#70 Rod Smart open the way for #31 Cody Hawkes

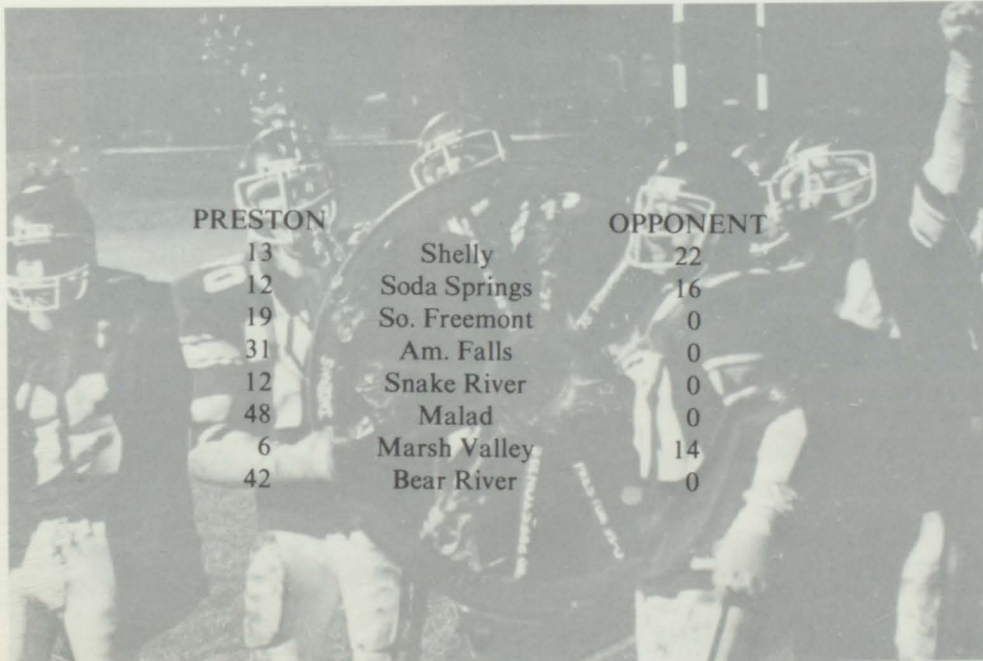

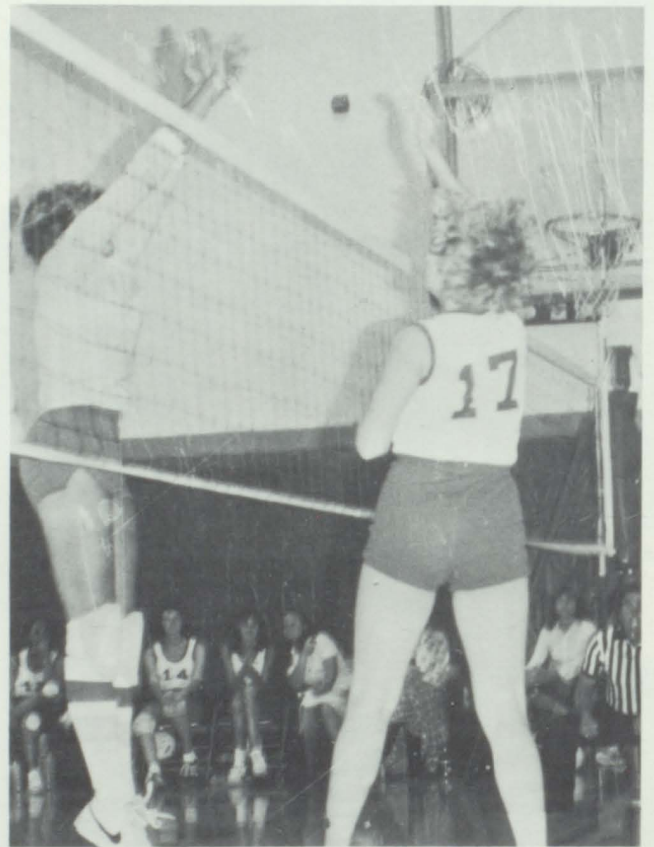

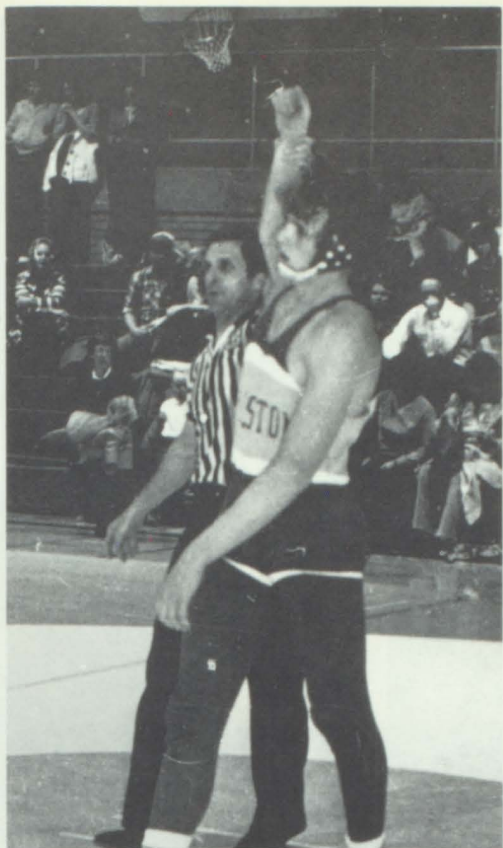

This years Wrestling team under the direction of Head Coach Laron Hansen and Asst. Coach Phil Dean continued a five year tradition of placing as a team in the top three places at the State Wrestling Tournament. 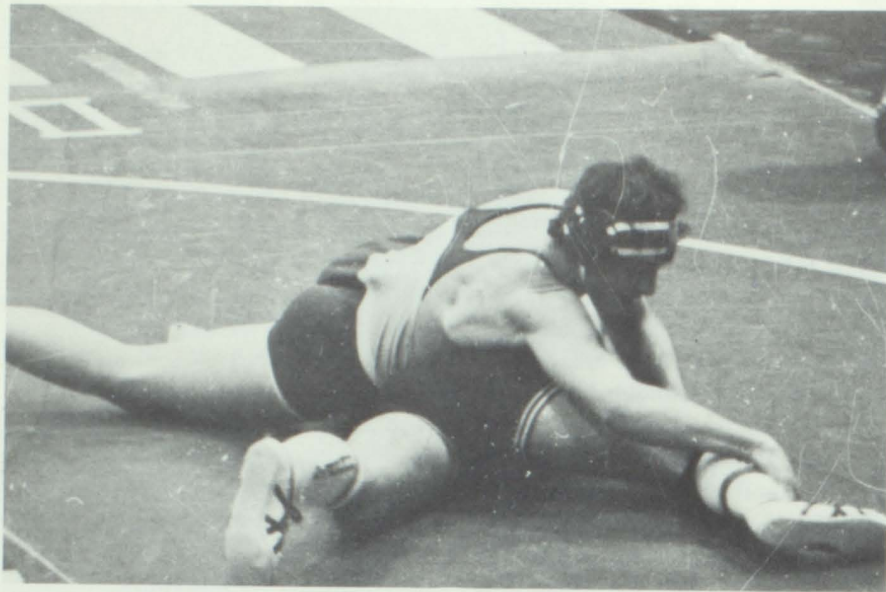

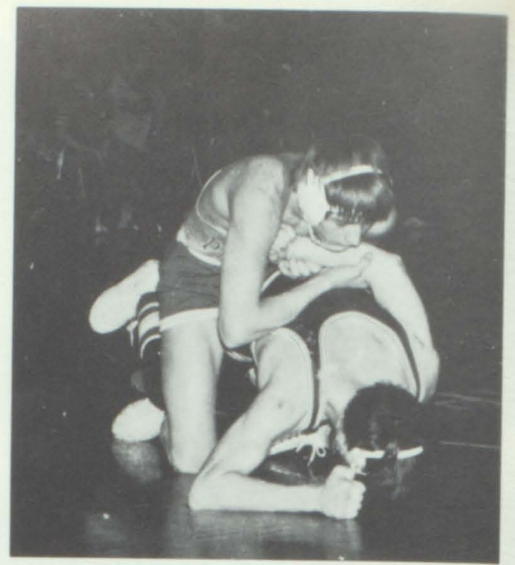
