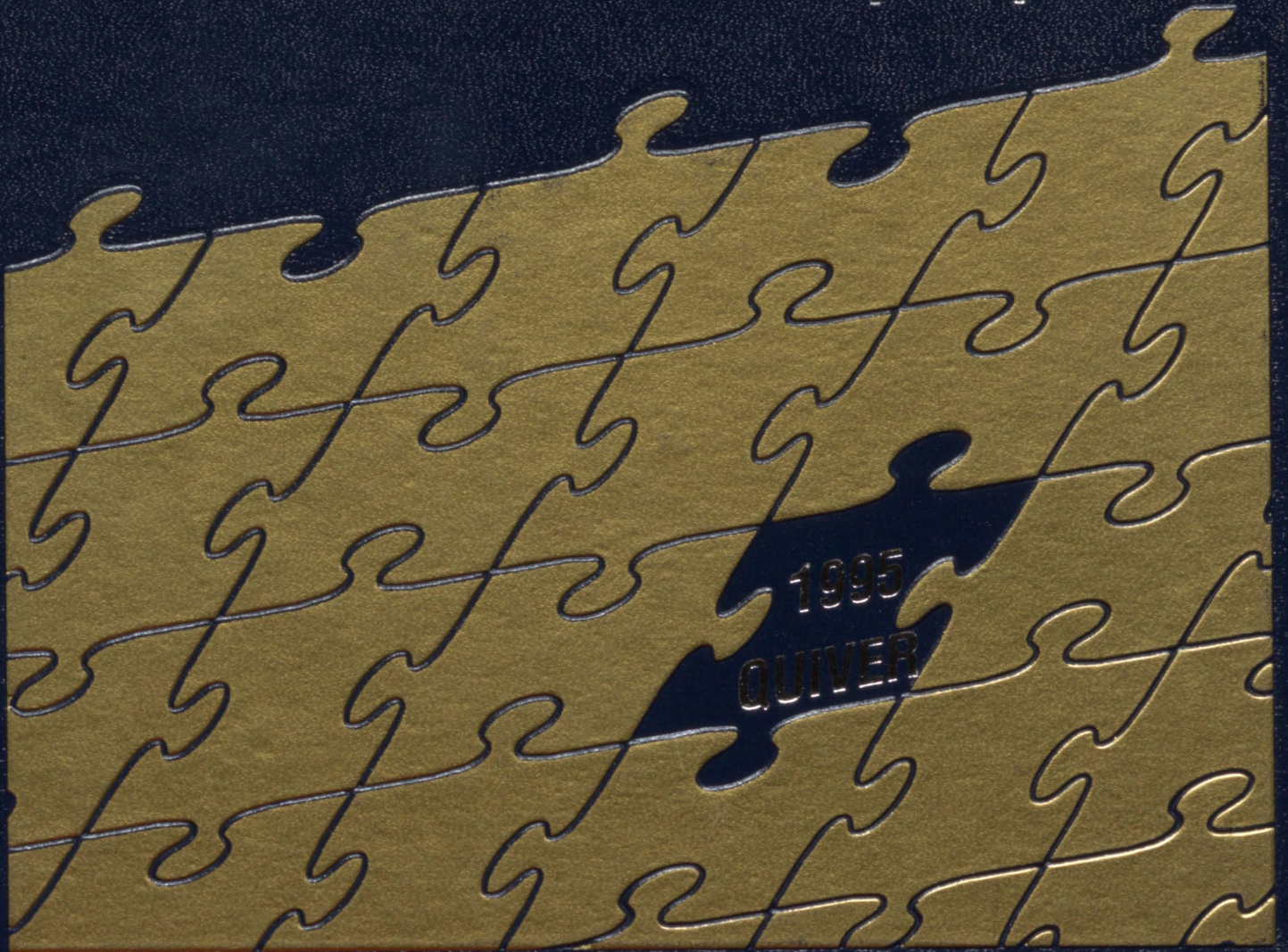

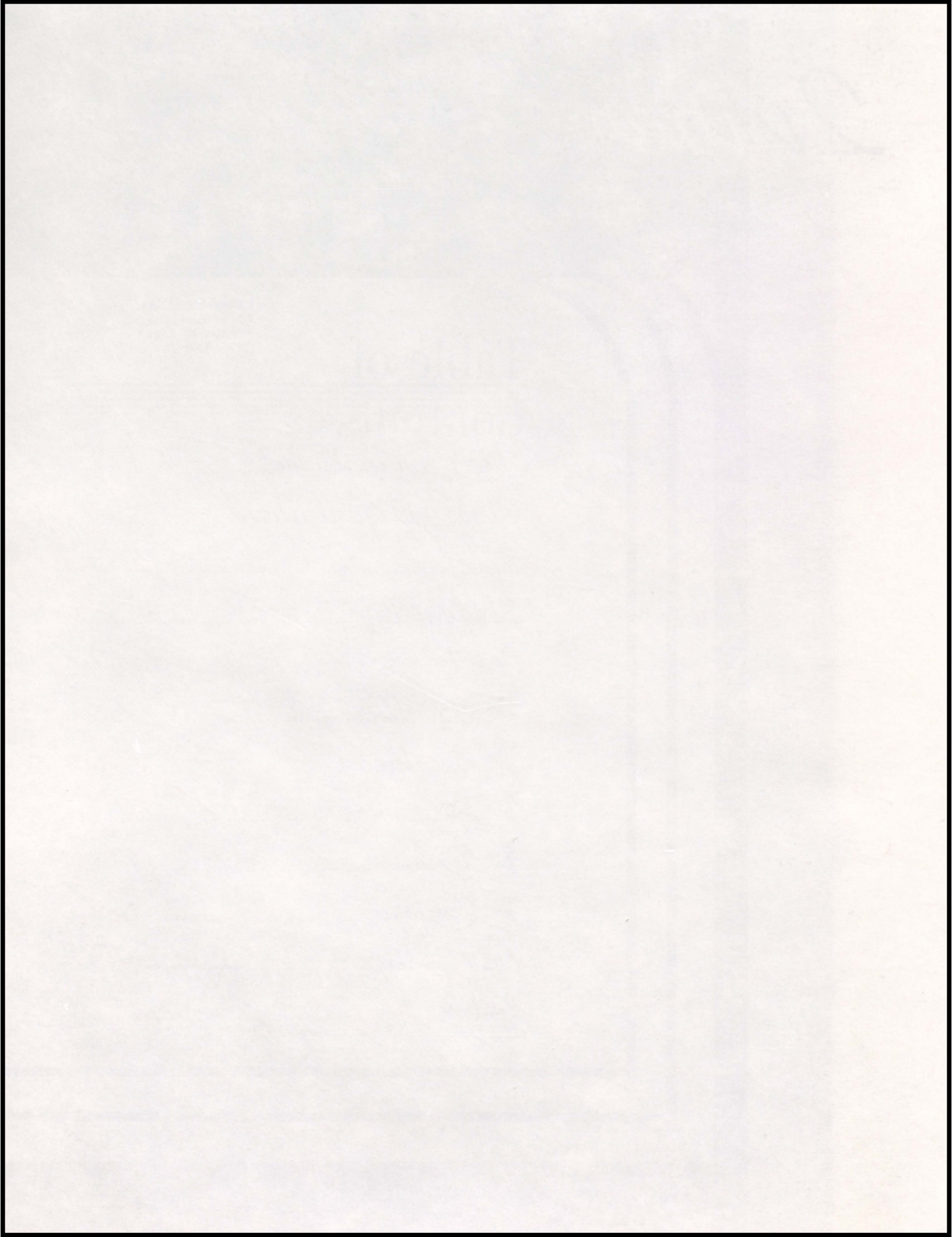

You don't beat the football team at home because you play against the crowd as well. If you want a seat during the game come early, otherwise it's standing room only.

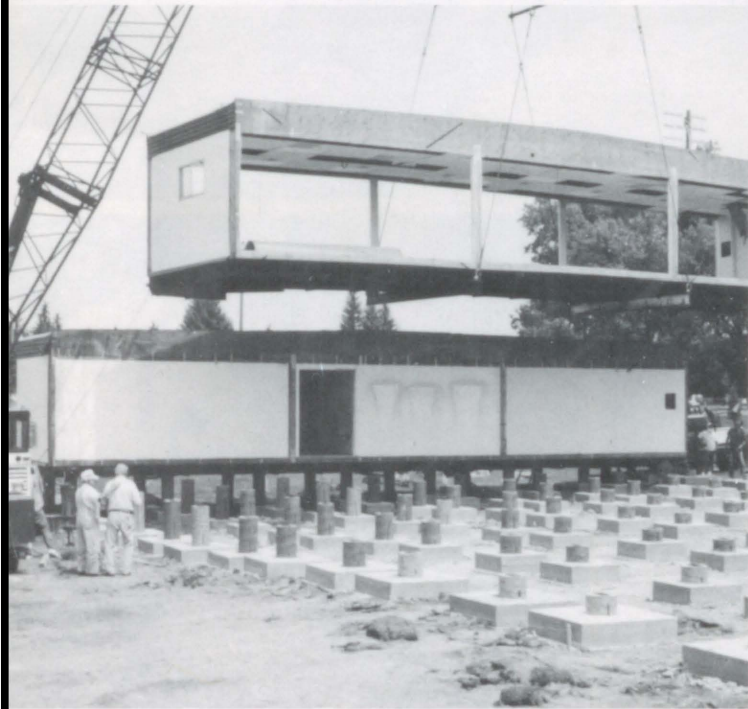

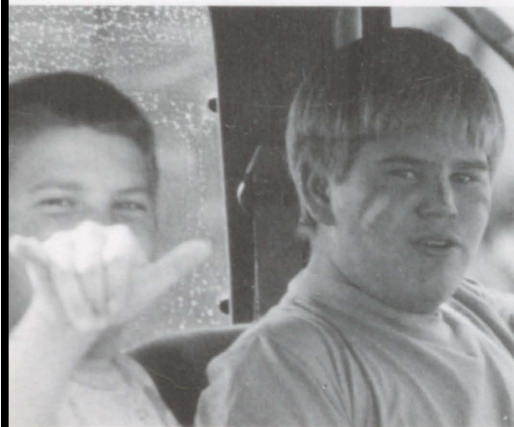

The gun has sounded and the girls cross-country members begin their quest to a district and state championship. This was a banner year for PHS sports with 3 state champions plus numerous individual awards.



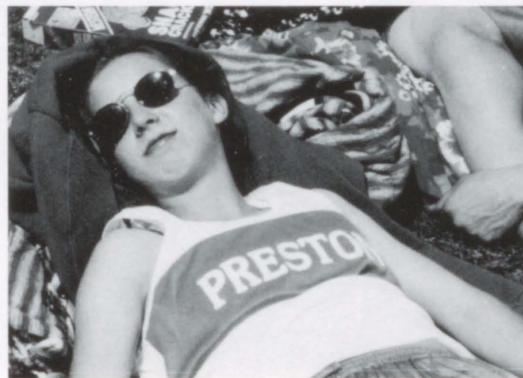
The wrestling team put together their finest season in a long time. Do you like to sweat? Join PHS wrestlers but be ready to work.

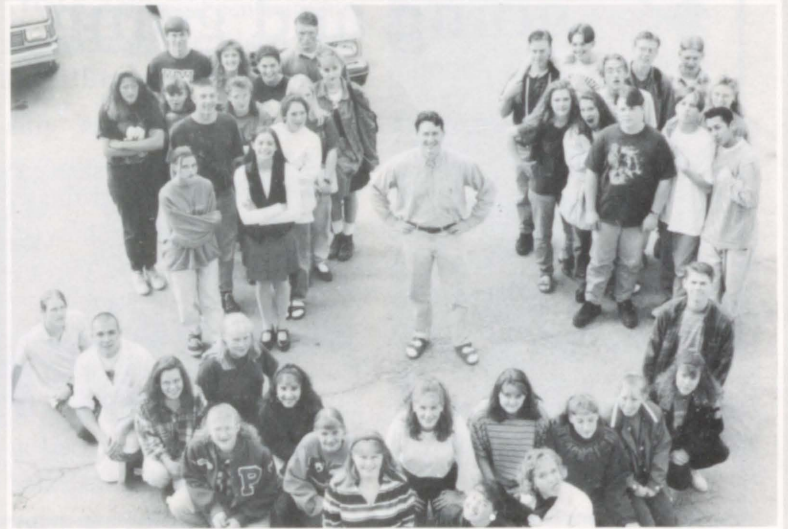

Through donations, gifts and whatever other means was needed, the PHS band finally got the opportunity to show off new uniforms during the annual homecoming show.

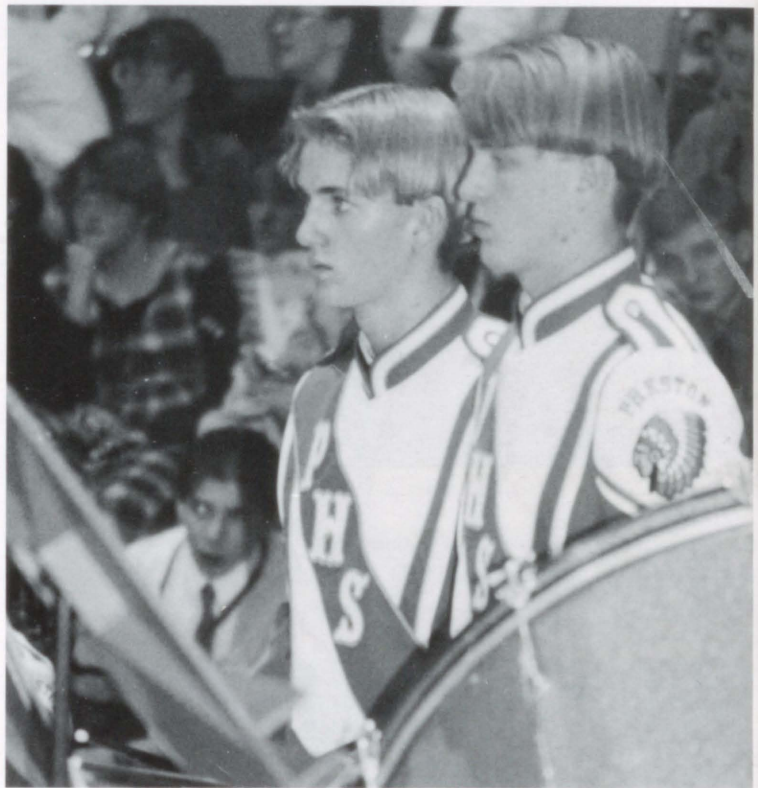
They also competed in Pocatello during state football and in other competitions. The judges were so impressed at one competition that they said



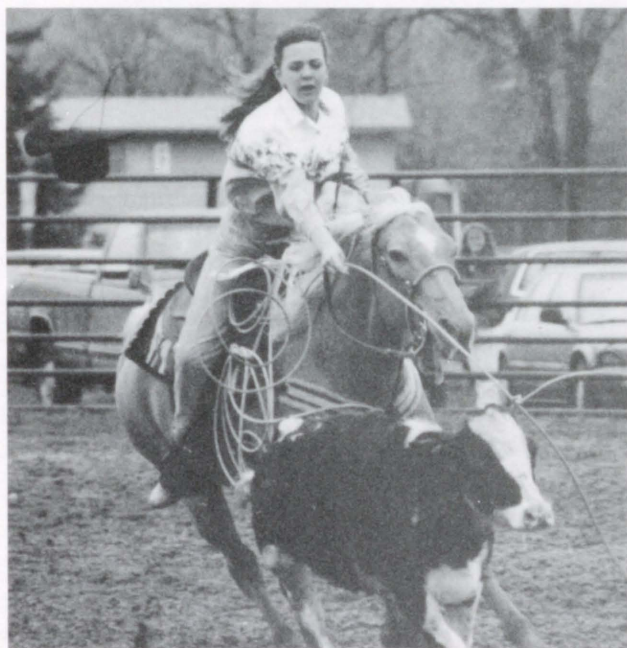
"Eight seconds of pure adrenaline"

"I think my favorite was probably the games (i.e. running, basketball) and having treats. I really liked the rollerskating too." *Patrick Phillips.*

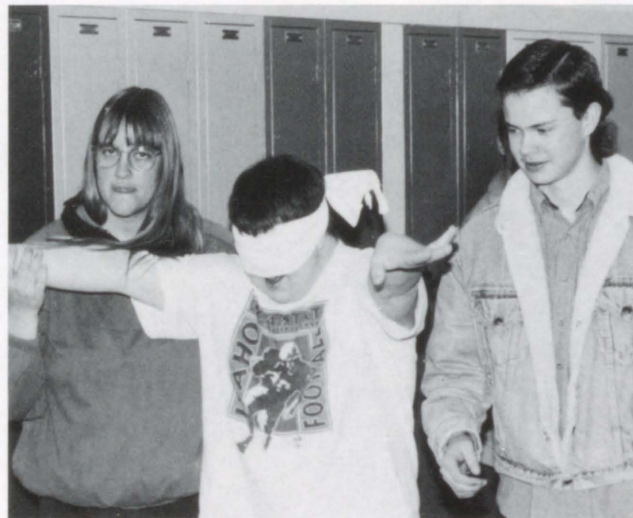

Preston's Aca Deca team was once again one of the top in the

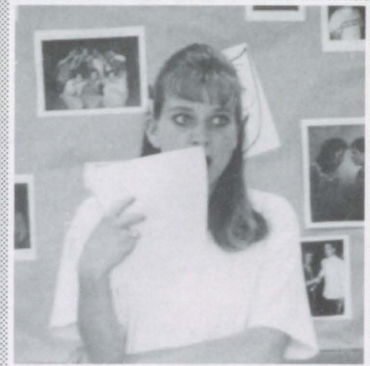
state. Mrs. Heers comments, "Everything is studied in one room and taught by one teacher. It gives students a purpose for learning."

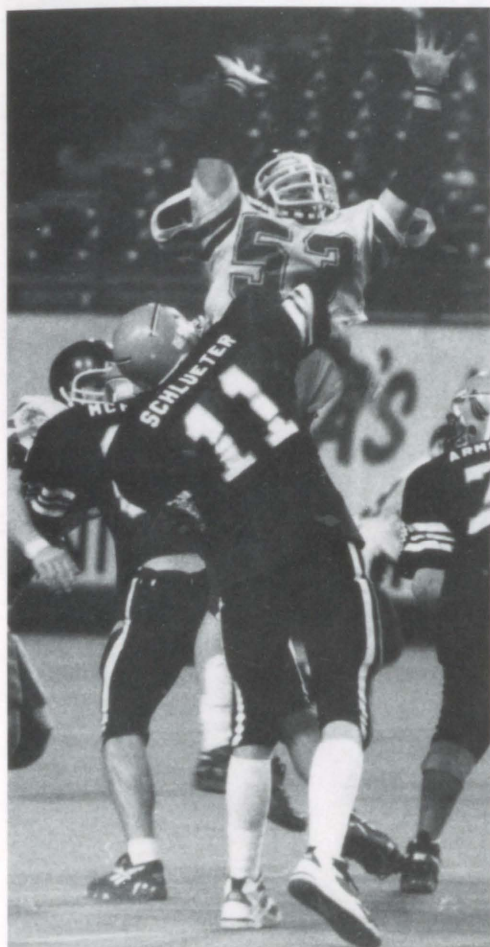

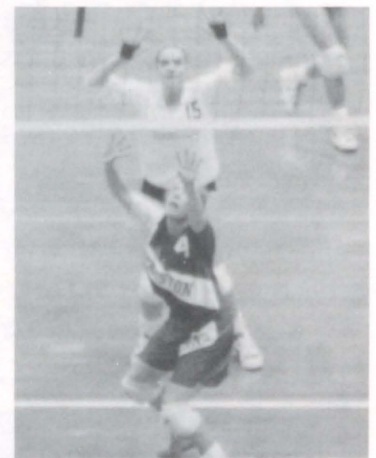





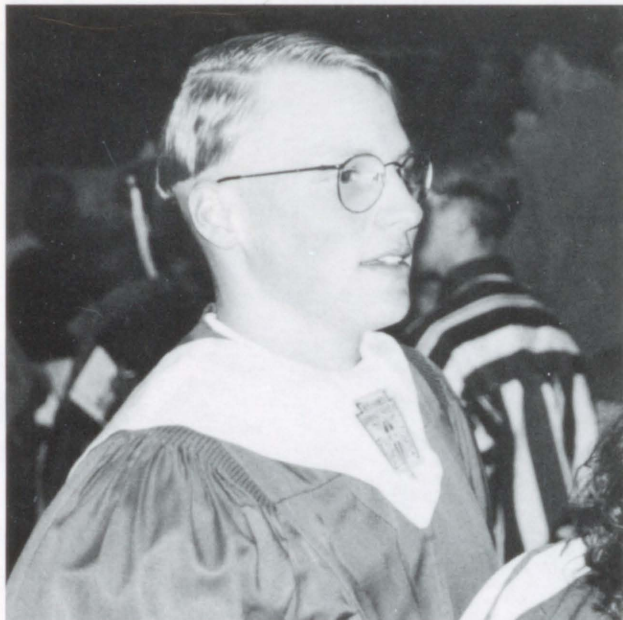

Julie Ward commented, "Do whatever Cattani tells you, no questions asked."

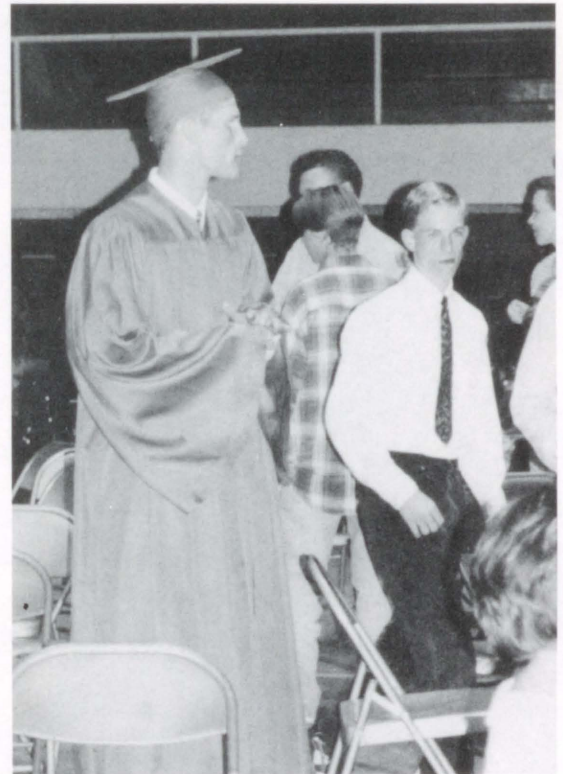

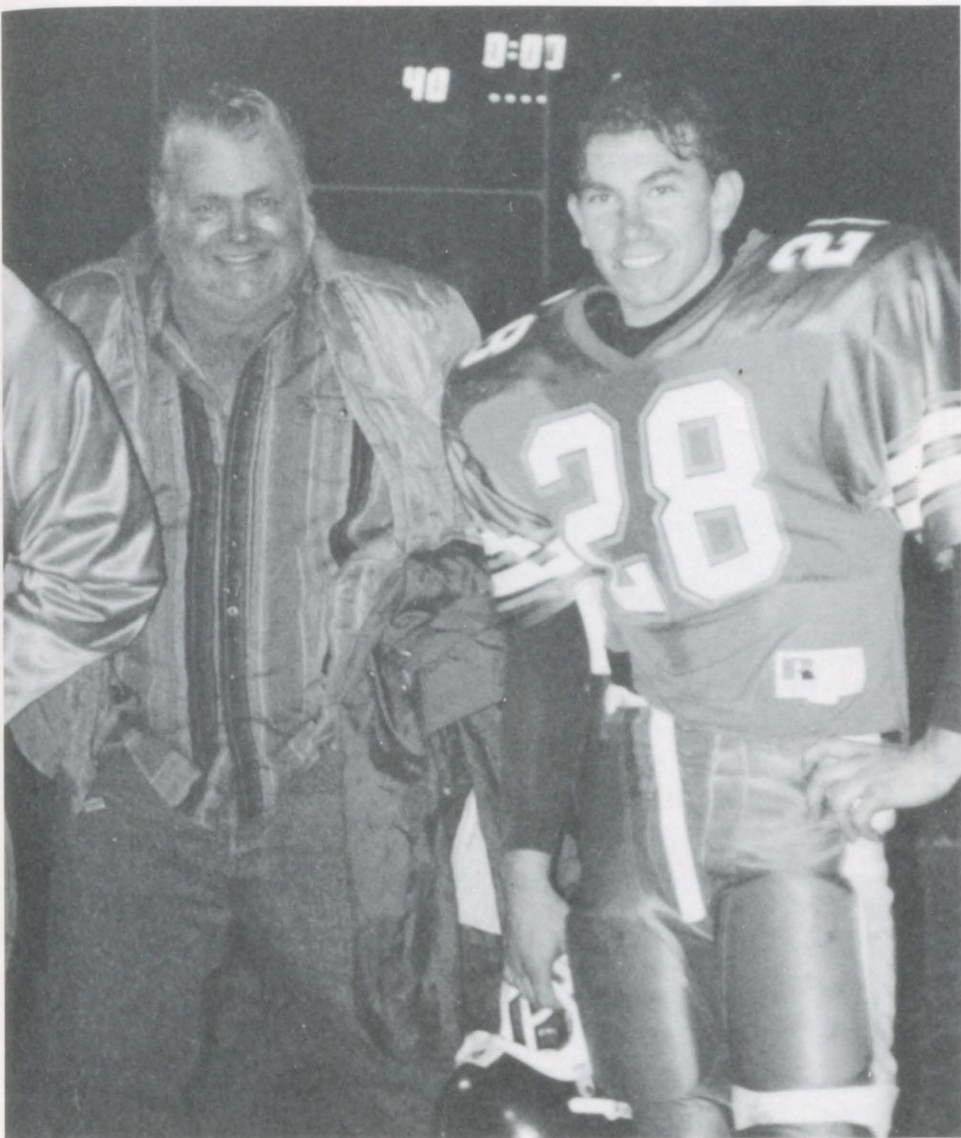

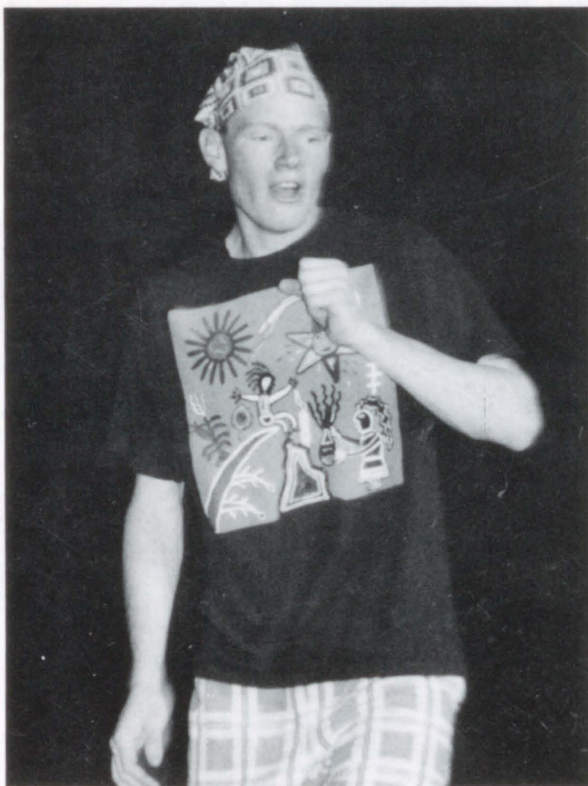

also give her android some male characteristics like, "The body of Claude Van Damme and the face of Brad Pitt."

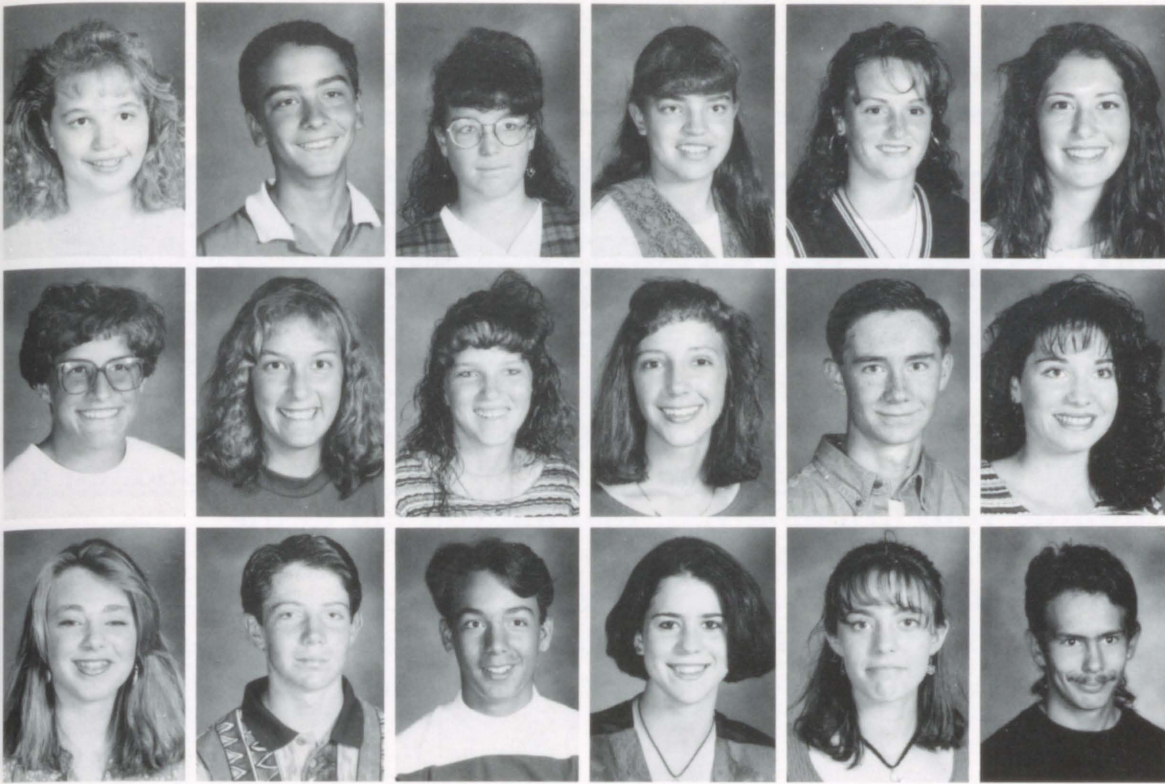

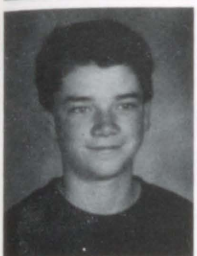

Aaron Lyon feels that "the words they put in the song could stick in their head and they might do it."

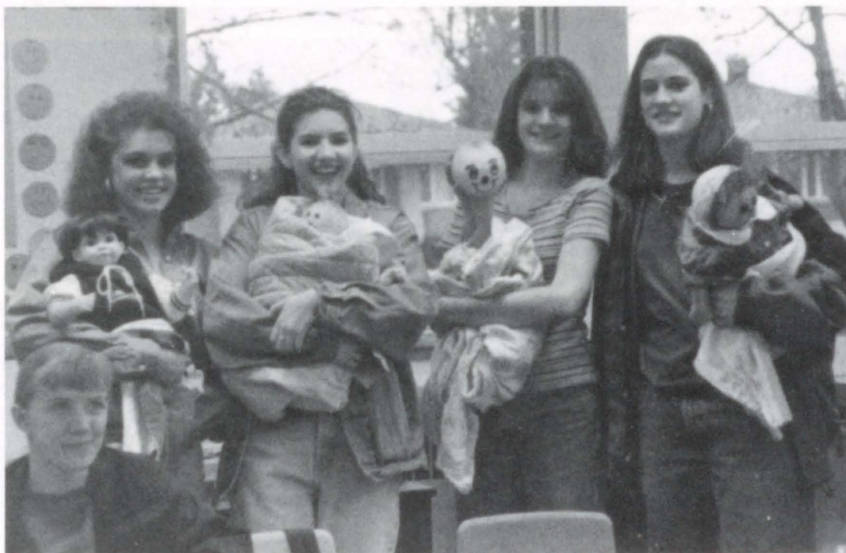
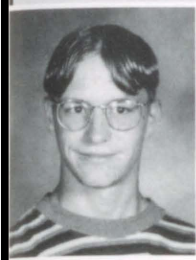

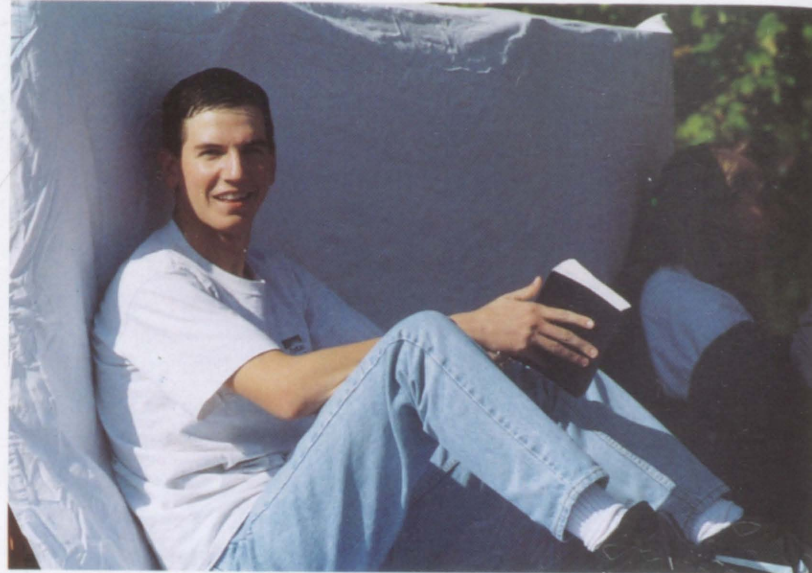
