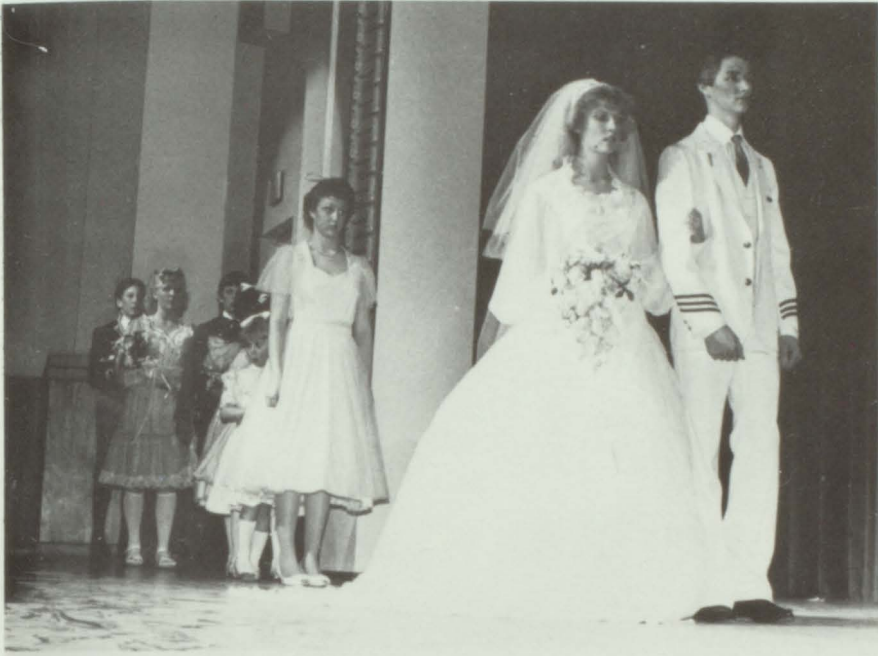
SOUND OF MUSIC
