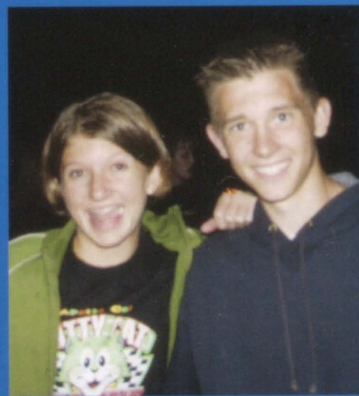

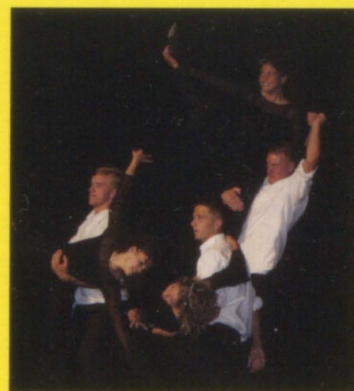

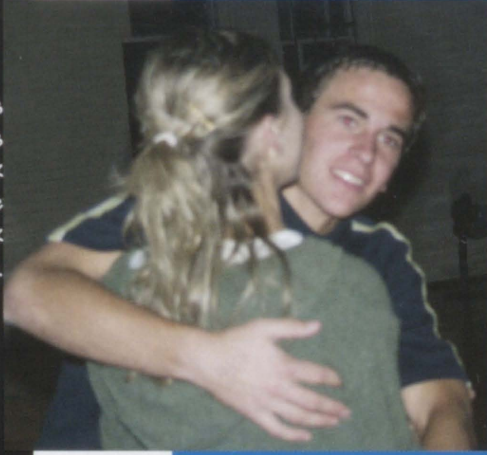

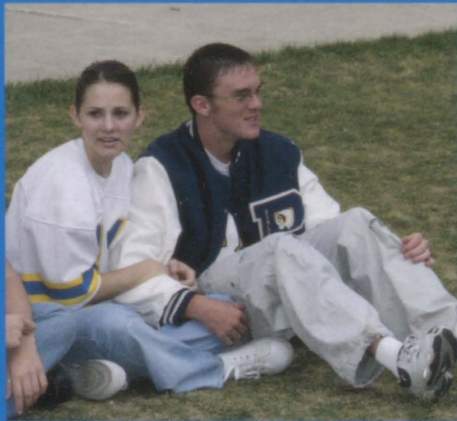
At least he hasn't been on a bad date like *Josh Sessions* who spilt lemonade all over his date so he had to take her home to get new clothes. Better luck next time.

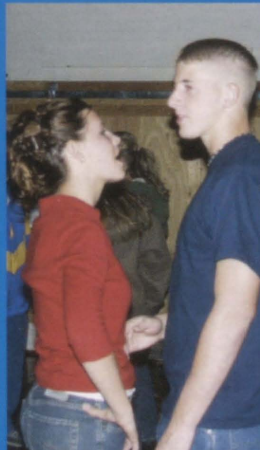

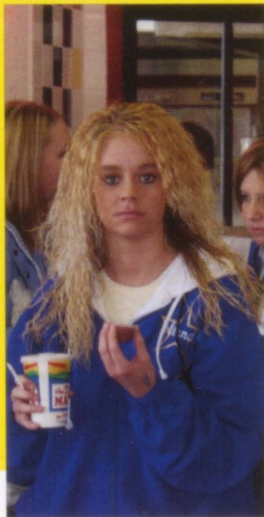

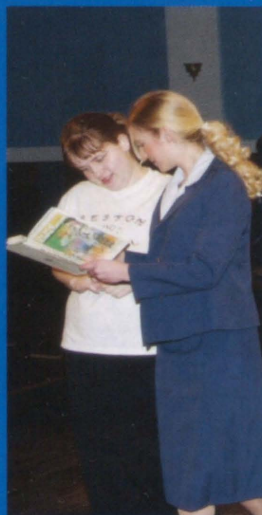

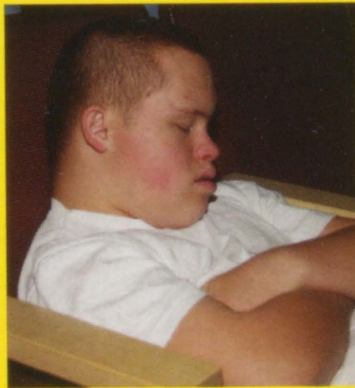

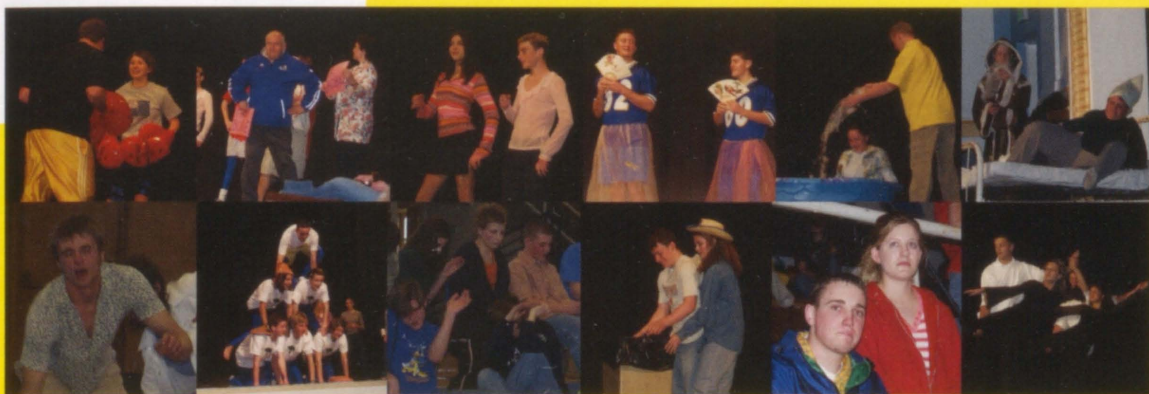
Showing our school pride

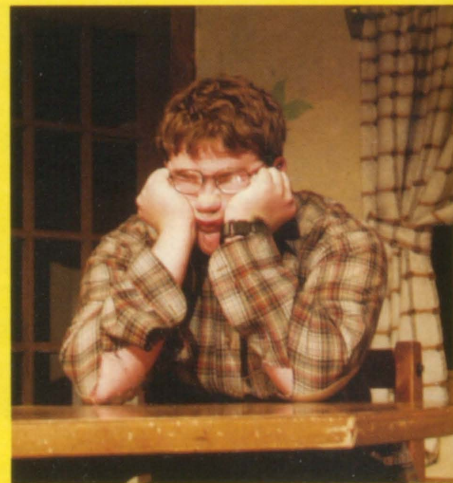

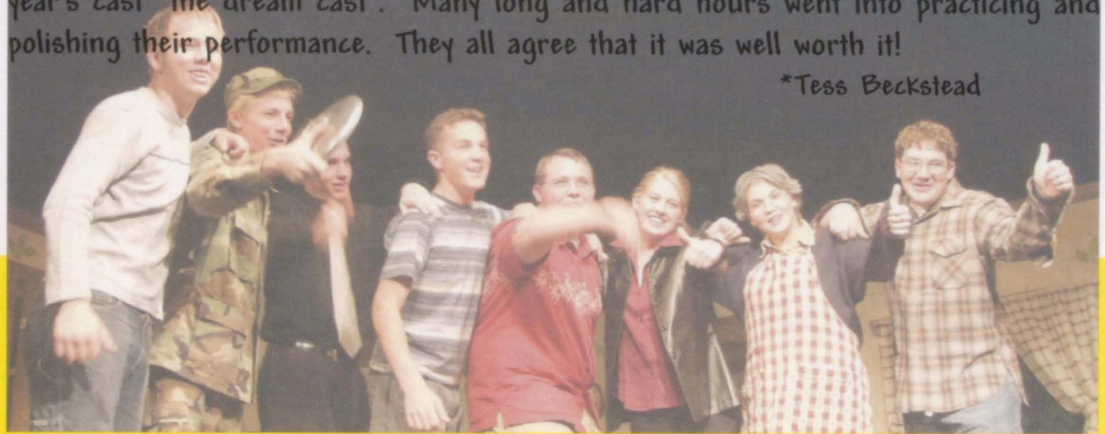
The Foreigner

Bracken Fryar, a music star in his own right, would be *Rivers Cuomo* of *Weezer*.

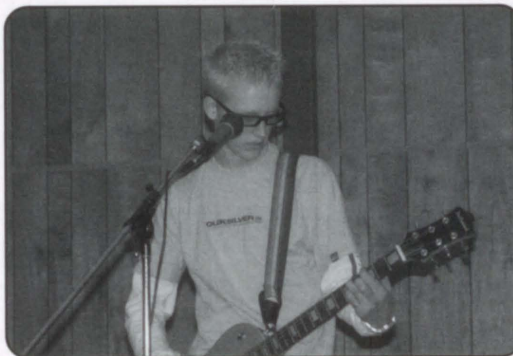

hard." But no matter how challenging or tiresome, this year's Senior Project looks to be a success. And in the end, the students may actually learn something.

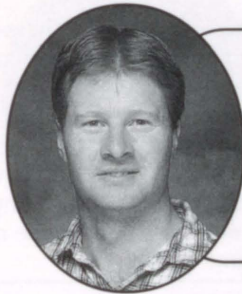
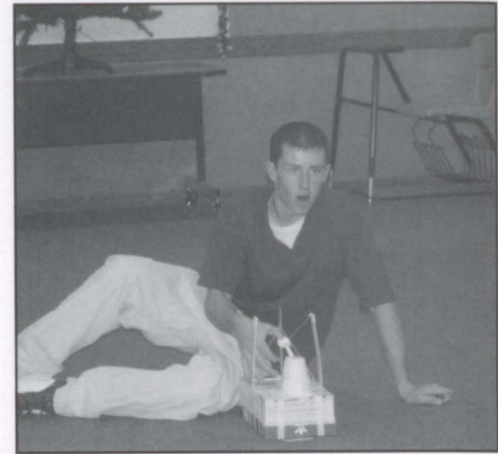

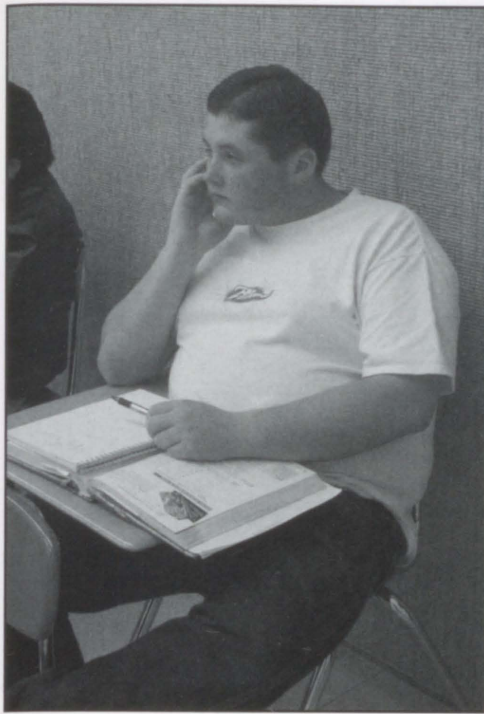

that could be used in their daily lives.

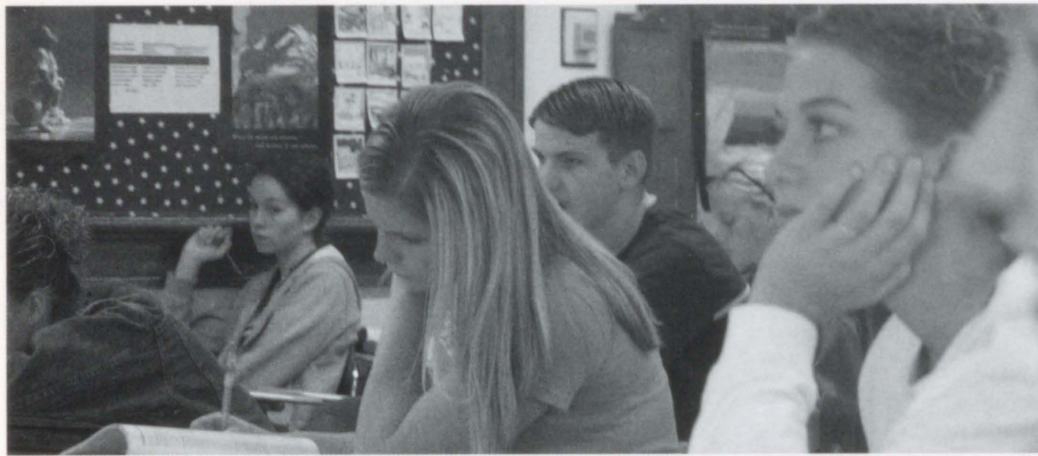

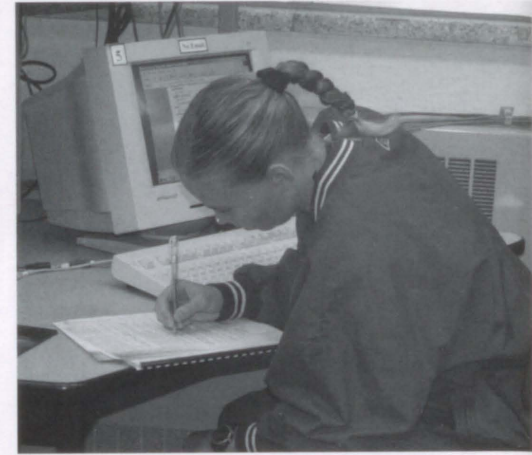

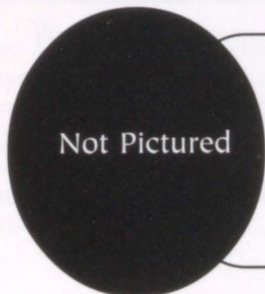

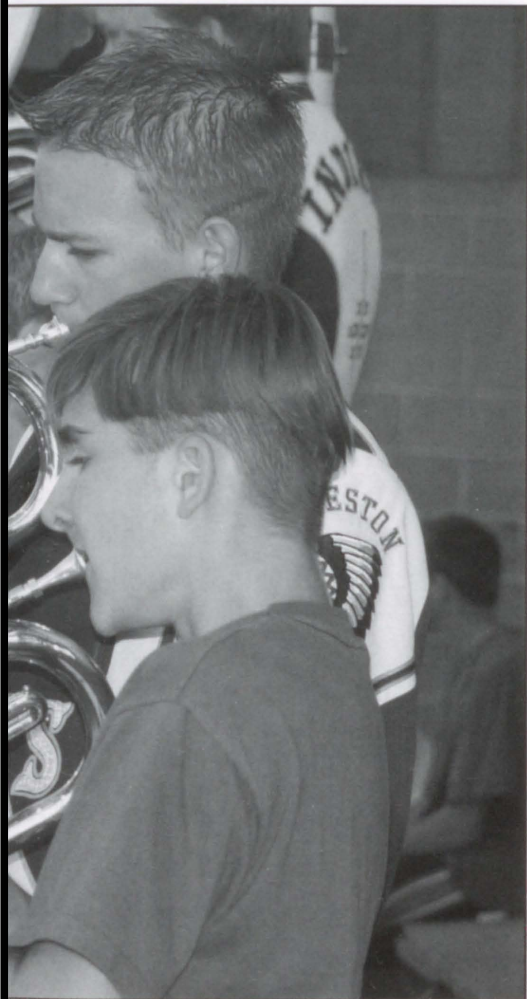

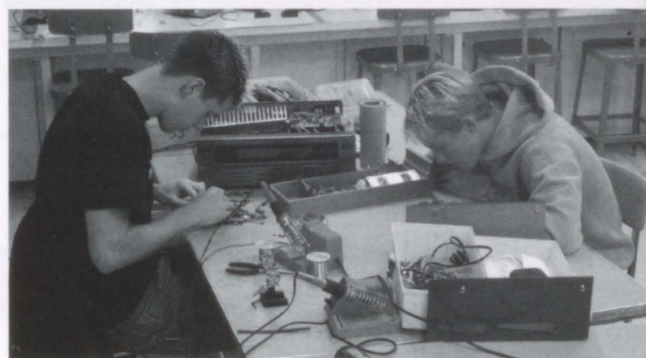

handy repairman? That's what we asked the electronics class. **Matt Heinrichs** stated that "To be proper to people of

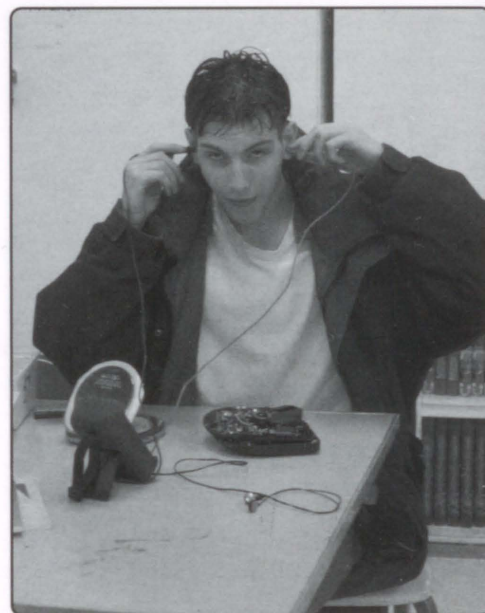


higher stature. To fix only when you want to say Mr. or Mrs., but mostly in business meetings." **Shane Pulsipher**

Dion Almond said "If you can fix things yourself you don't have to pay someone

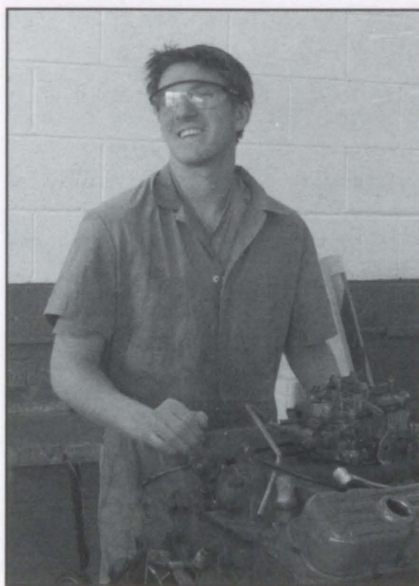
else to do it for you." Whatever the reason, electronics is a valuable asset in teaching students at PHS.



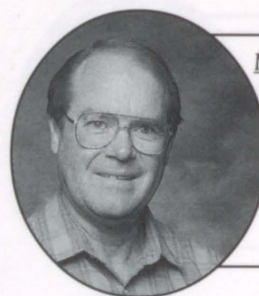

others just valued mechanics as a hobby. Whatever the reason, Auto Tech gives students hands on experience and learning out of books.

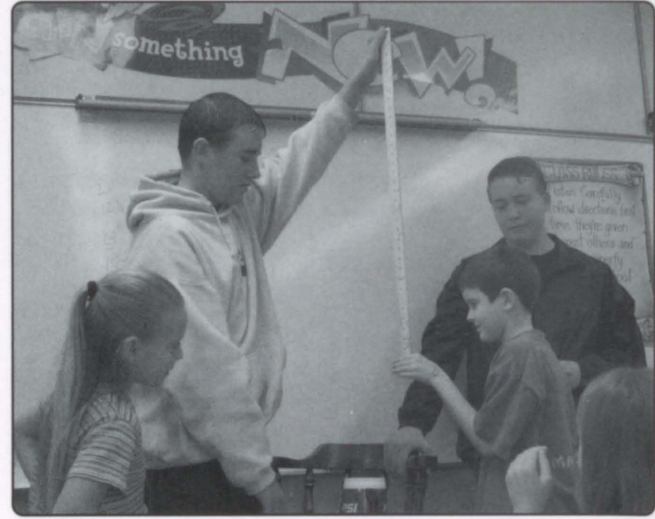

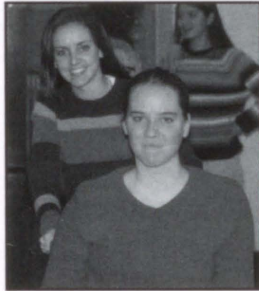

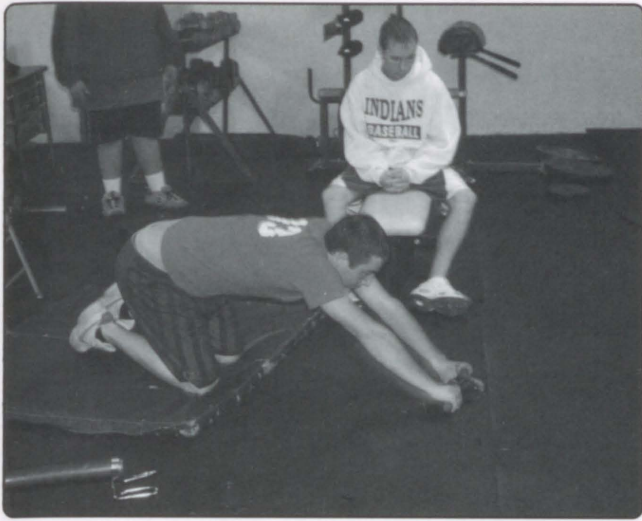
Terence McKay and Shawn Oliverson stated that the most important skill they have learned was, "CPR because you

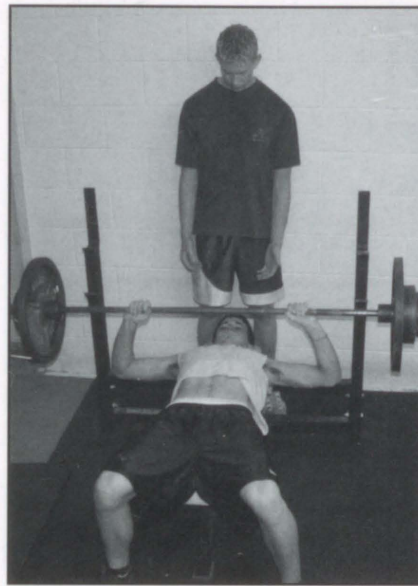
class. They realize that the abilities they learn now could decide if a person lives or dies in the future.



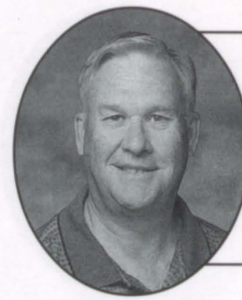

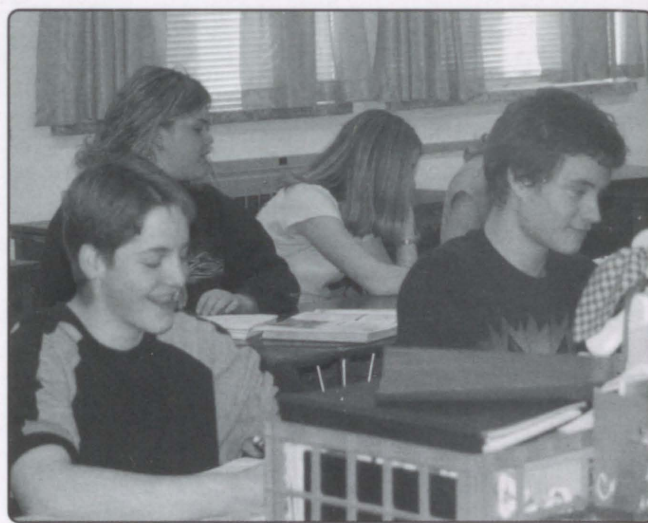
Bobby Johnson says that it makes him better "Because I get an A in weightlifting."

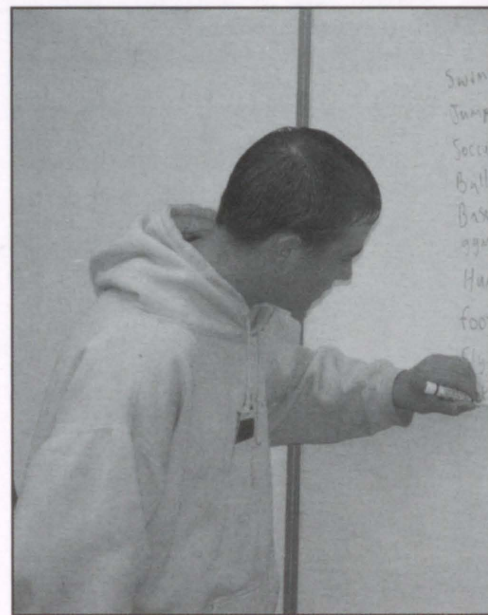

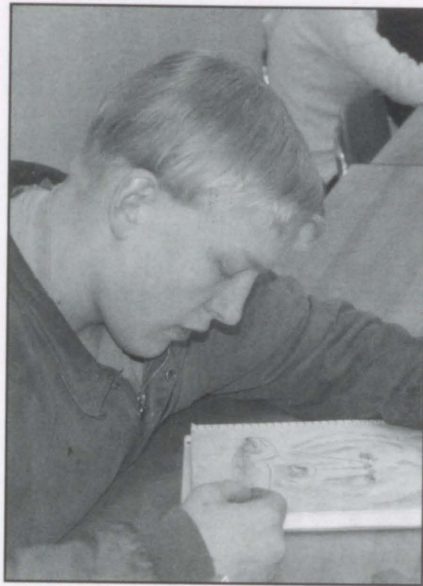
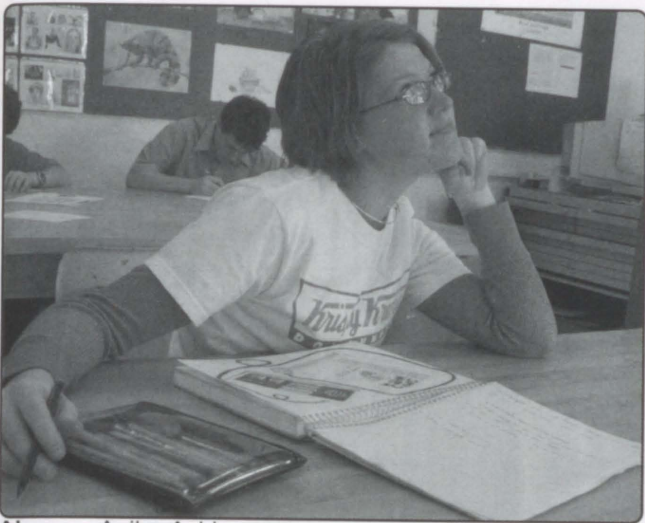
Felicia Daley said "It teaches me how to prepare for my children." **Matt Abrams** said it taught him how to pick a good spouse and how to deal with death.

Rachel Golightly commented that "It teaches you the basic skills of life." From the comments received from Mrs. Erickson's classes, it seems to be an invaluable

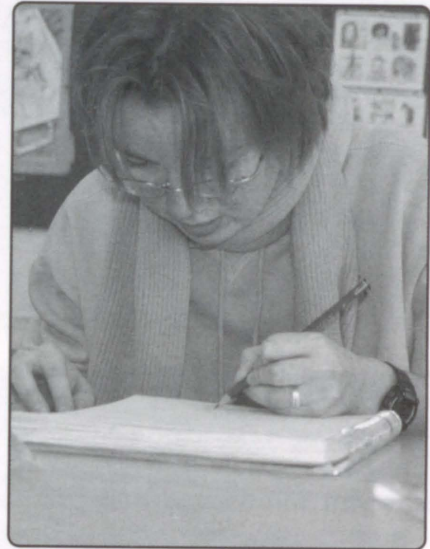

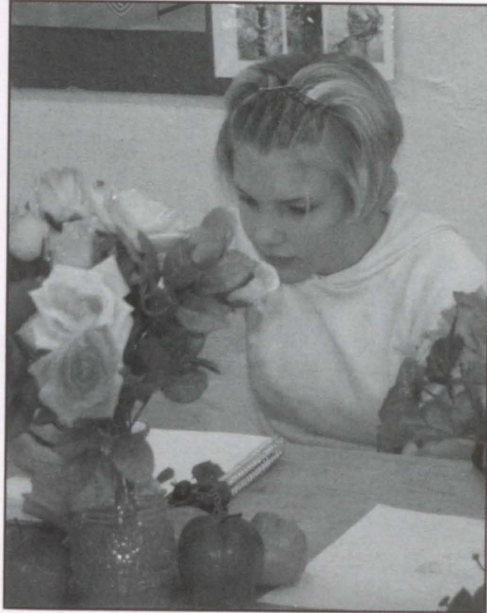

doesn't matter if art is a venting mechanism, hobby, or a serious pursuit, it serves a great purpose for students.

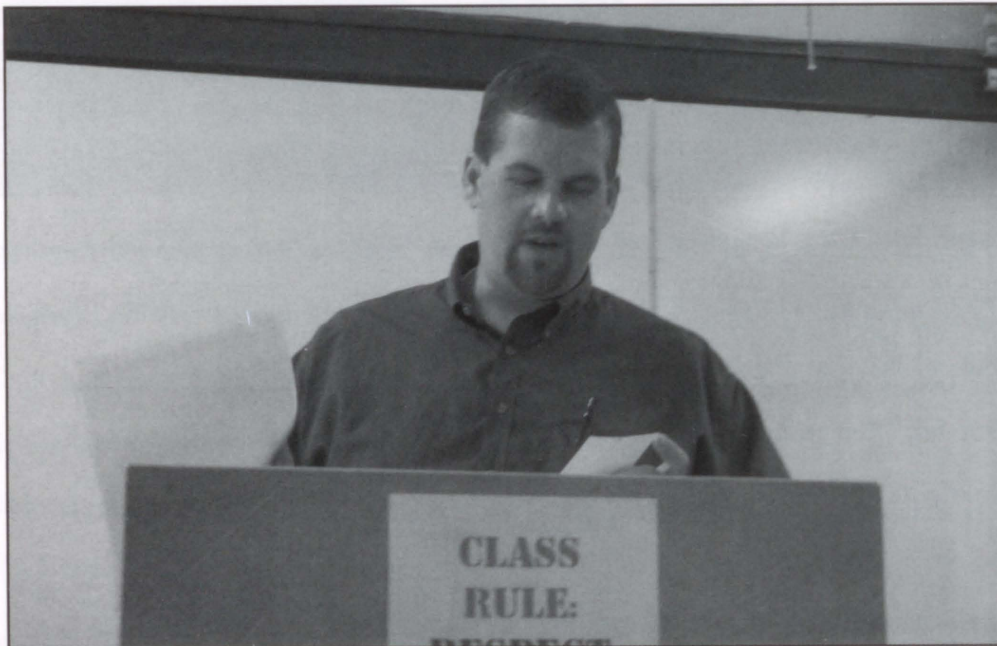

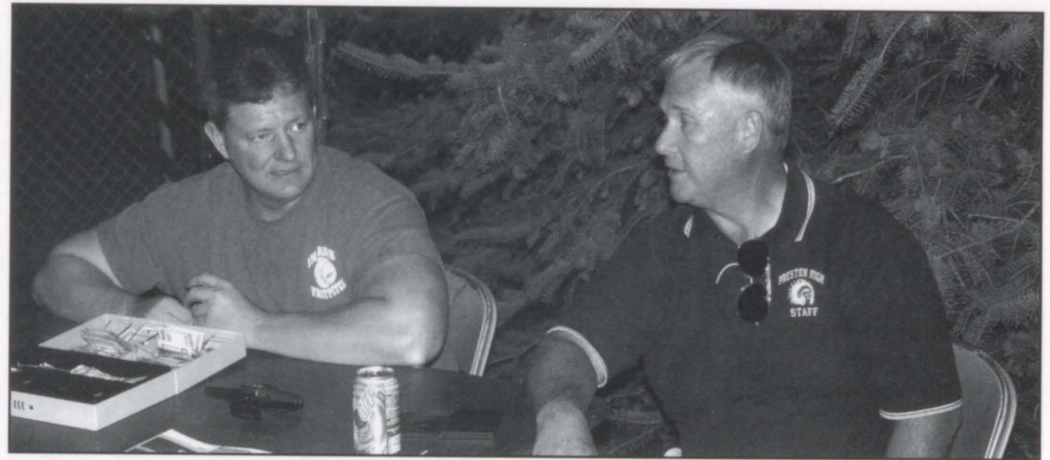

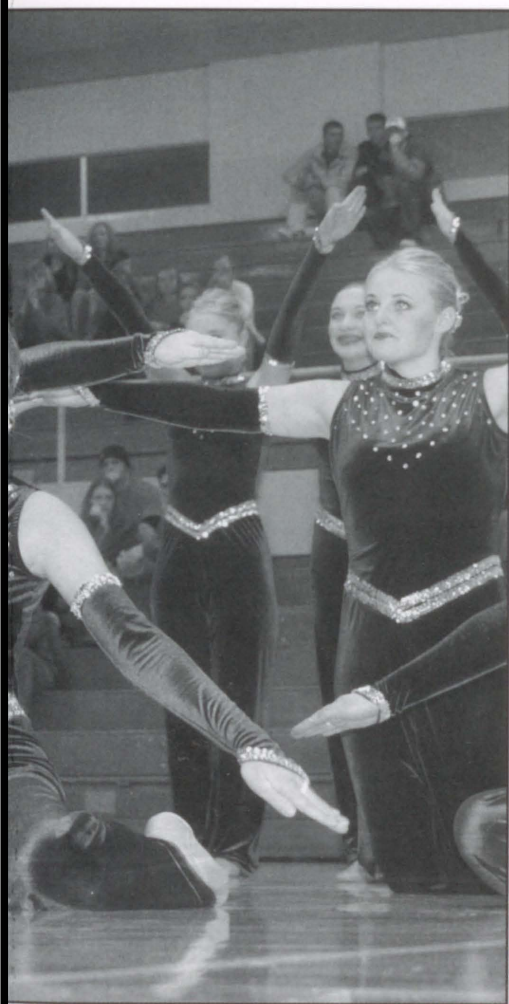

ing, because of all the exciting things that happen during practices and performances." **Giovanni Crosland** wrote, "In one word, ballroom is awe-

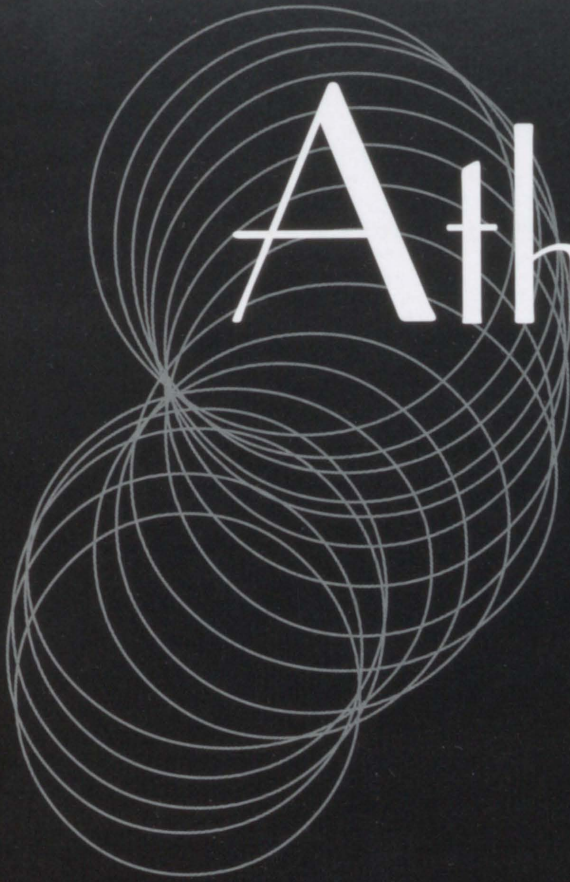
some!" And **Adam Beardall**

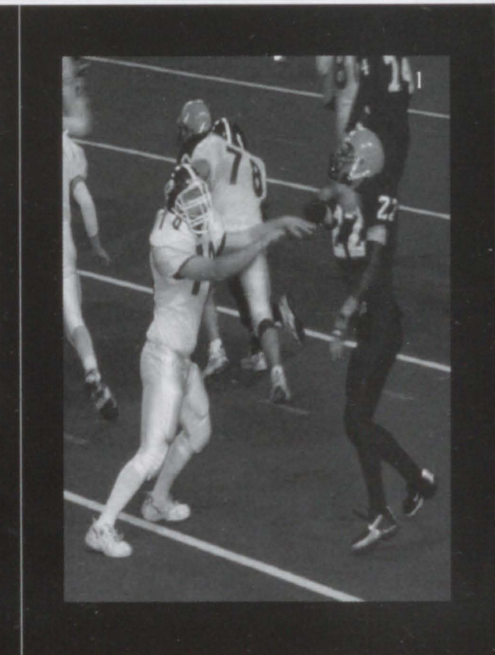

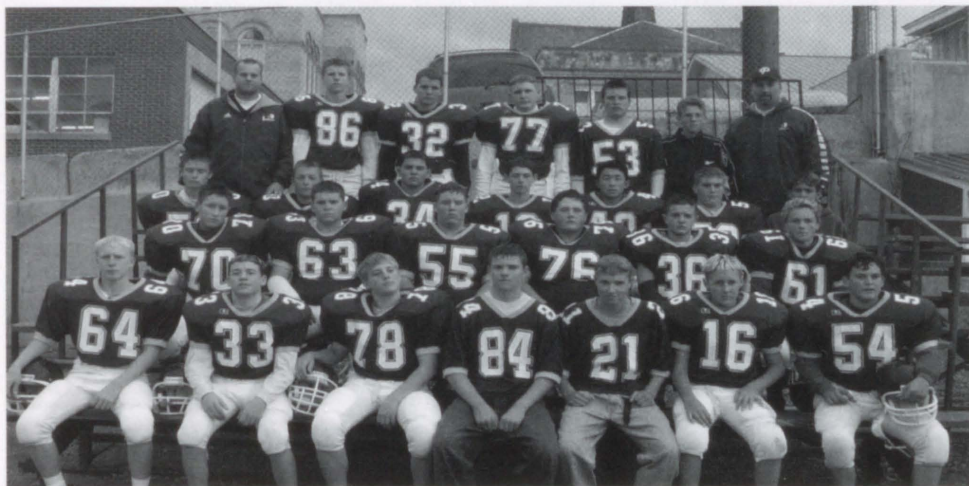

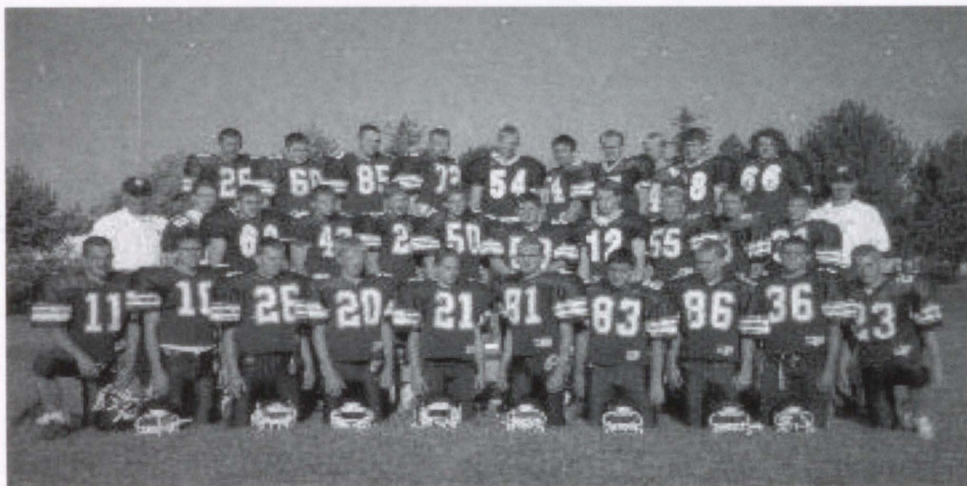

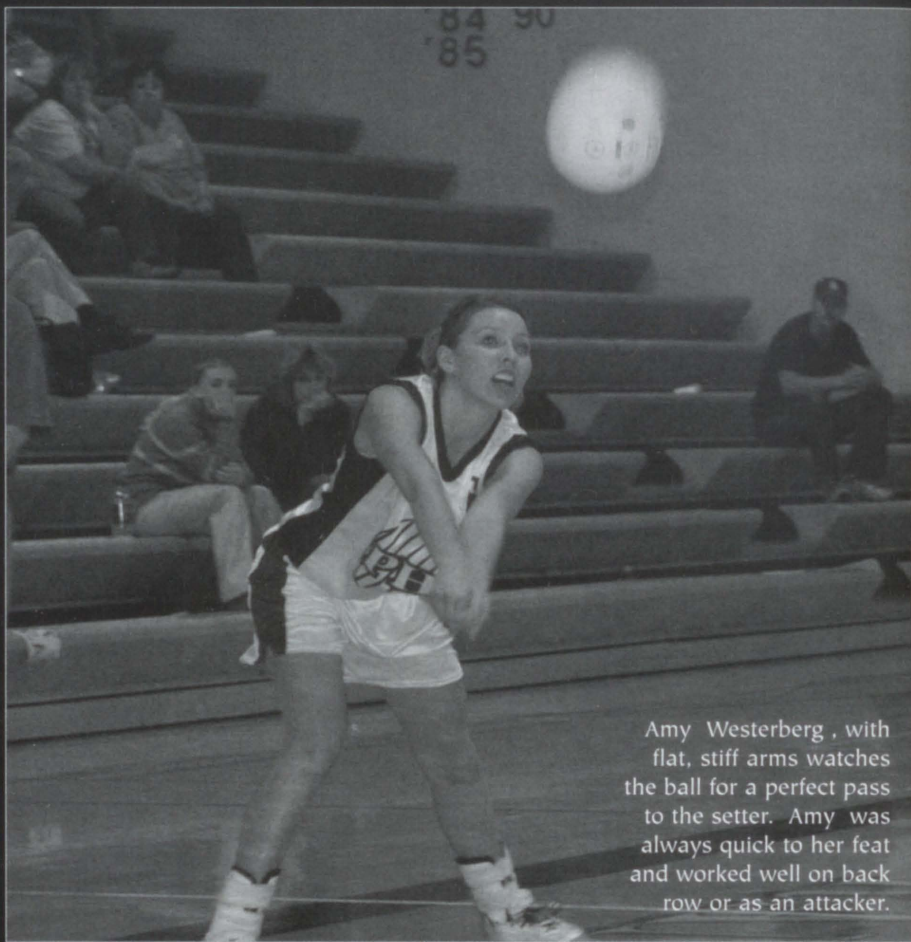
Volleyball is a team sport in which everyone plays hard and celebrate together

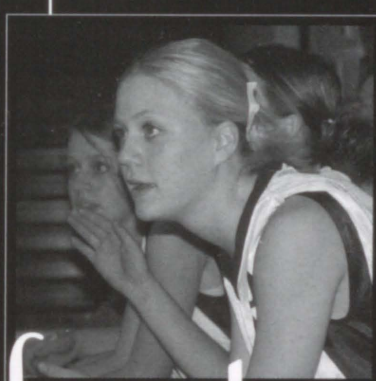

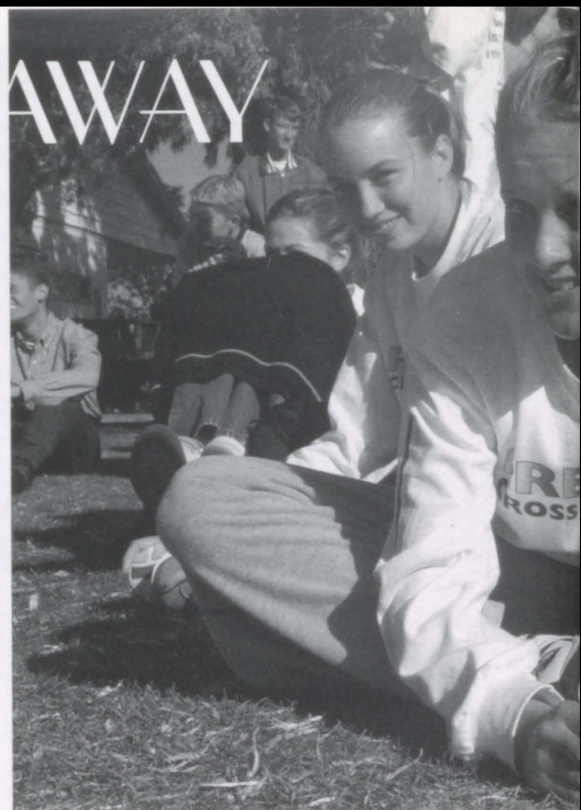

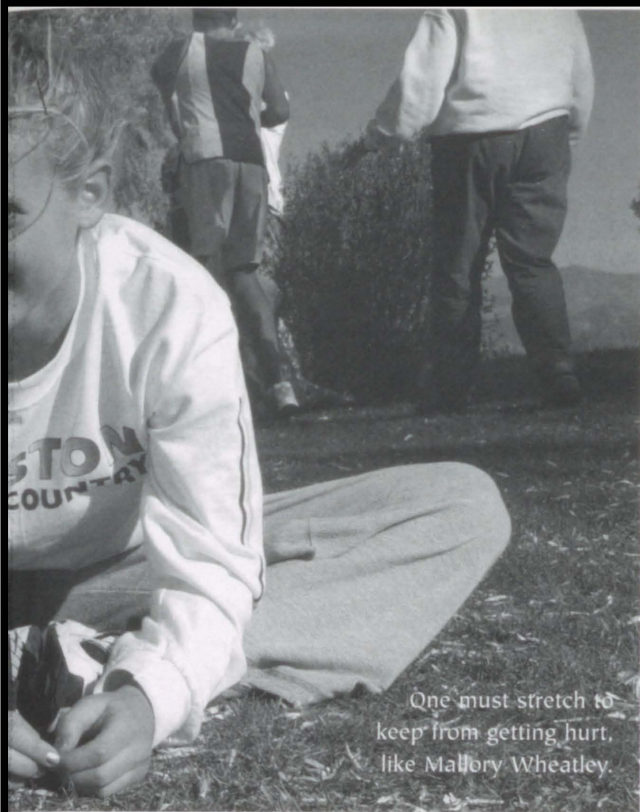

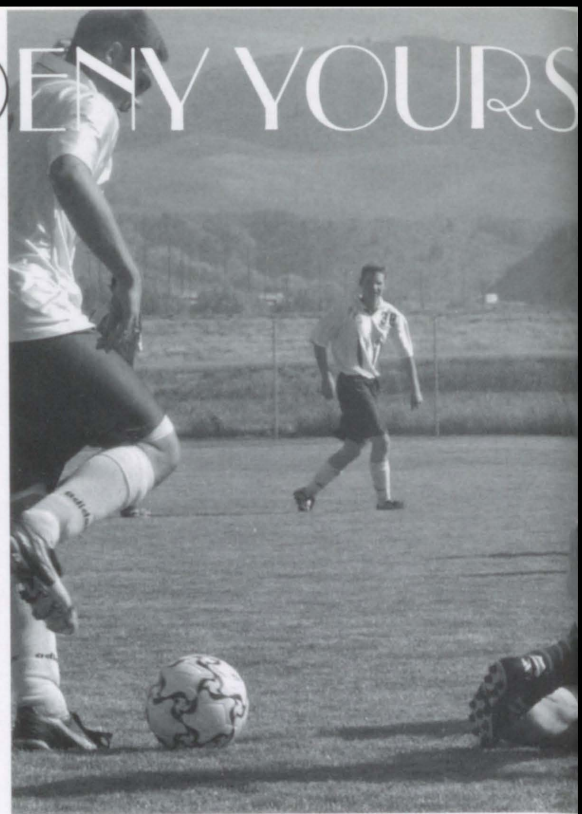
OUR GOAL IS TO DENY YOURS

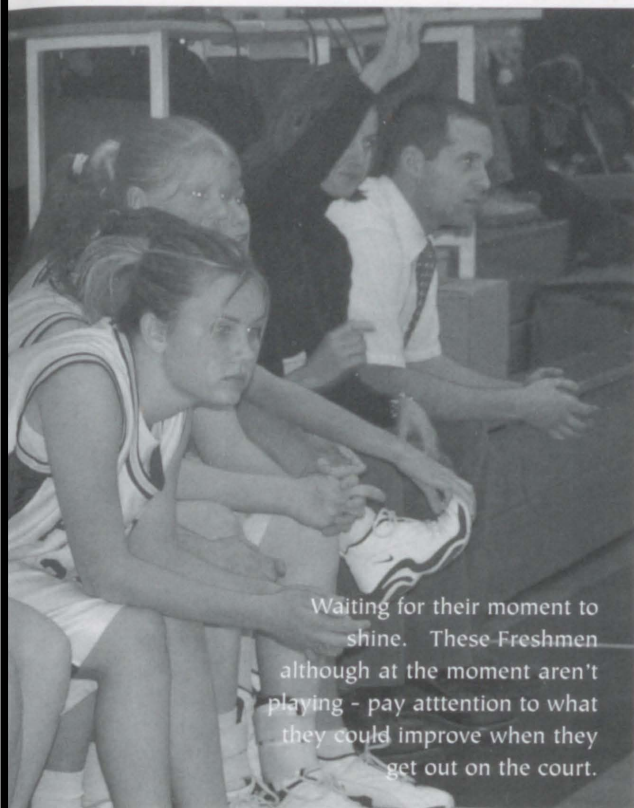

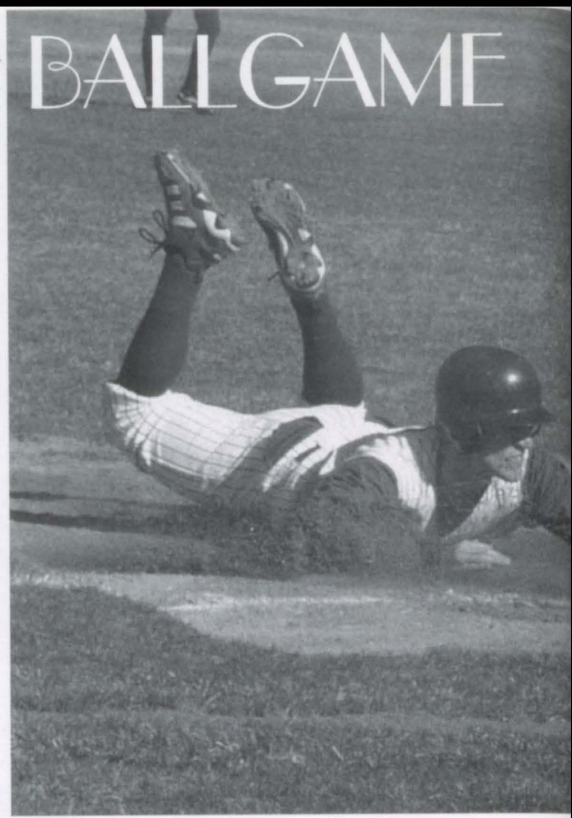

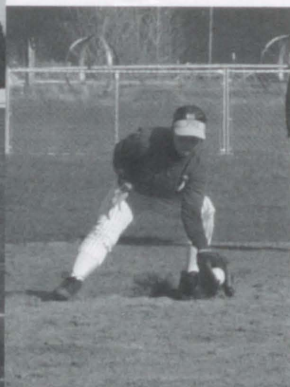

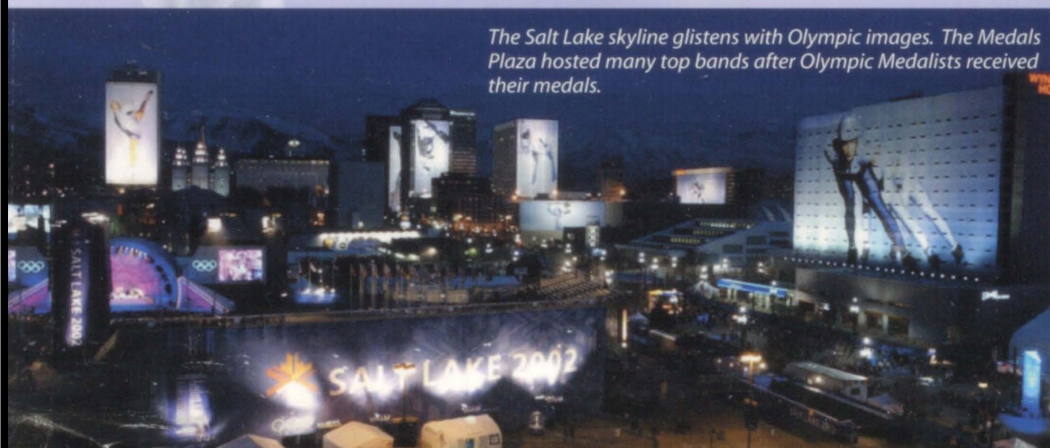

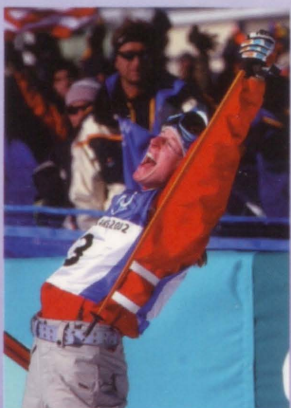

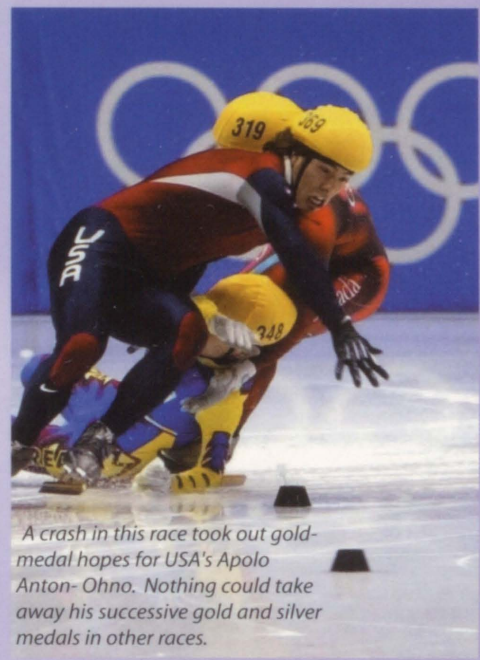

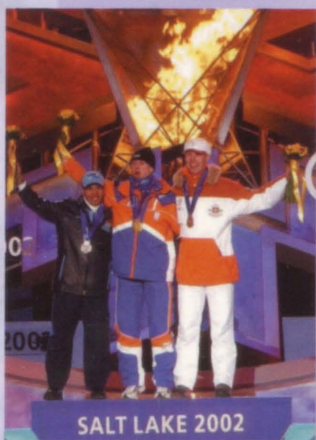

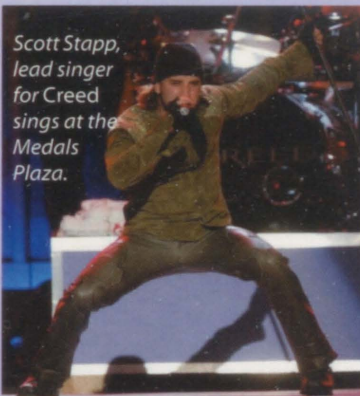

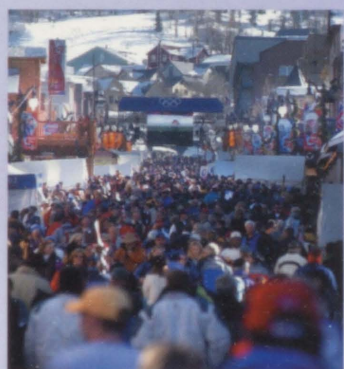

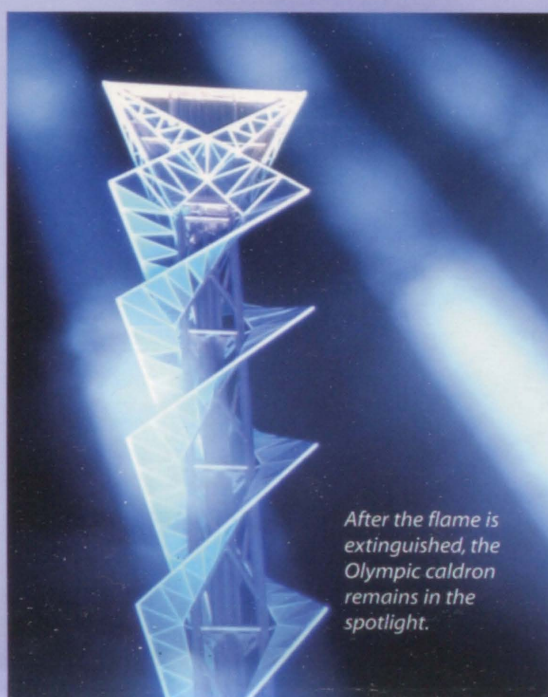
