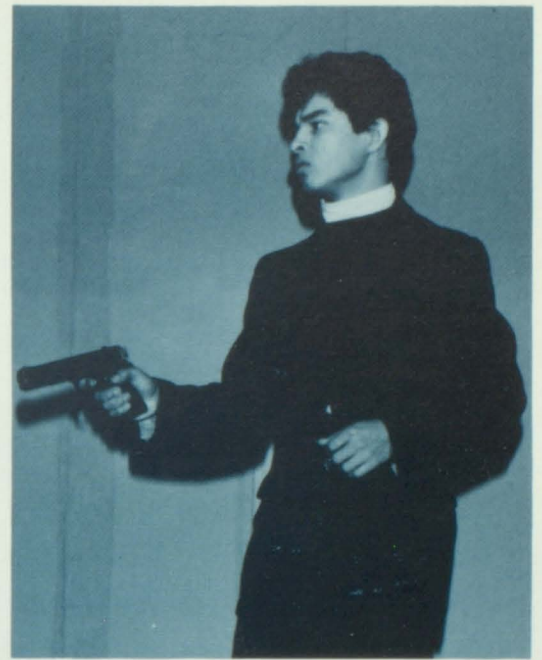


"SEE HOW THEY RUN . . ." an incredibly hilarious farce about an abnormal vicarage.

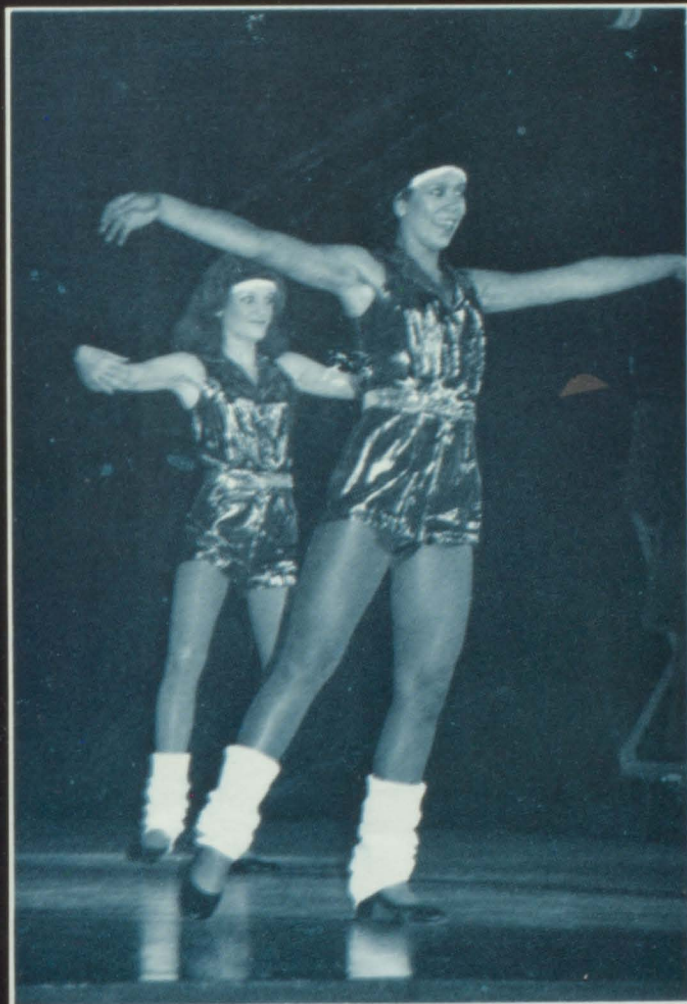

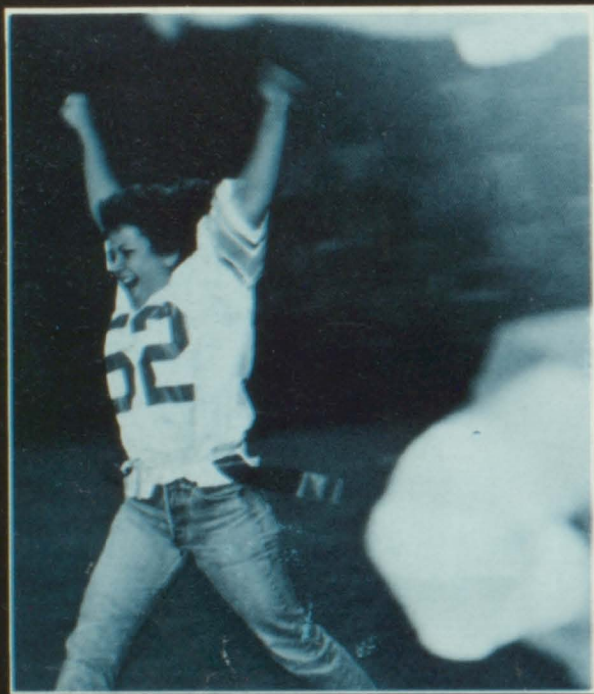

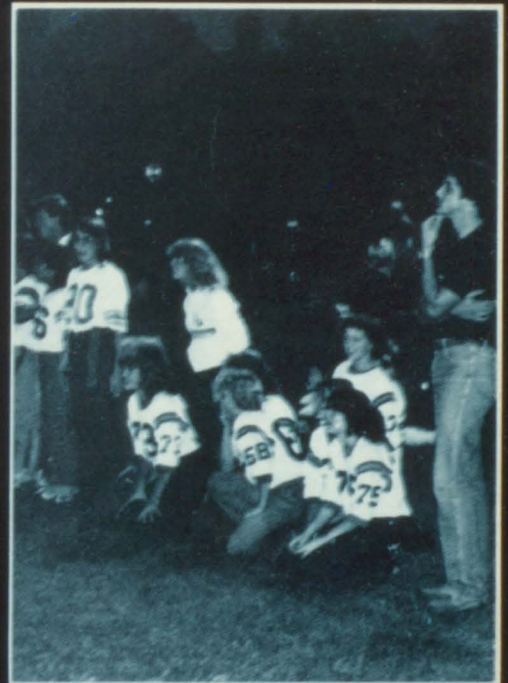




POWDER PUFF

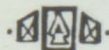

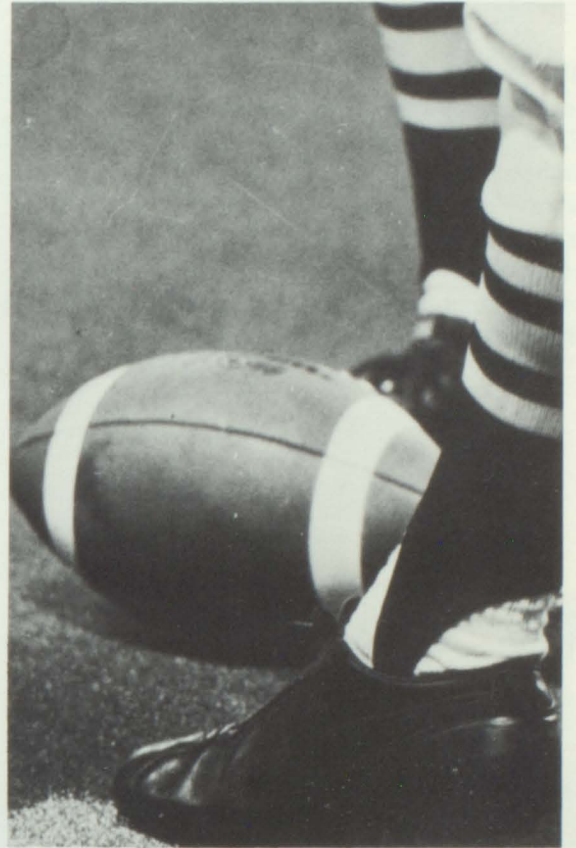

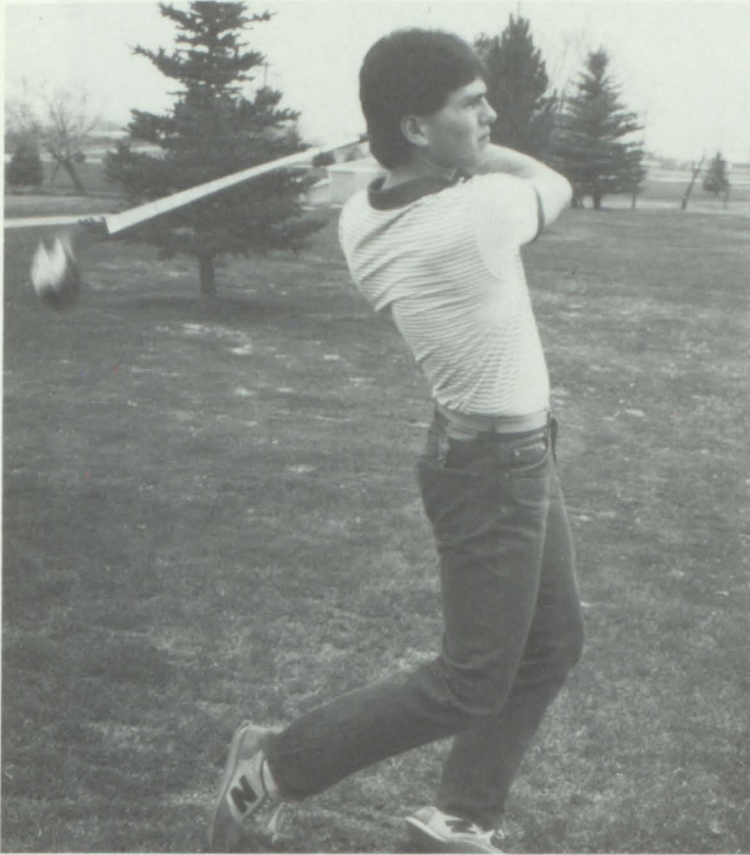

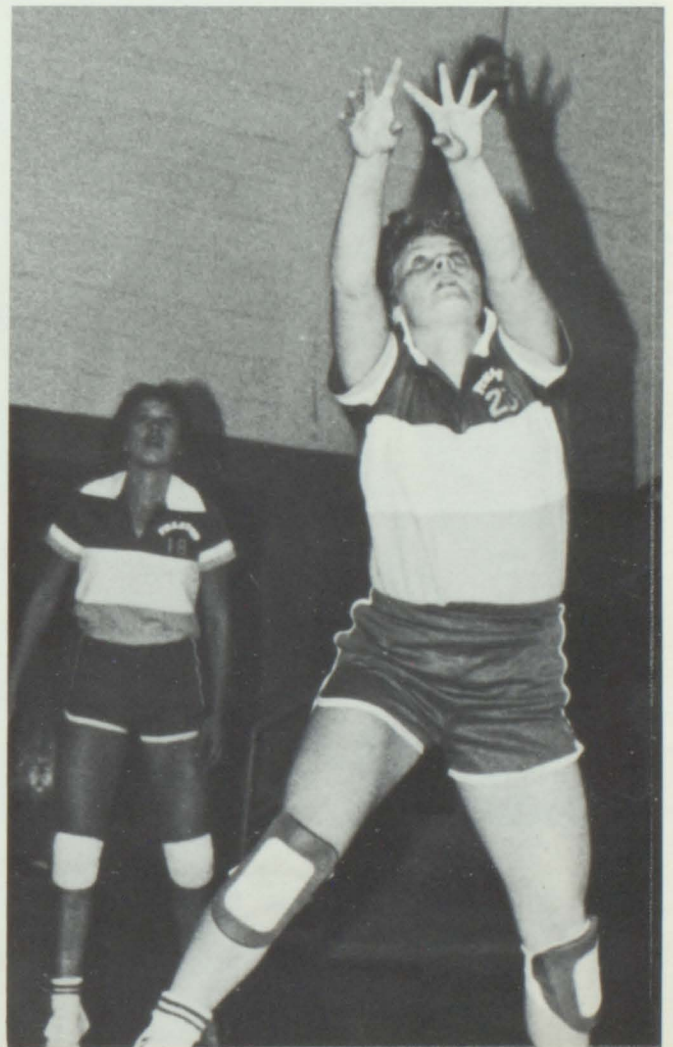

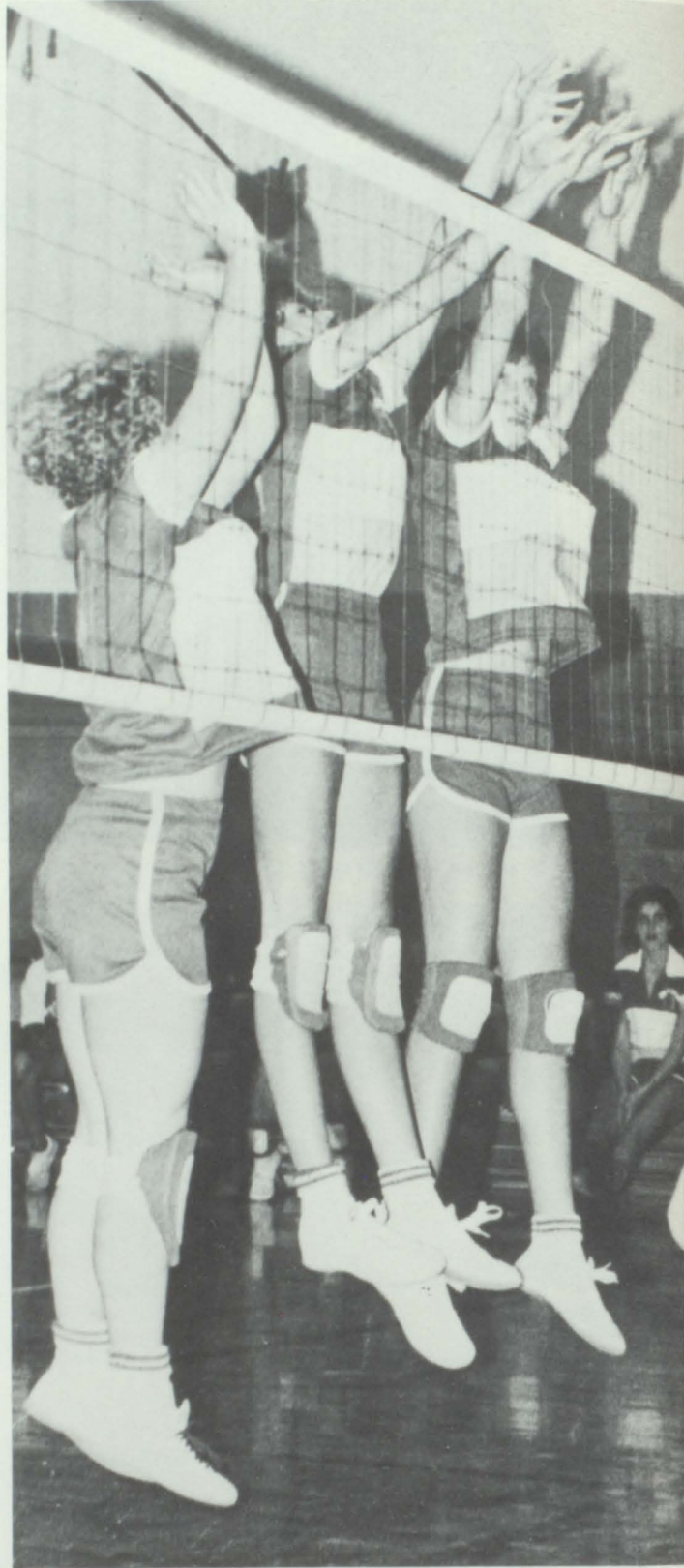

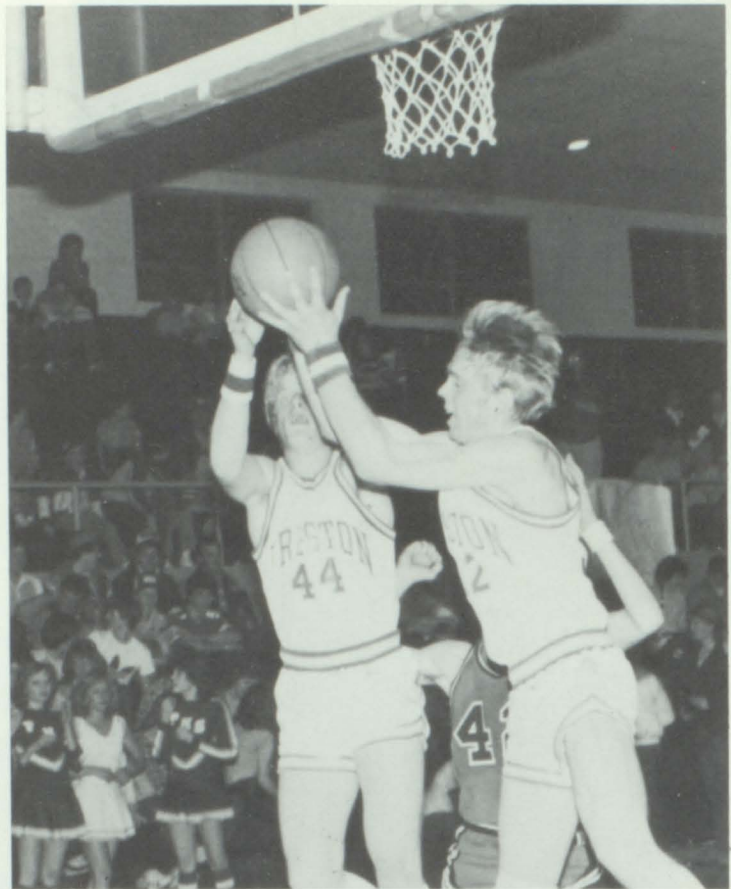
1982-83 SCHOLAR- ATHLETES.

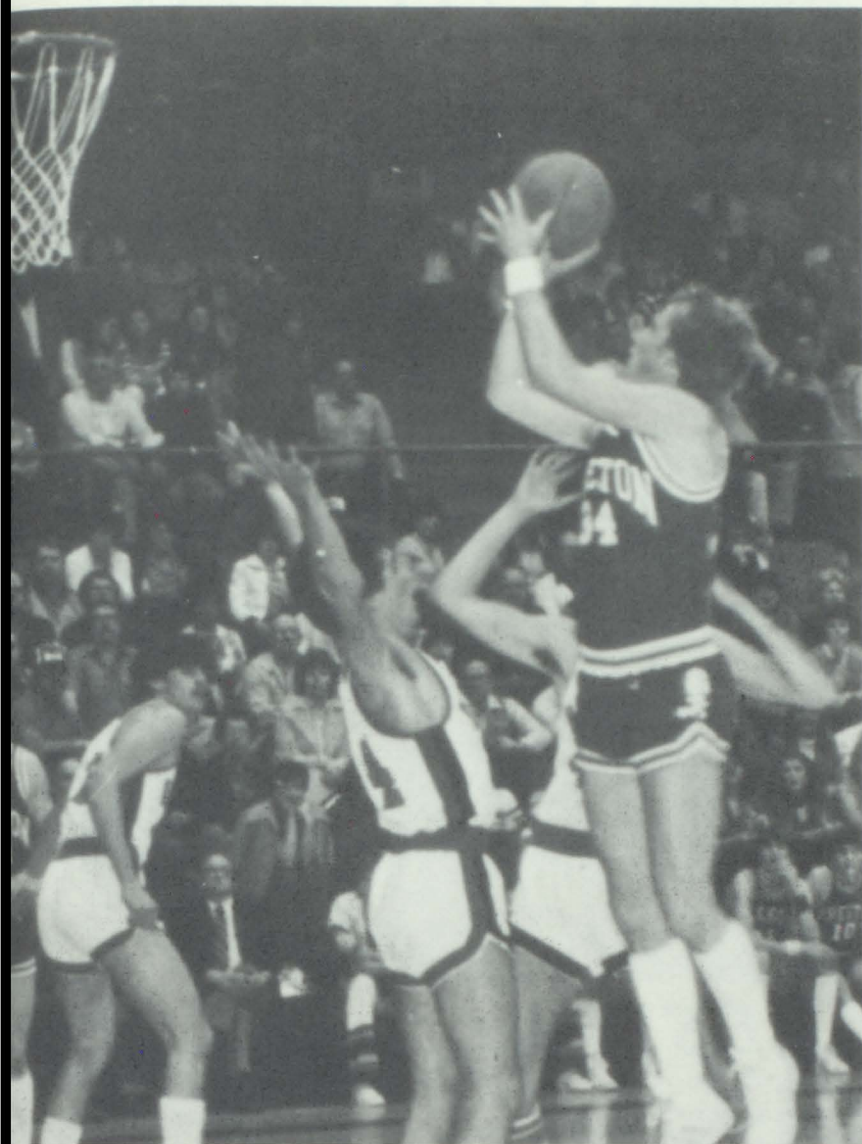

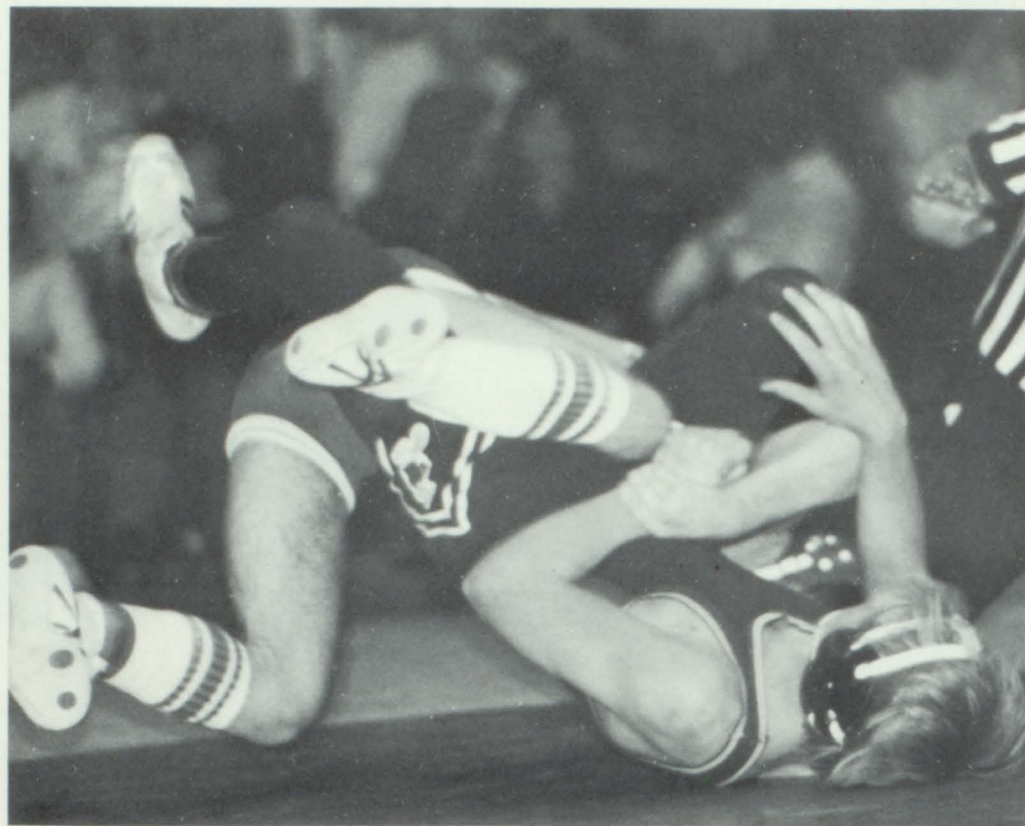

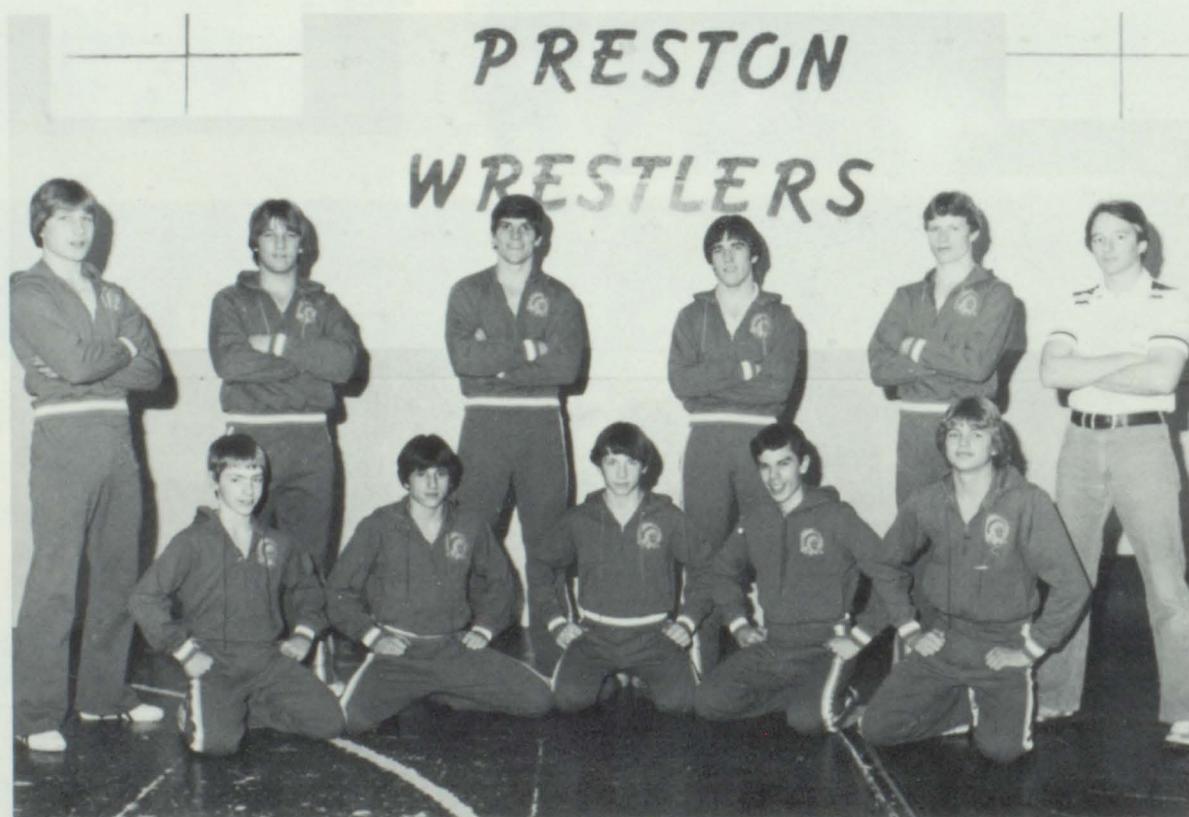


WRESTLERS TAKE 6TH AT STATE

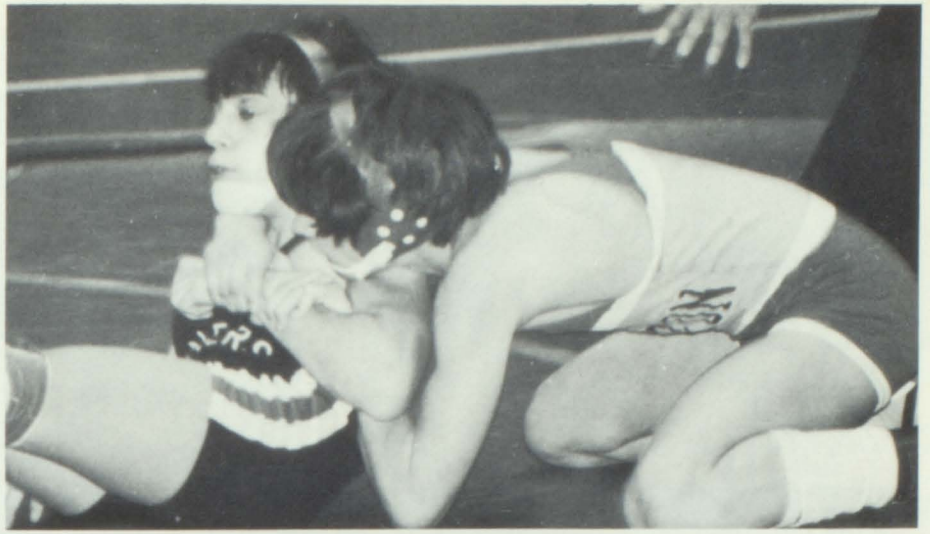

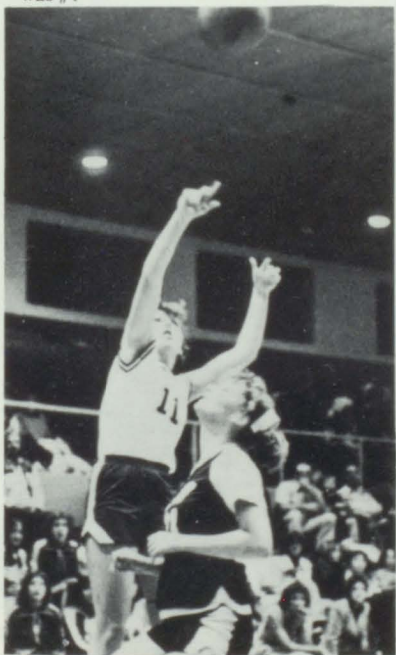

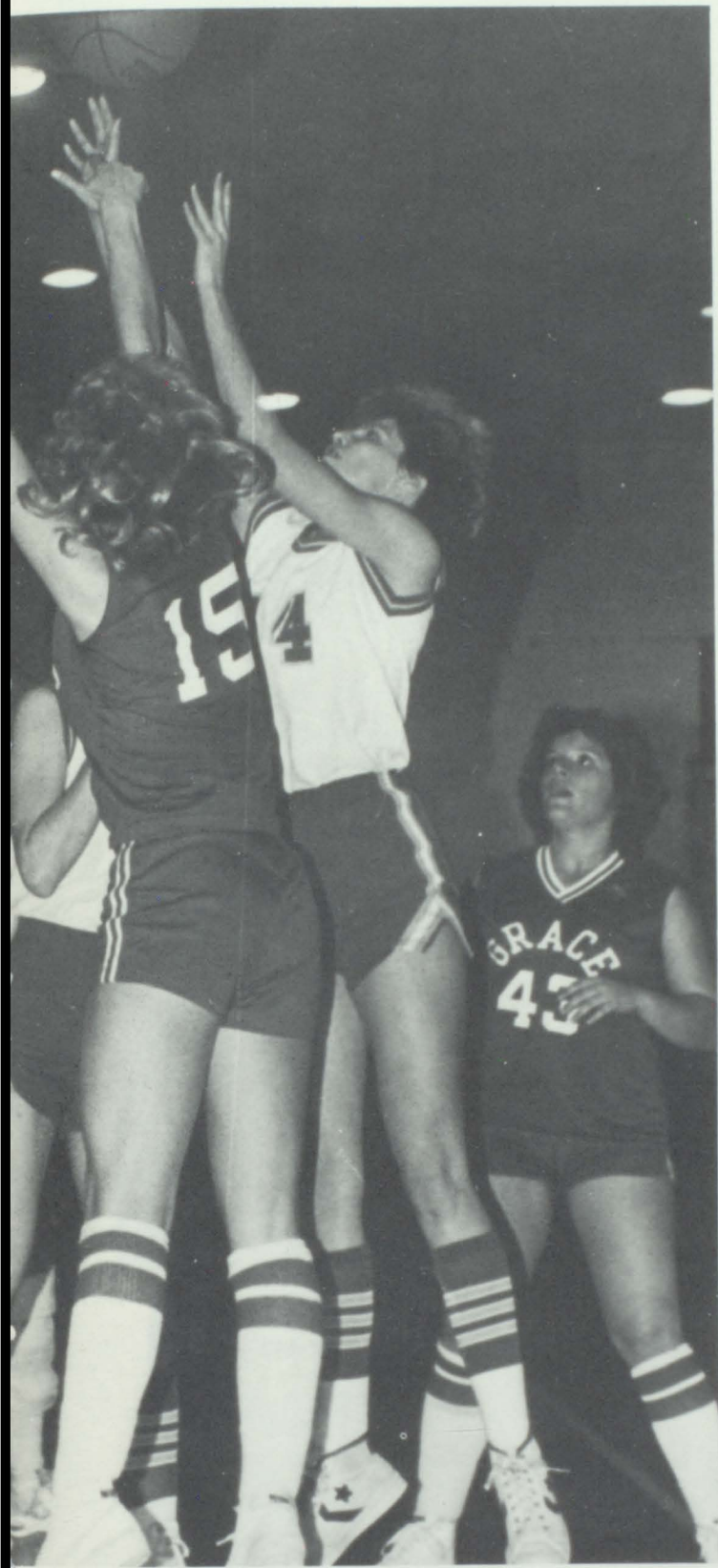

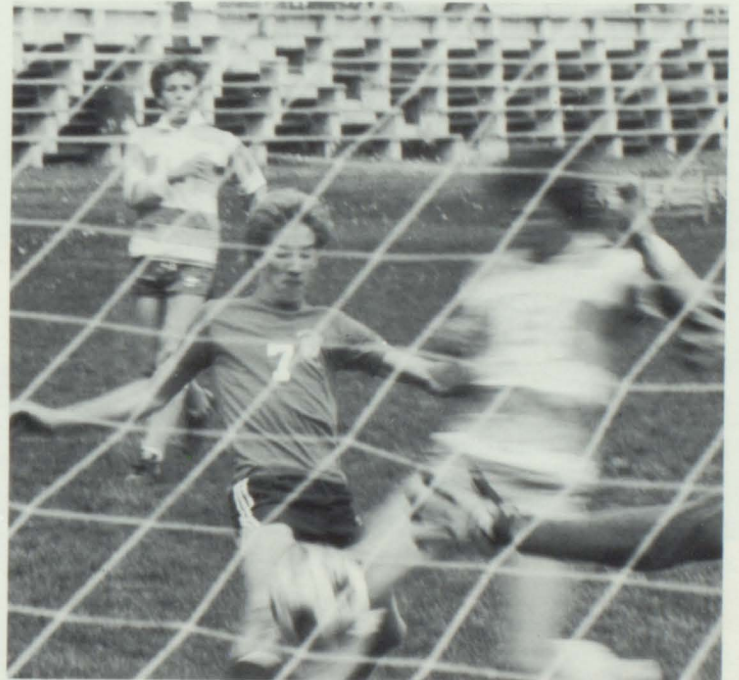

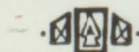
VICA

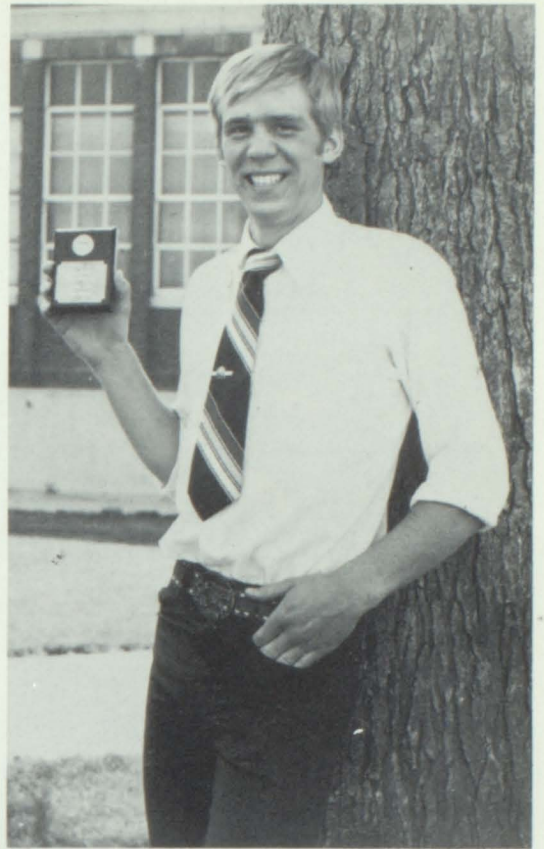
