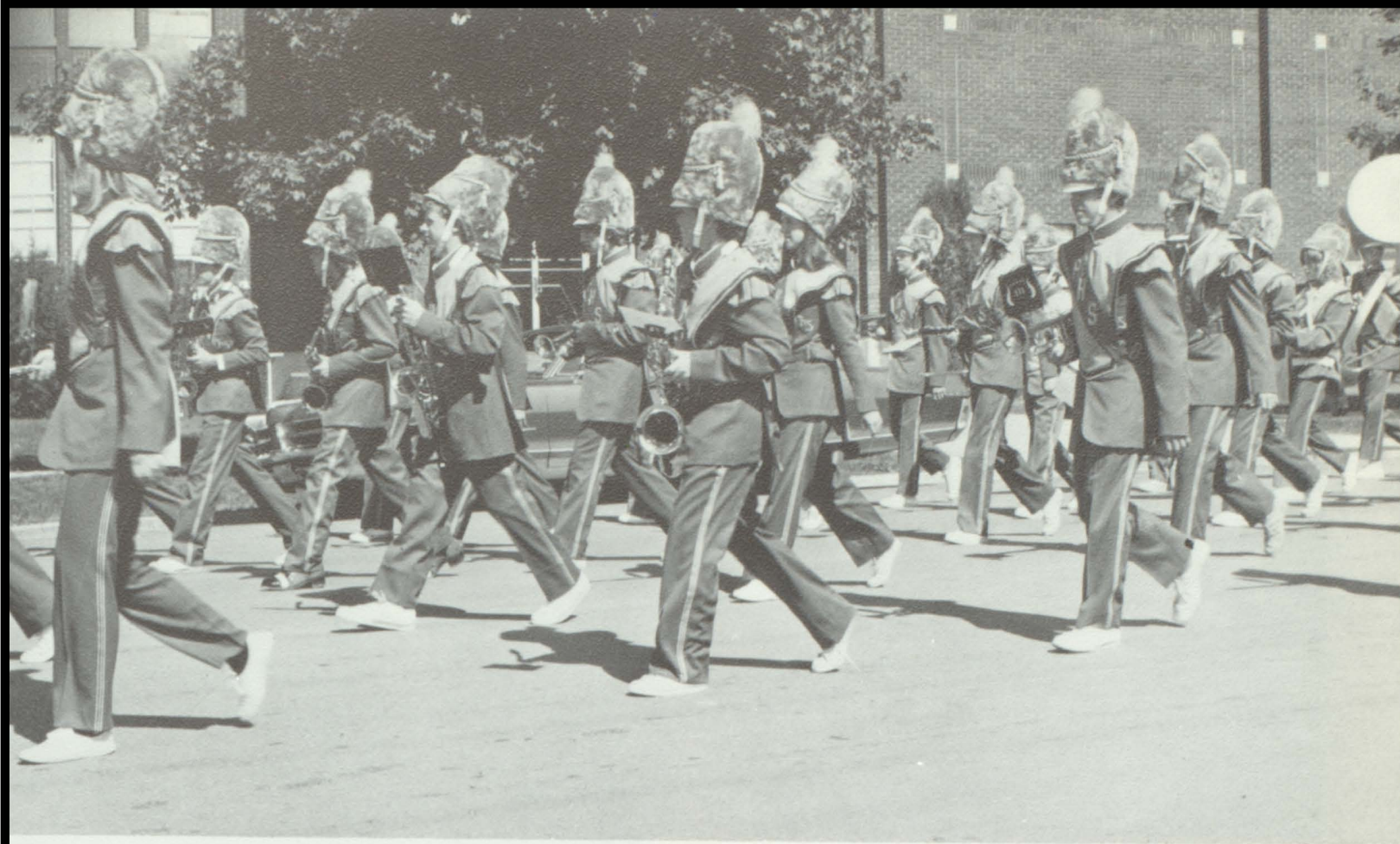
On October 20th one of the biggest dances of the year was a smashing success. The theme of the Buddy Dance this year was "Clouds".

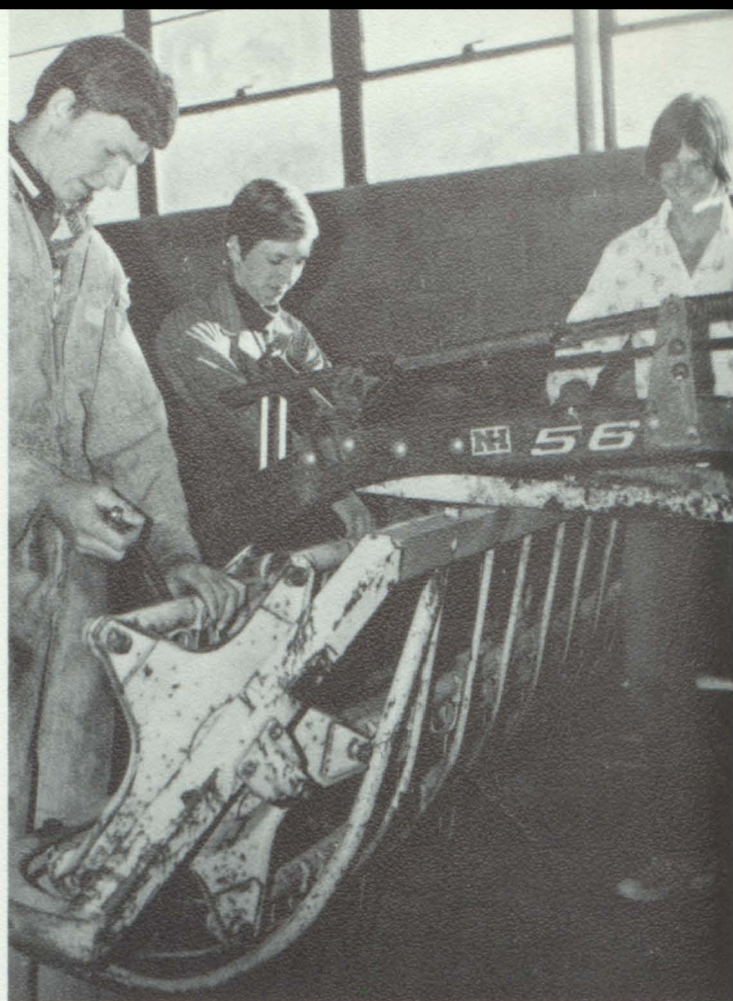


Future Farmers show fruits of their harvest

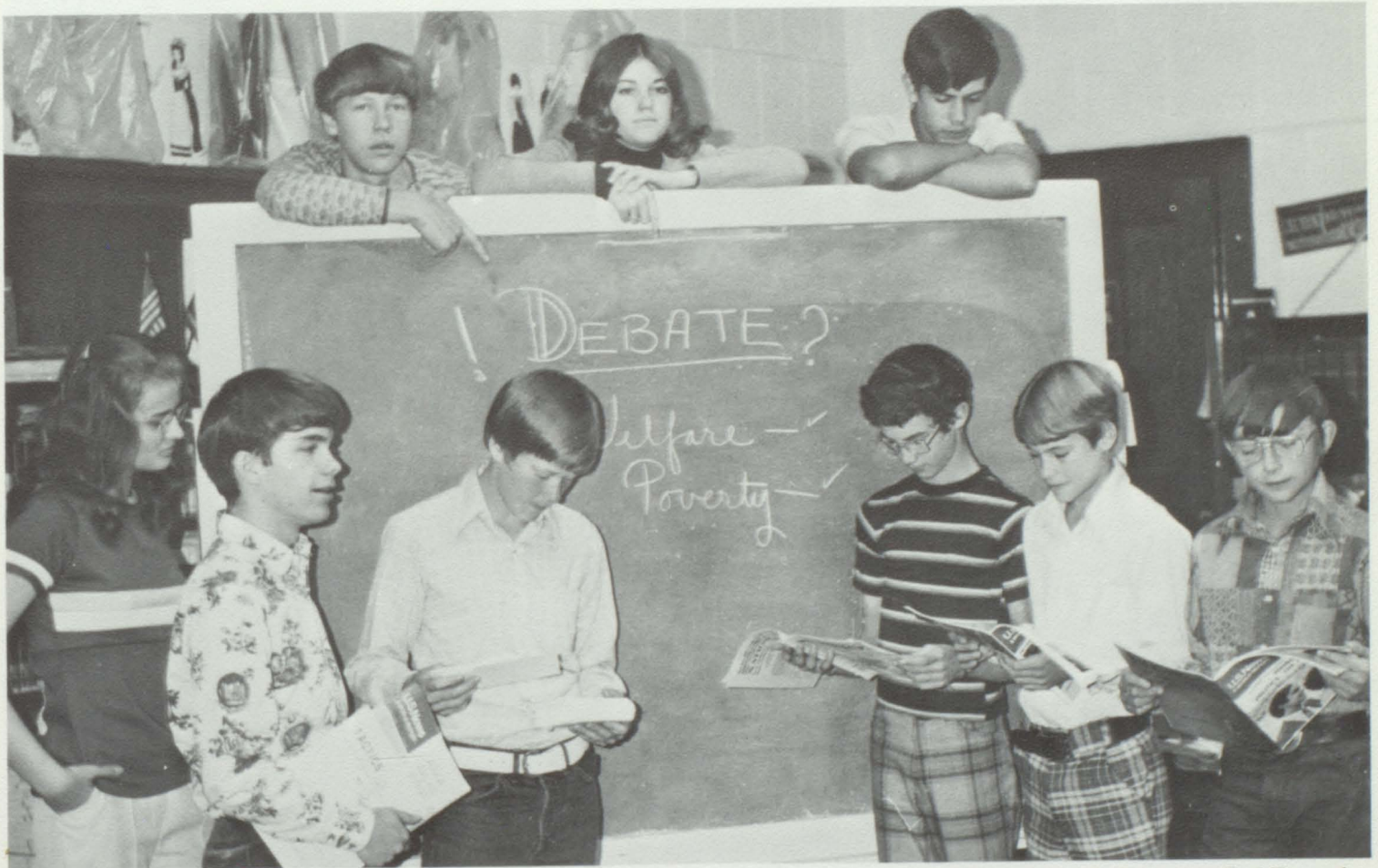

Debate topic for 73-74: Welfare

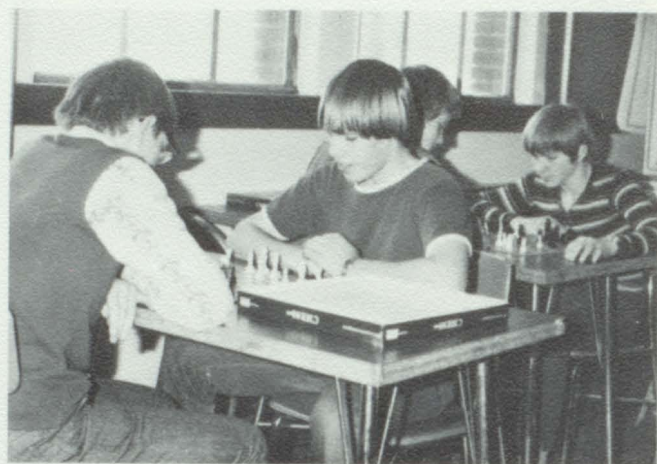

Thespians host and participate in theater work

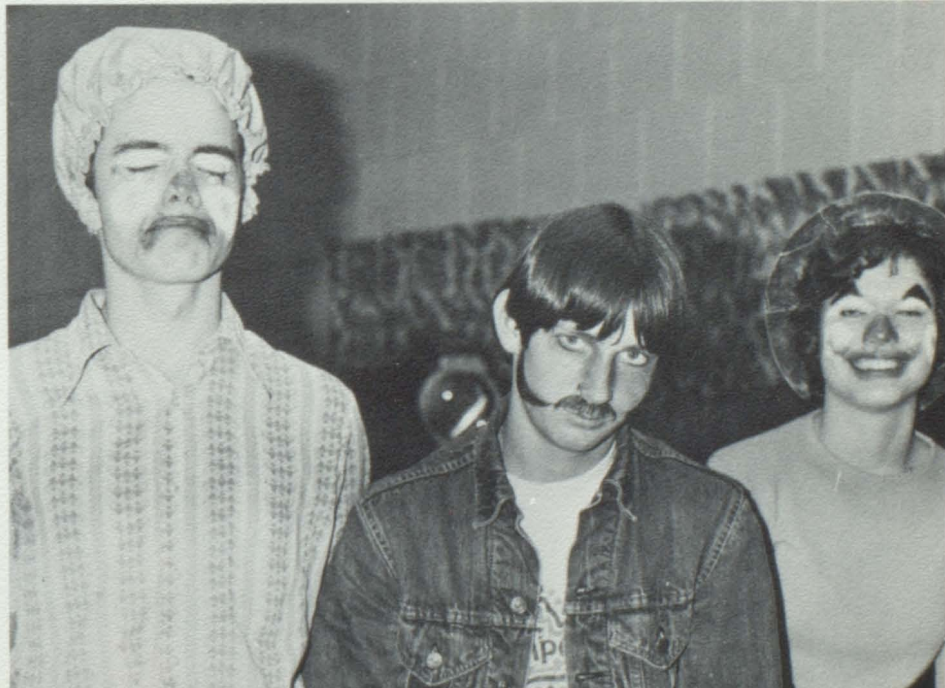

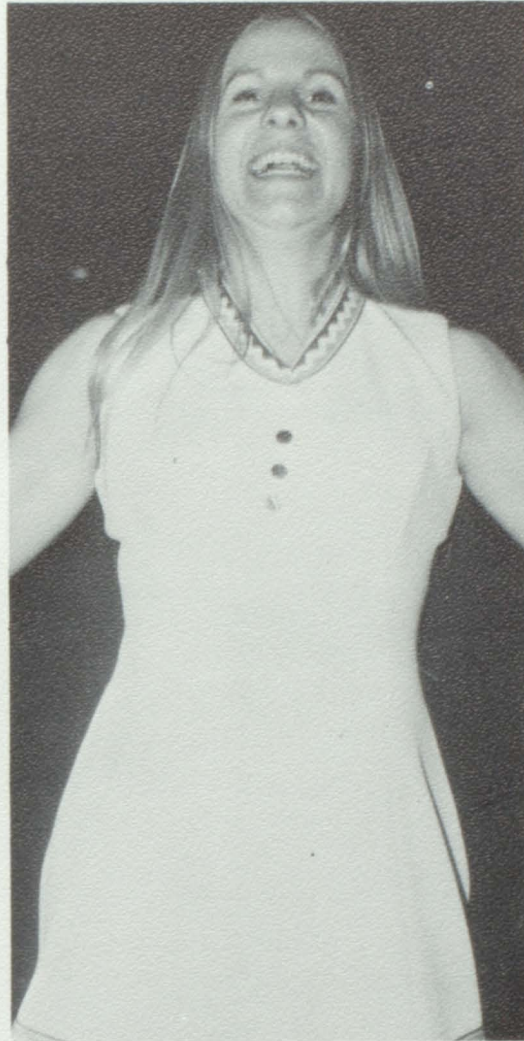

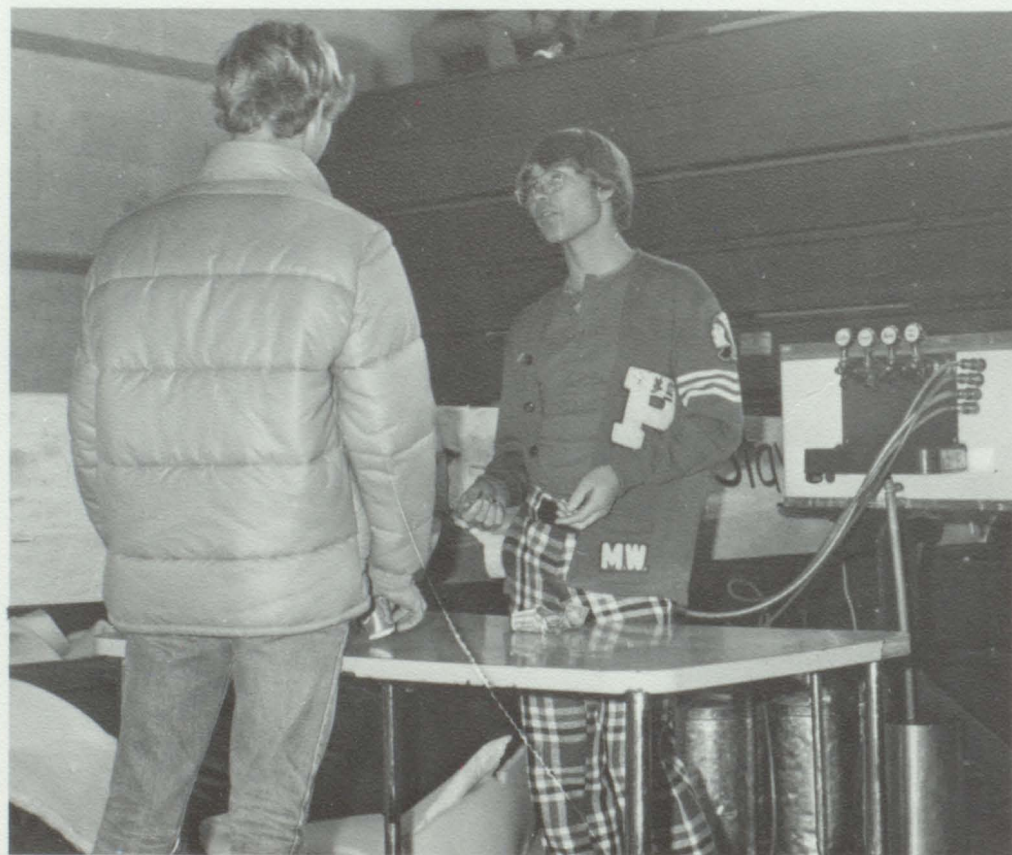

The War Cry has tried this year to be the voice of the Preston High Studentbody, voicing opinions and happenings in world and personal affairs.

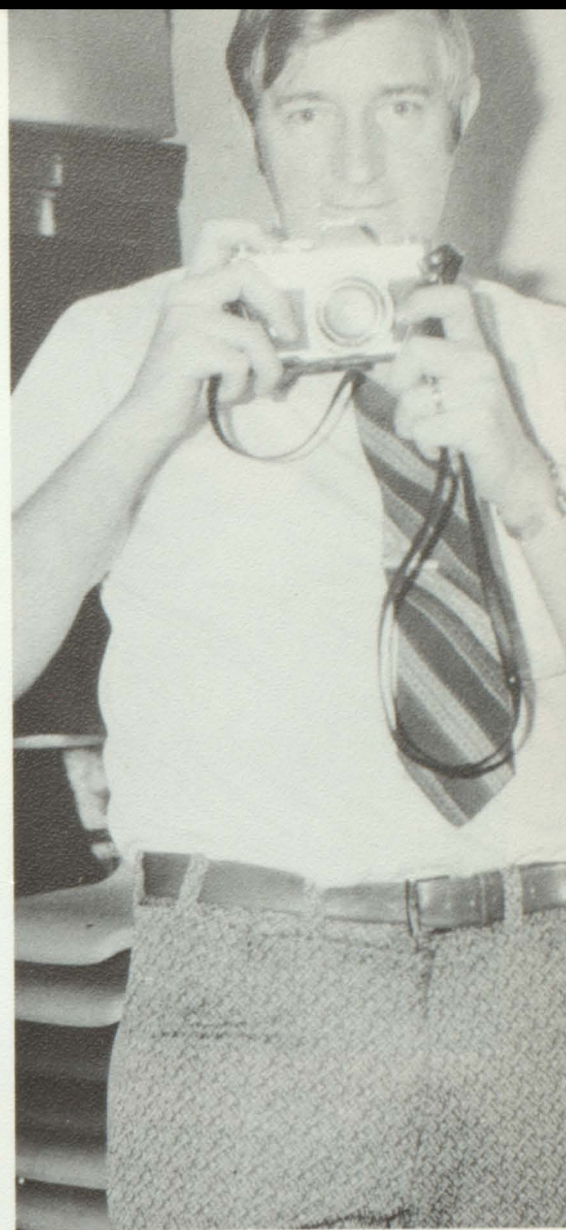

Government becomes their life

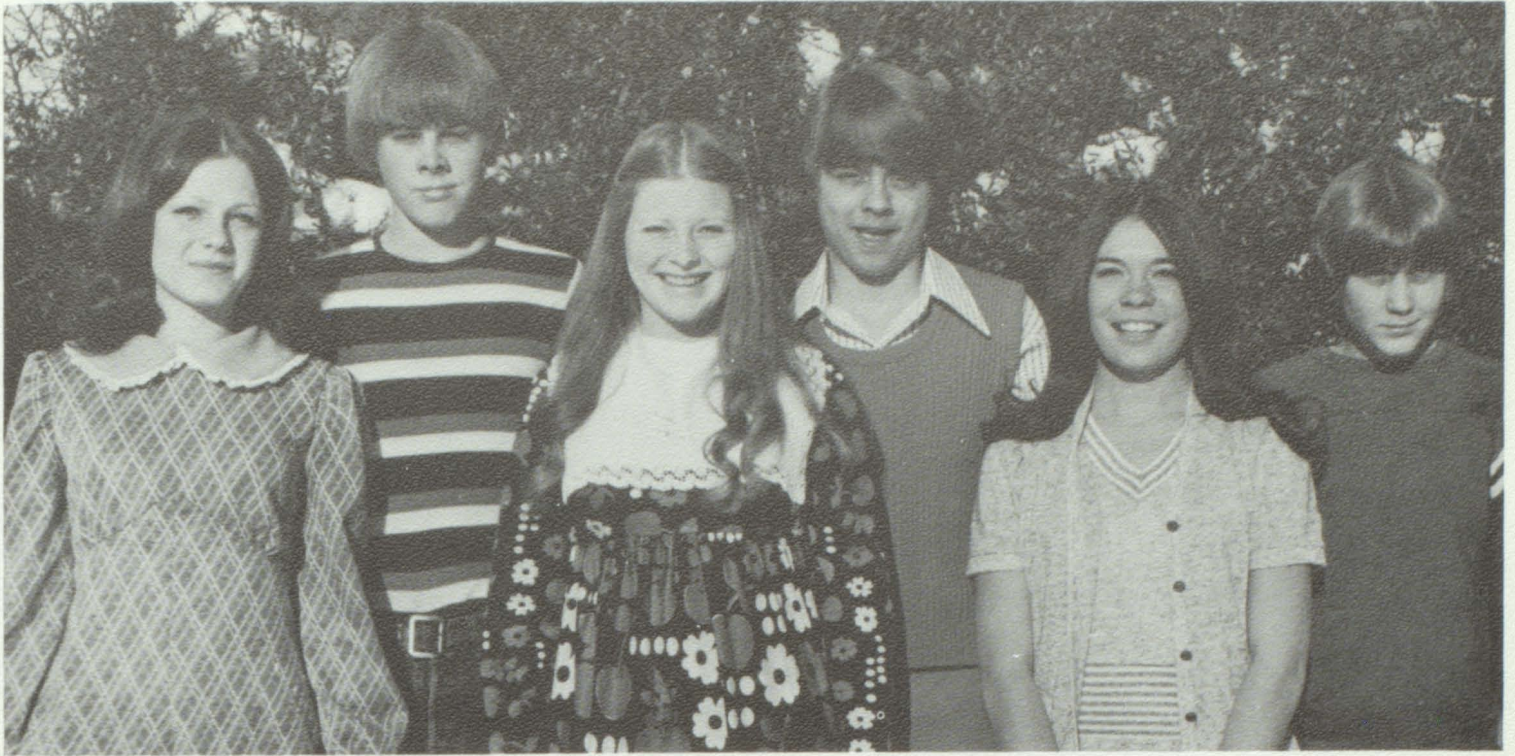
Last June three Preston High students spent one week learning, studying, and understanding the United States Government.

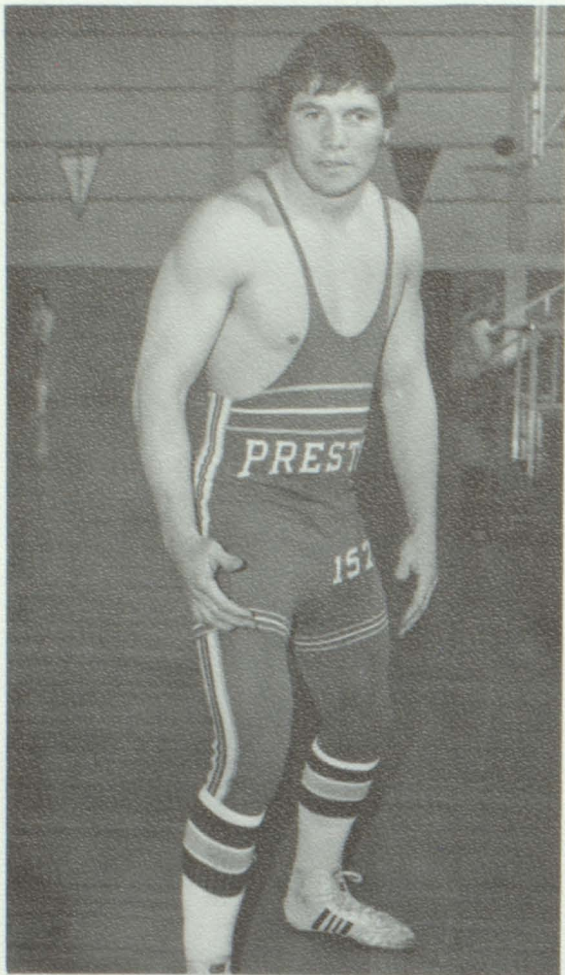
Many big, strong, and husky fellows were seen working out in the cafeteria of our school during the months of December, January, and February. These husky guys were the wrestling team.

The wrestling team had a big season this year. With the help of Coach Duce and an extra helper, Coach Milbrant, these boys were raring to go.

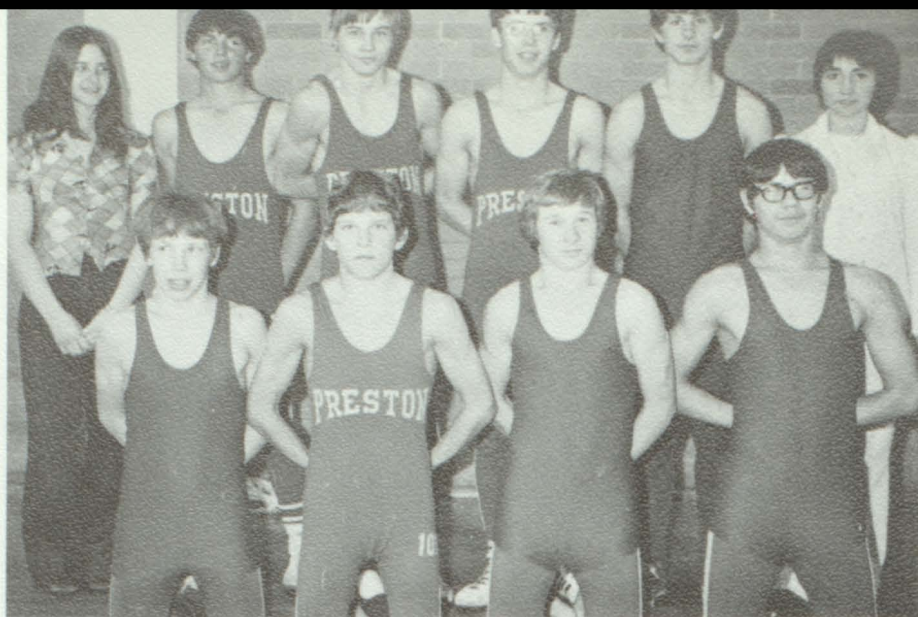
