





#### If These WALLS Could Talk...

















Chris Gamble - "A true friend is someone who you can mooch off."













David Woolley commented that in the summer at the U.S.U. football camp was a lot of fun because the team got to know each other a little better.




Coach Holyoak prepares the special team unit before they take the field. Coach was a new addition this year and PHS benefitted. (Photo by: Mr. Hansen)








































# Only Time Will Tell! The Y2K Bug—










### So Much To Remember

















Dress codes at high schools are changing. They are getting more specific and inflexible. With or without uniforms, students will always find ways to express themselves as an individual.





All in all the students at PHS are willing to share their point of view. For the most part, they usually have something relevant to say. Advice is an easy thing to give but choose what you use wisely.







Sleep helps start the next day off, so make sure you get enough sleep!
















