His accomplishments are many. Among his achievements are: helped establish the Shamrocks, a professional

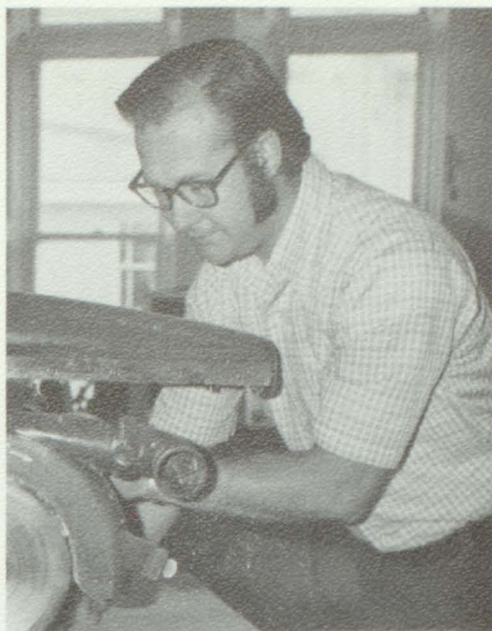

We are proud he chose to return to Preston to share his wisdom and enthusiasm for living with us. It is with this pride we dedicate this yearbook to Onan T. Mecham.



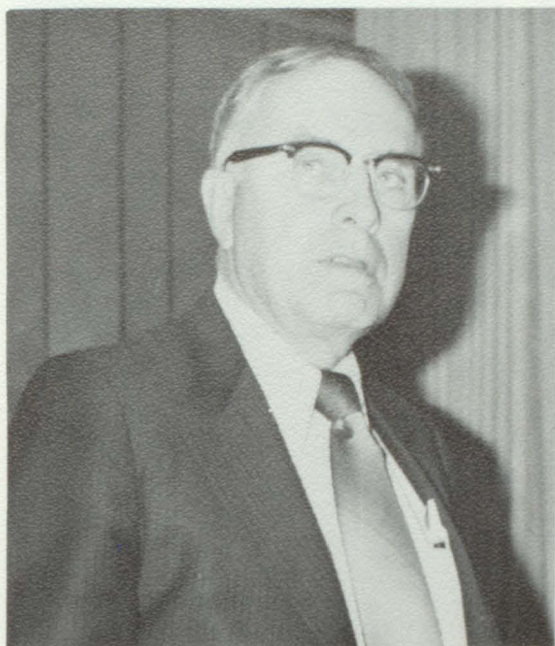

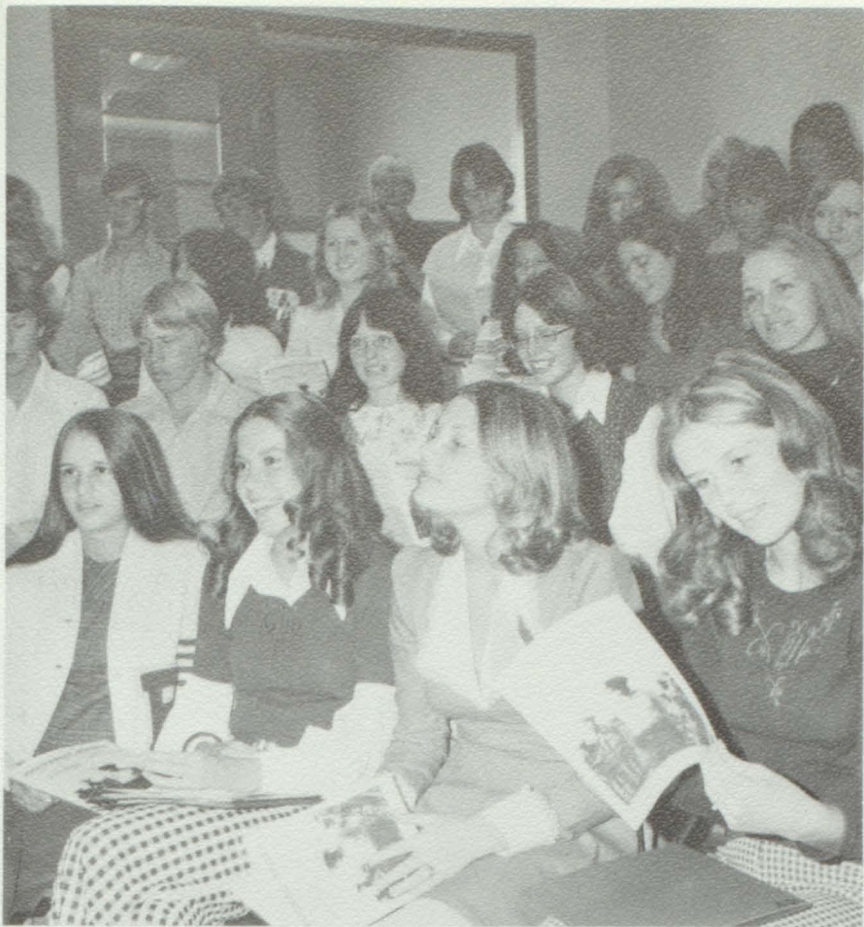
## Choir Organized New Group

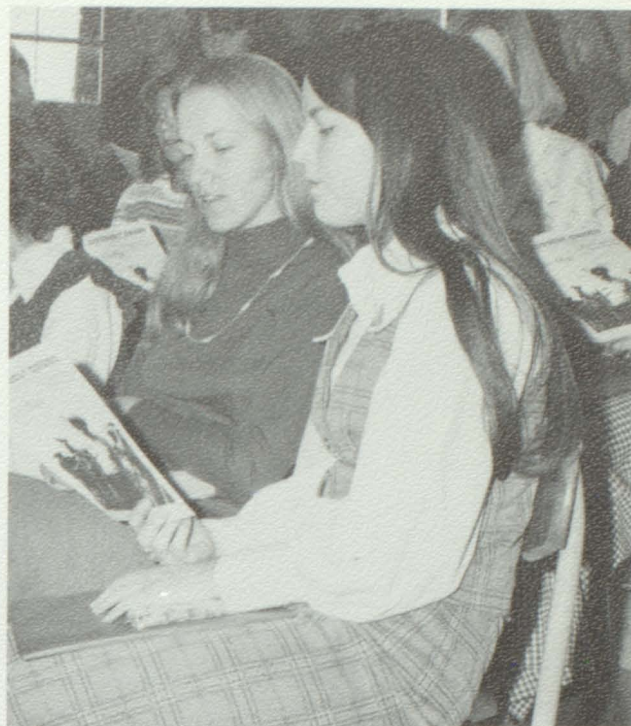

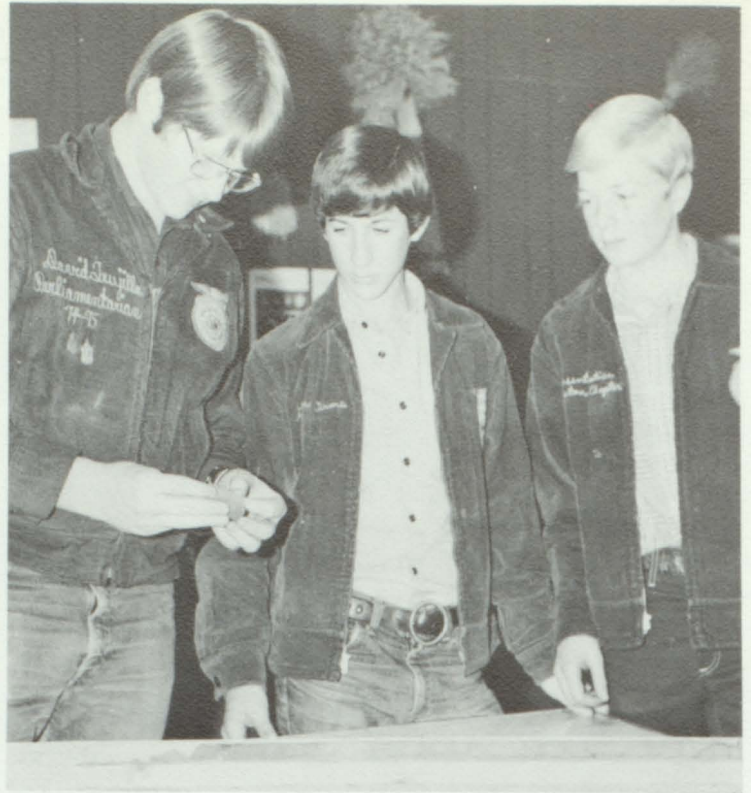

## Chess Club Requires Concentration By All Participants

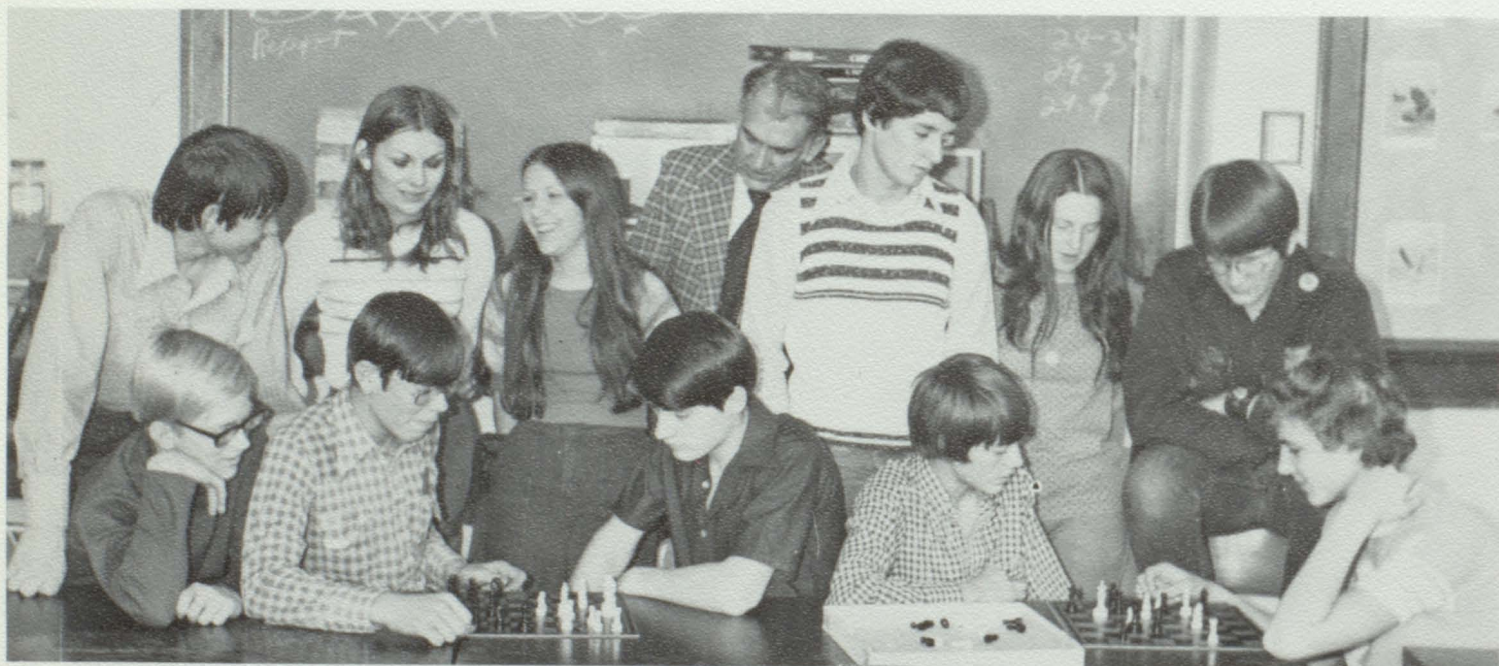

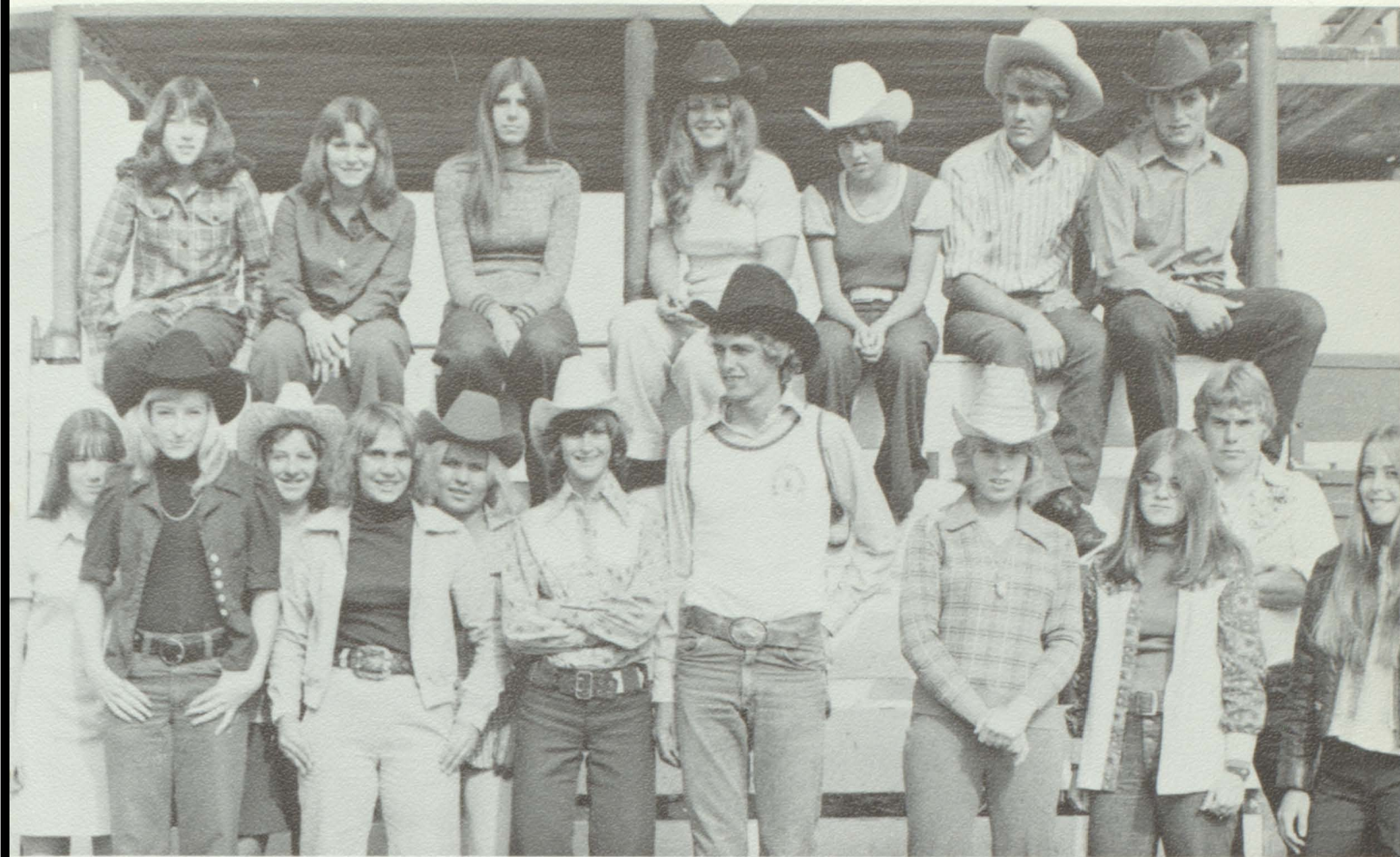

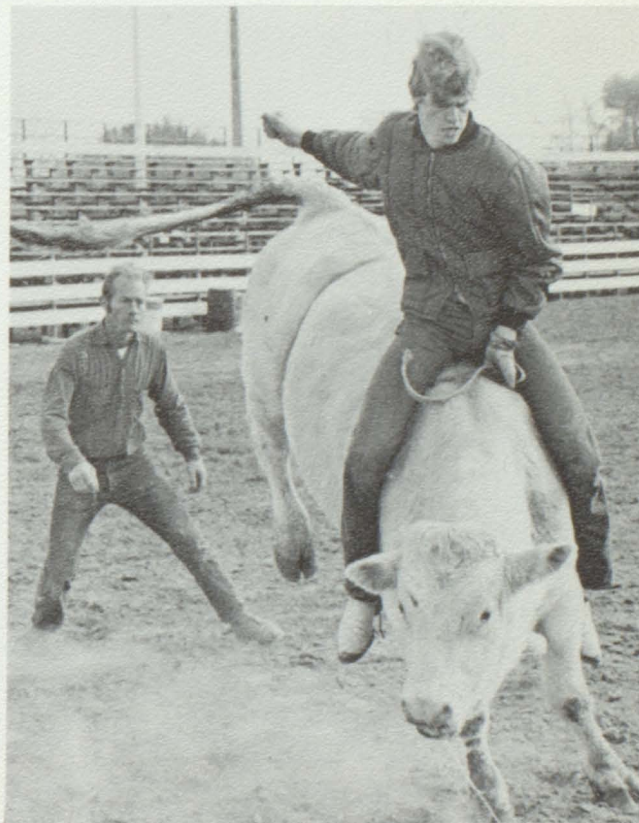

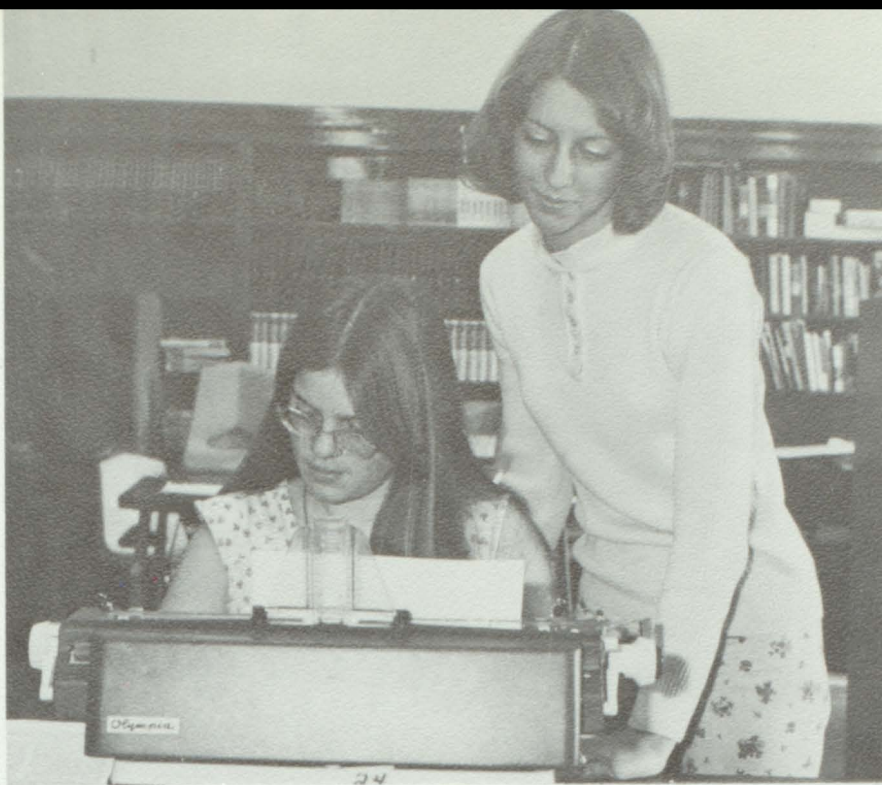
## Ski Club Enjoys Out-Of-Doors

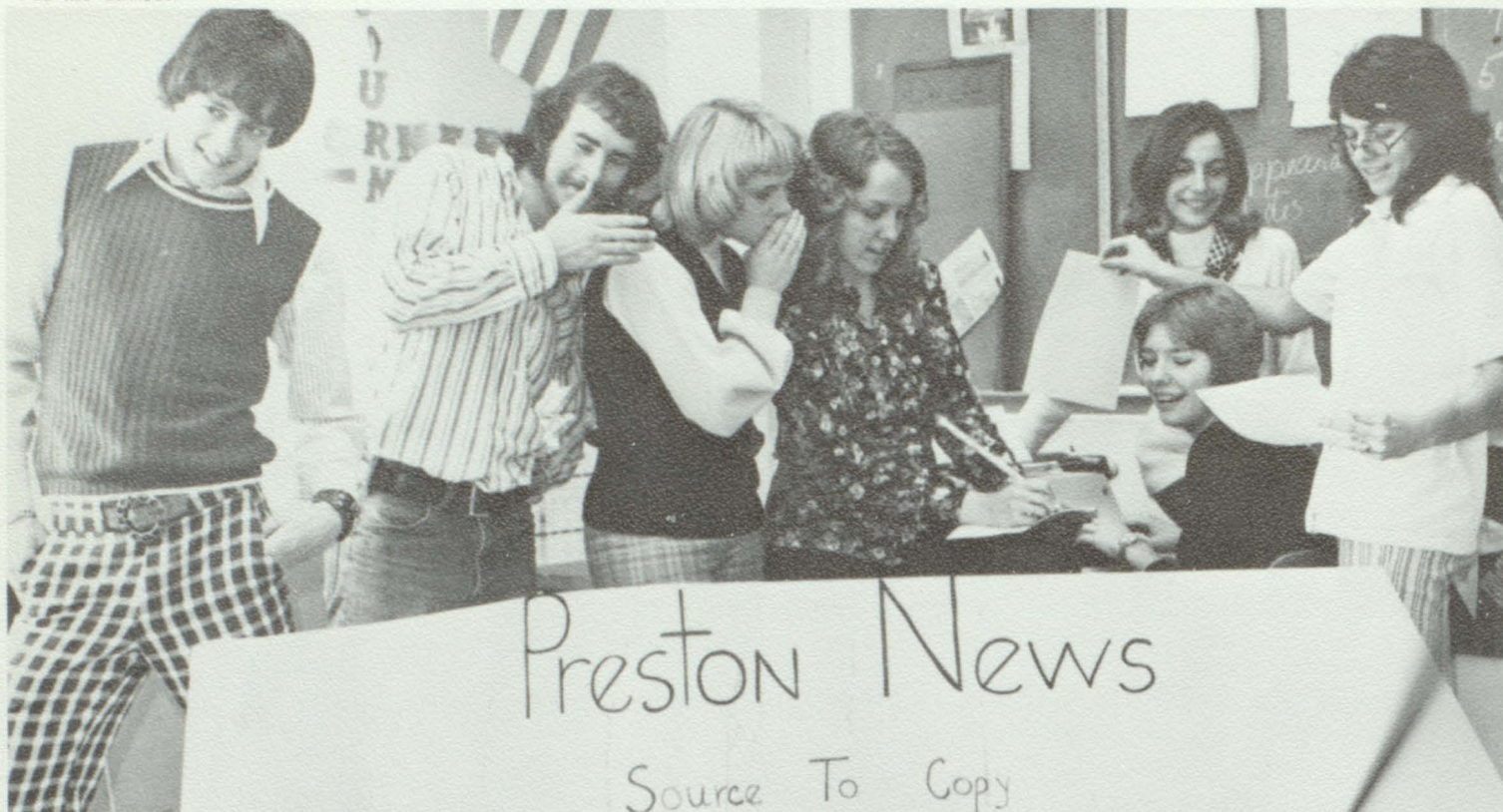

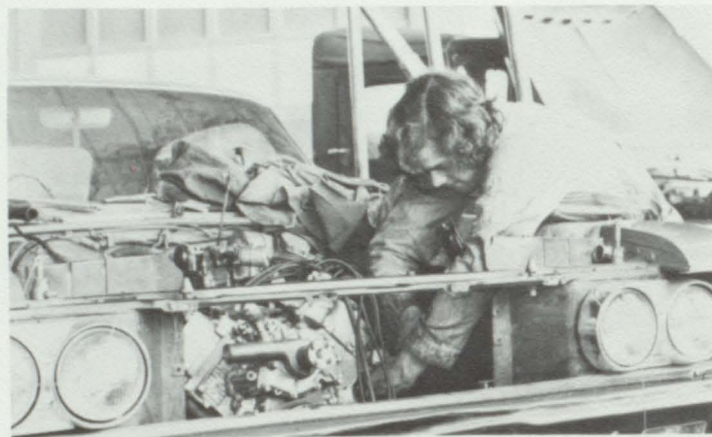

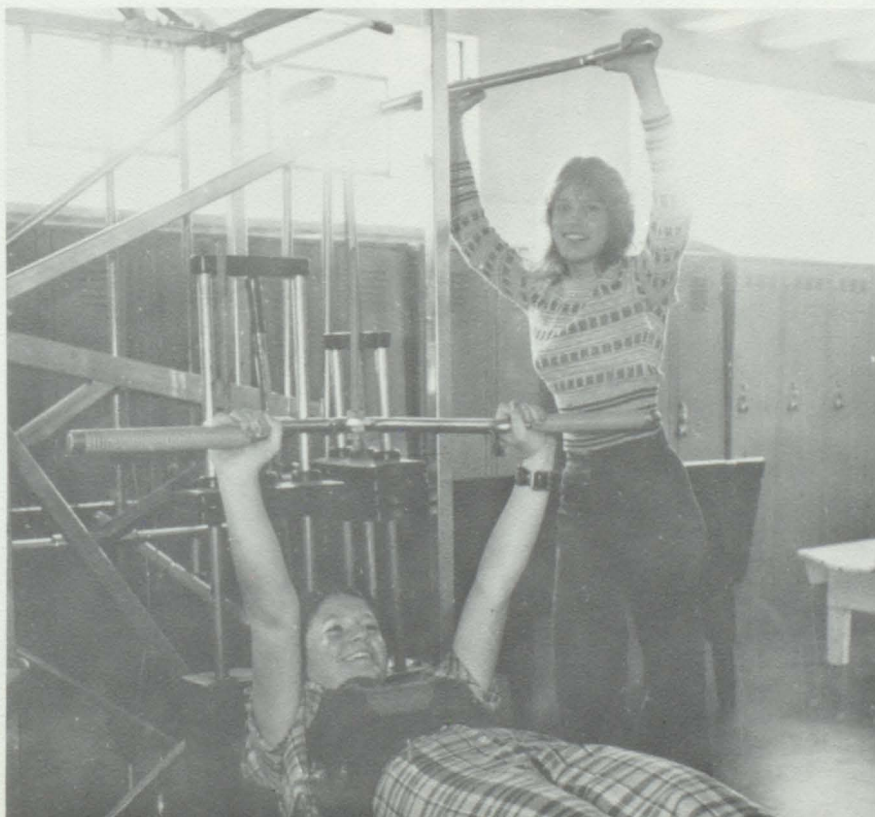
## V.I.C.A. Encourages Vocational Training

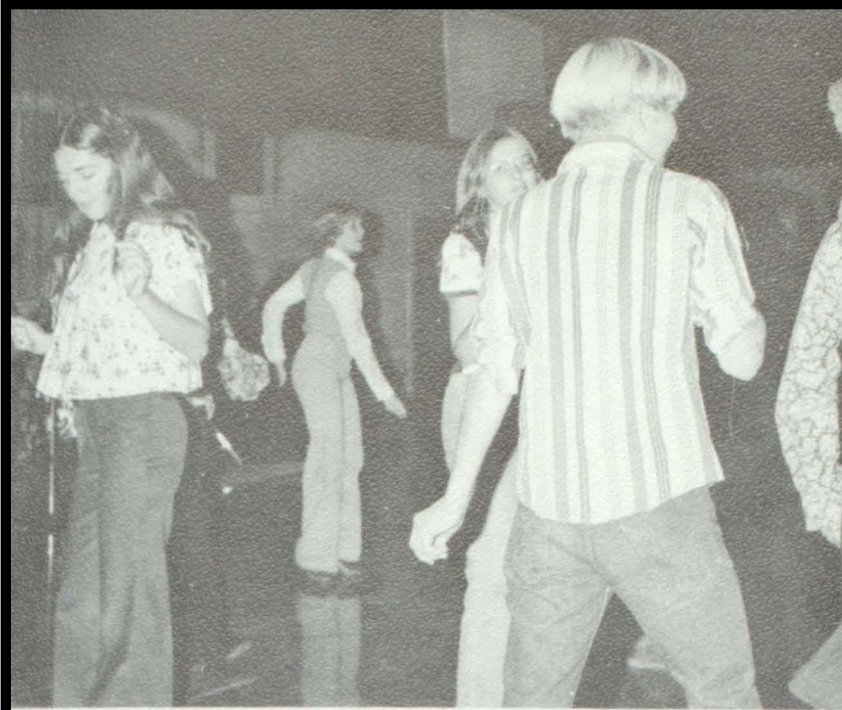

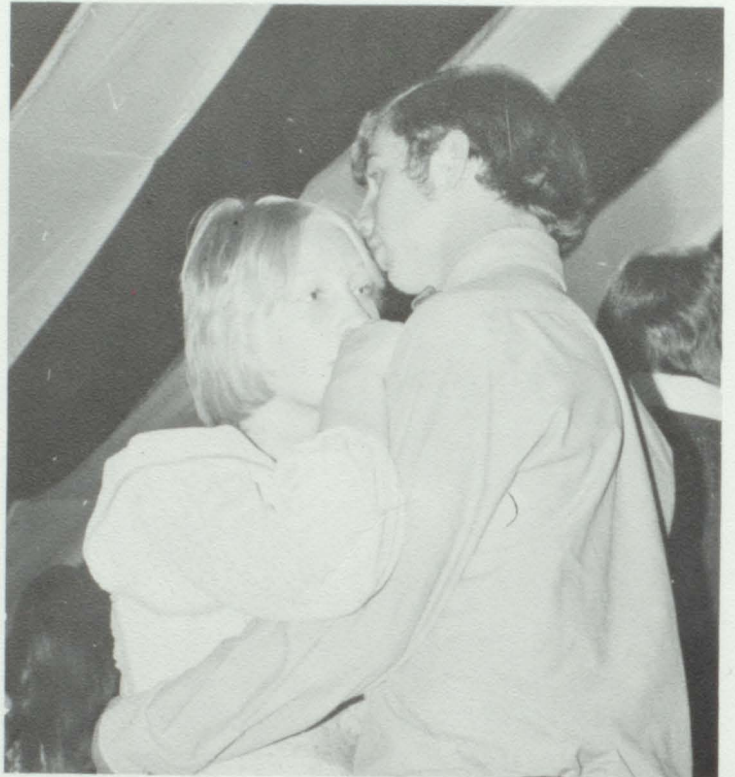

## Students And Faculty Staff Themselves At The Pizza Party

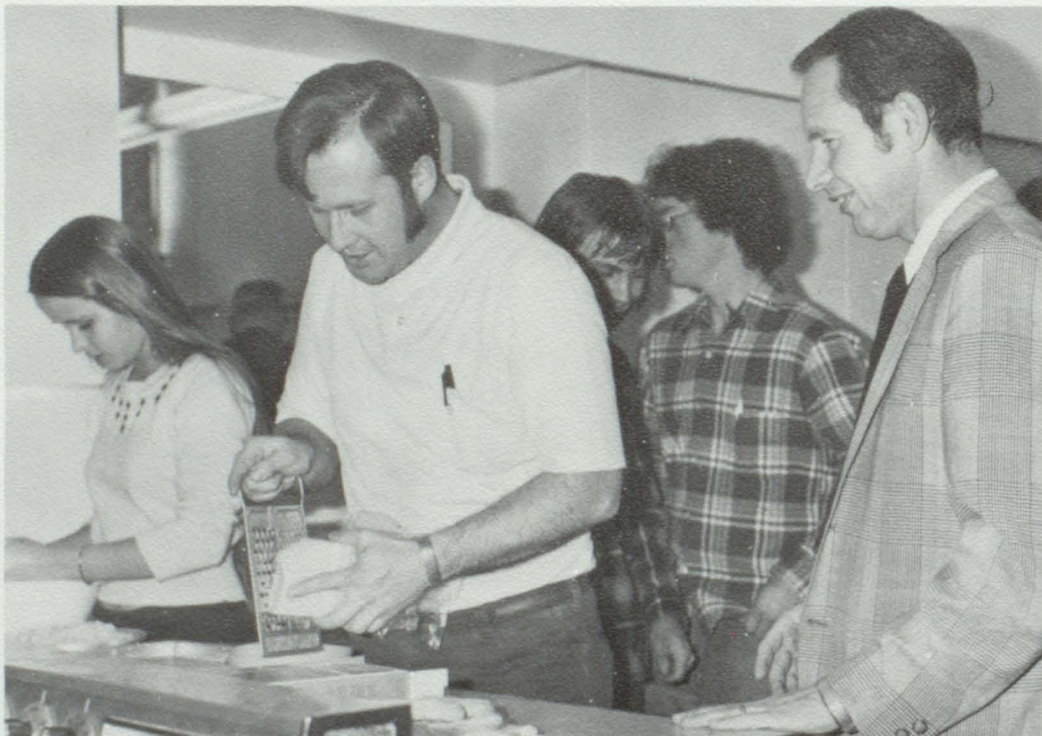

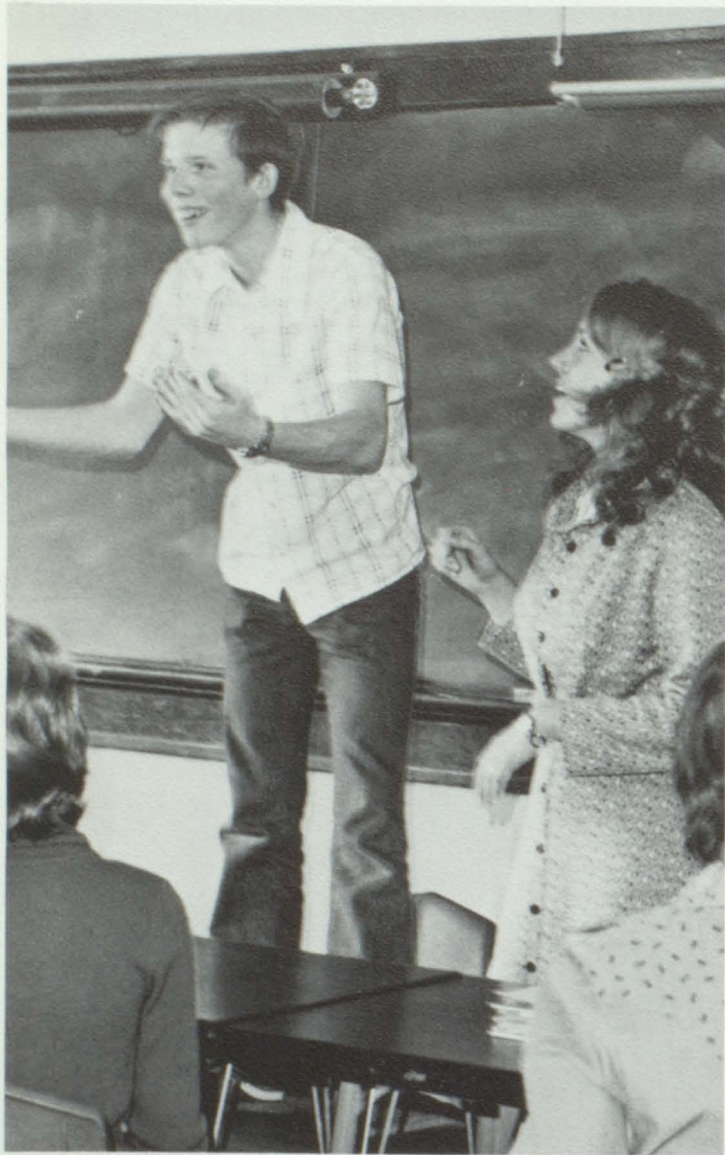

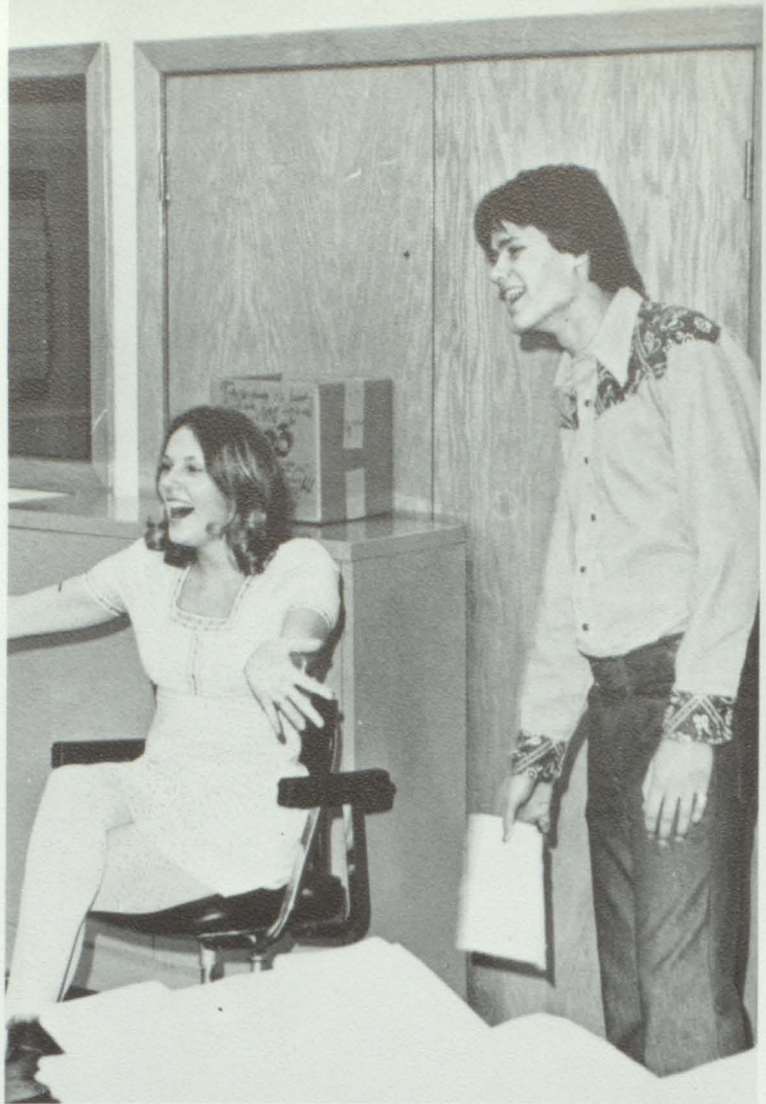
## Slave Day Was Full Of Bargains

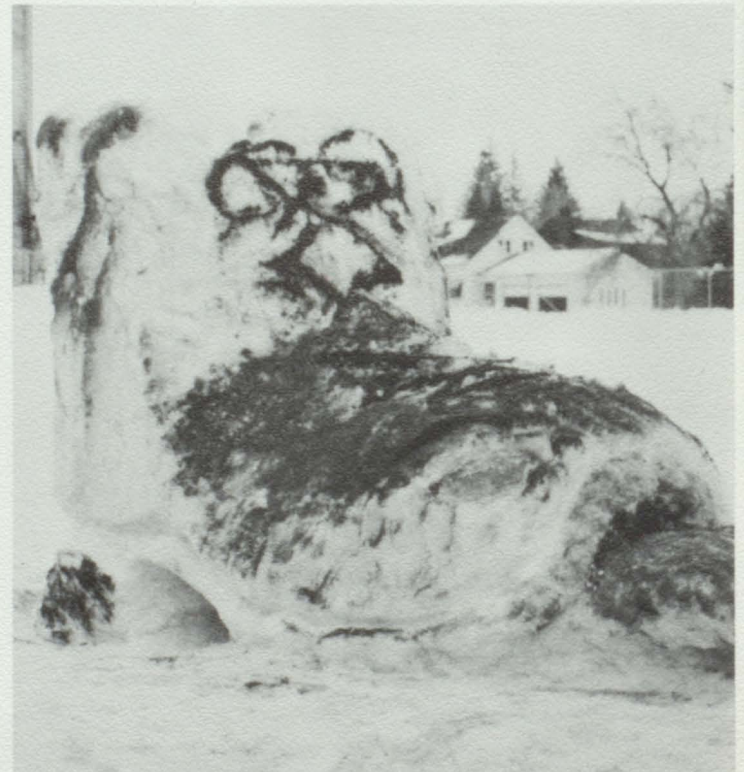

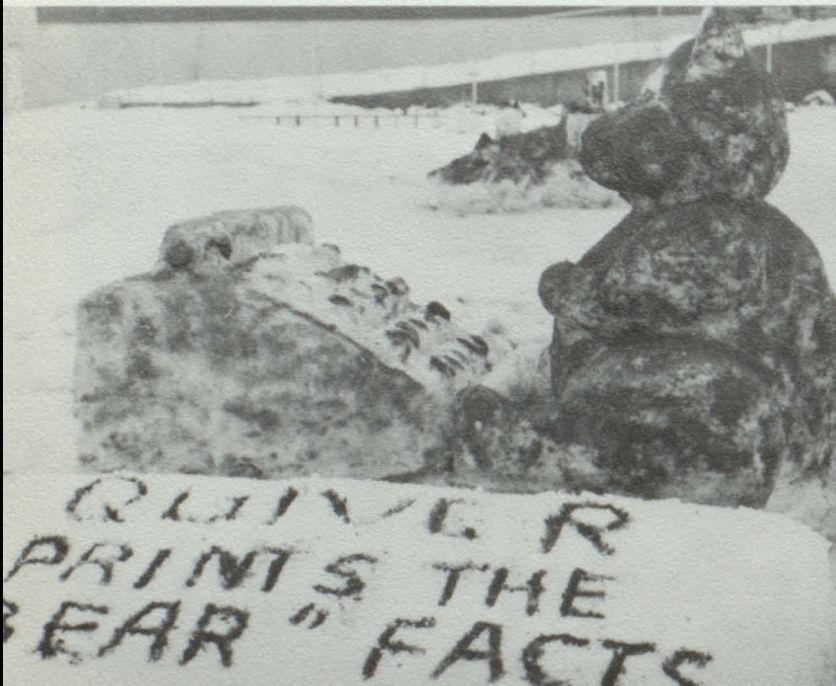

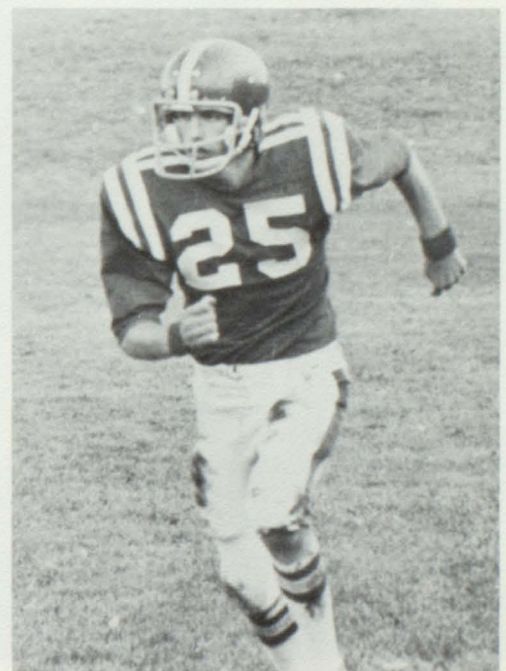

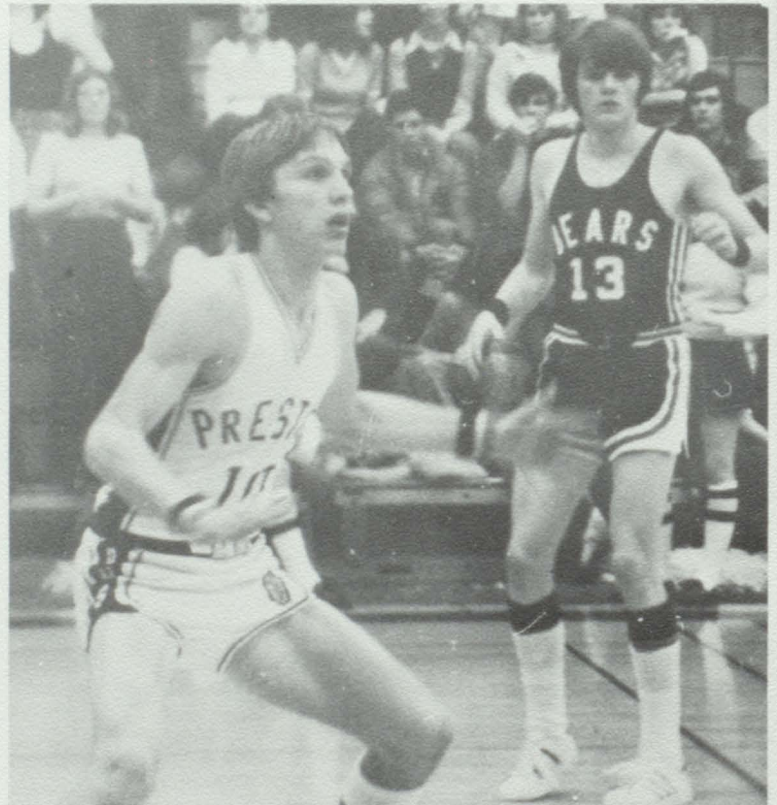
The Junior Varsity were S-U-P-E-R. They won 18 of their 20 games, defeated only by Shelley and Snake River.

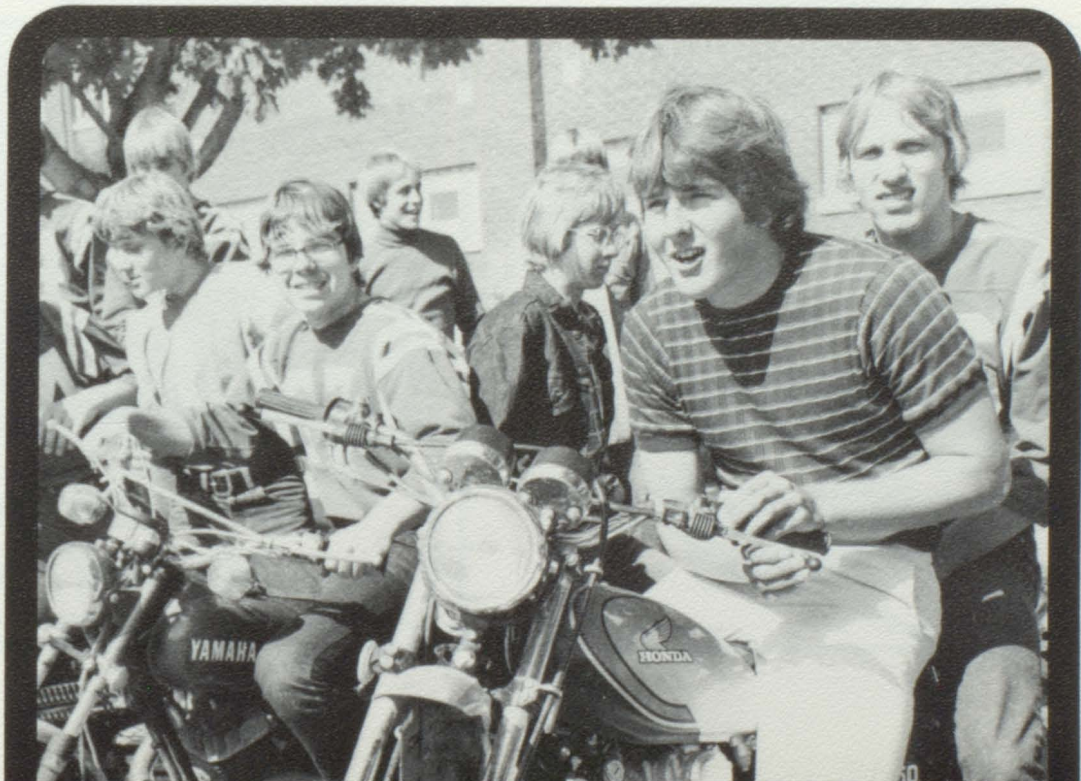
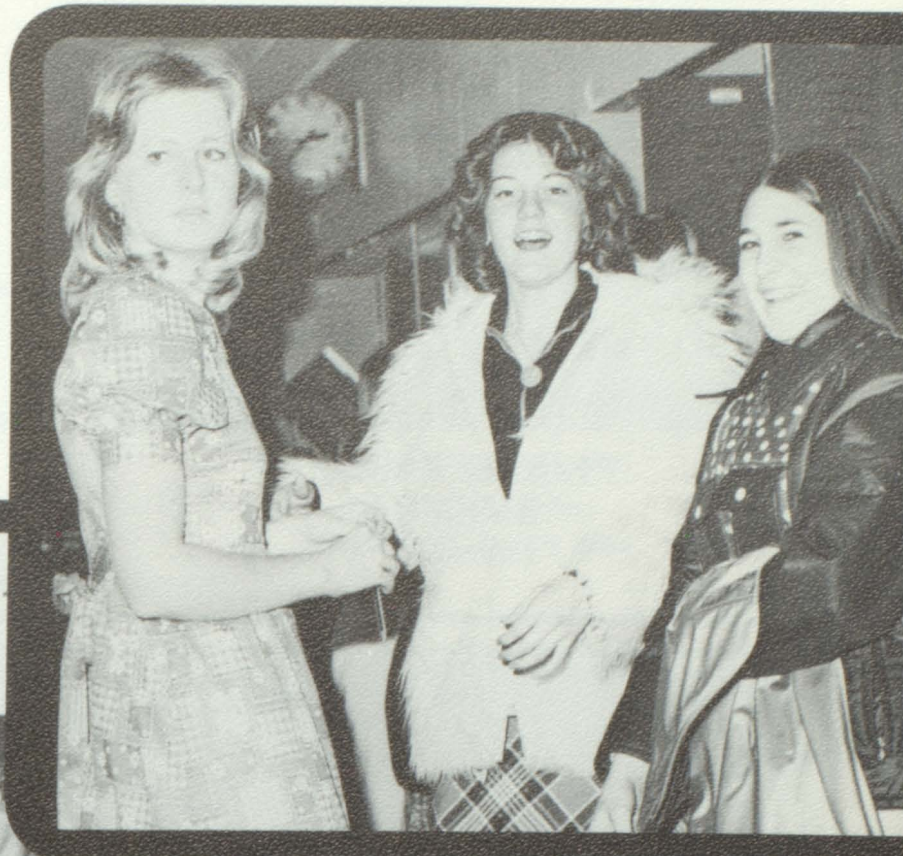
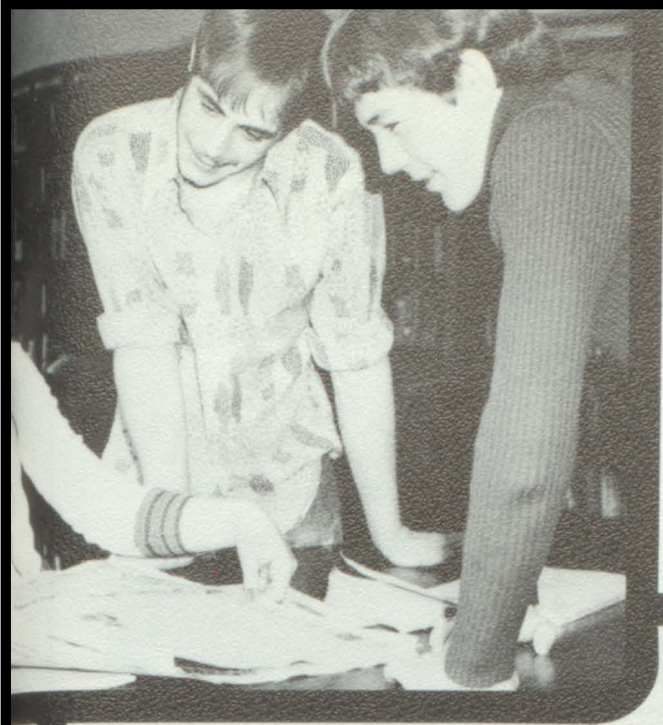
## New Track Helps The Girls' Track Team
