









Dear Student body,

When I was asked to write something for this tribute page, I searched my mind to try to figure out something to do. I thought of writing a poem, or a story or anything else you could imagine to remember Cory by. But a letter, not written just for family or friends but to everyone at the high school, seemed appropriate.

I had the opportunity to know Cory for the majority of my life. I have lived next to him and his family for nearly ten years. We did just about everything together, from camping out in his backyard and playing night games, to working with each other at our summer job and swimming at his family's campsite near the lake.

Kim Bond is afraid of growing old. "I don't want to get wrinkles or old people diseases," she admitted.







Most students in high school worry about college. Not only do they worry about their future classes and activities, but they also worry about how they are





some!" And Adam Beardall told us the one word that described ballroom dance the very best was, "Surprising because you never know what is going to happen next."



The 2001 football team set the pace for the future in Preston football. The best teams in the state will be looking out for Preston.



They were on their way to state." We accomplished a lot more then anybody thought we could, even a lot more than we thought we could, team work was the key." Coach Coburn states.






















