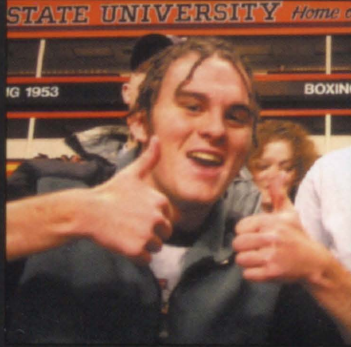

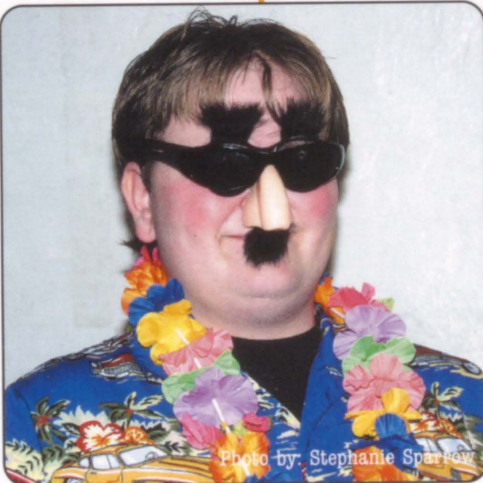

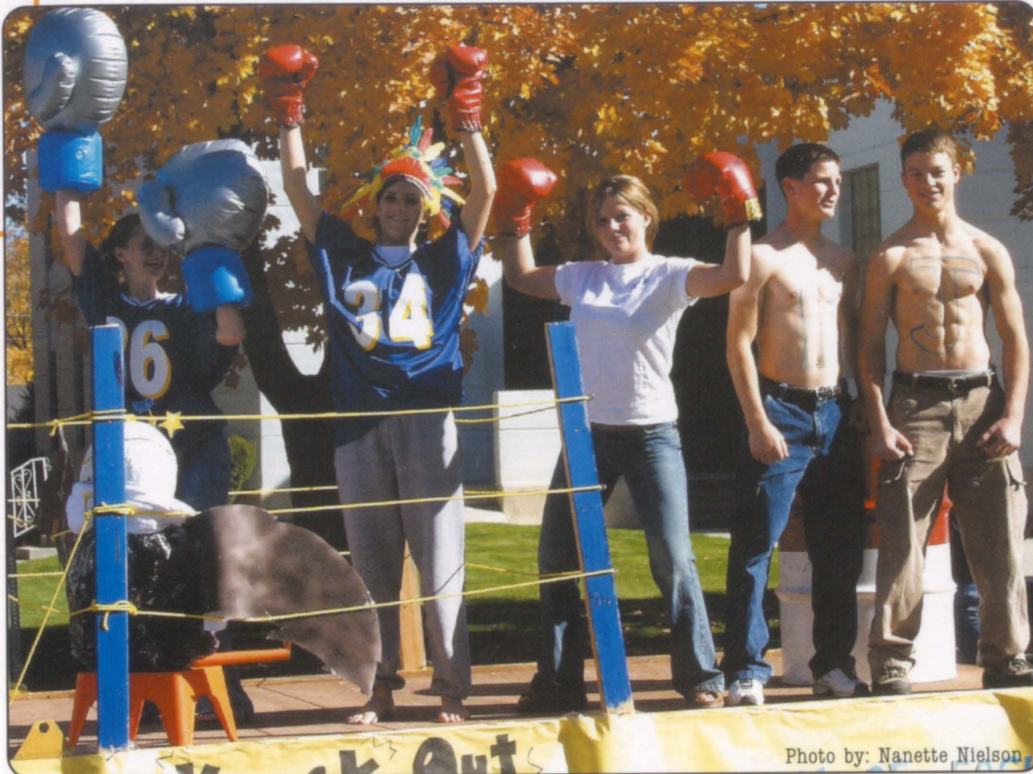

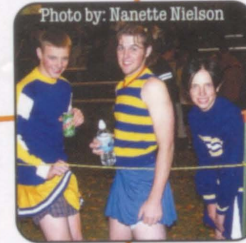

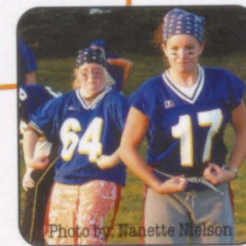

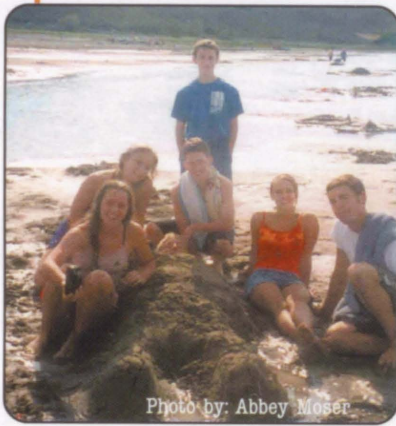

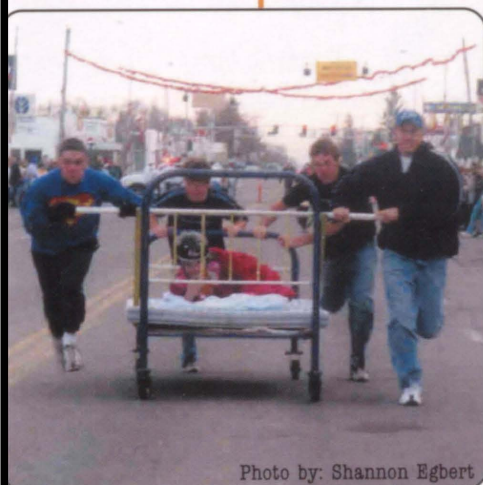

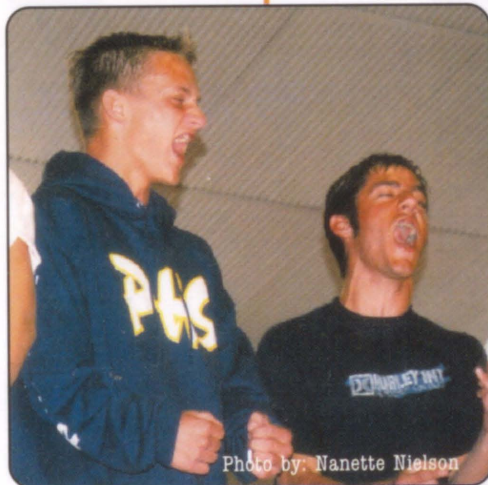

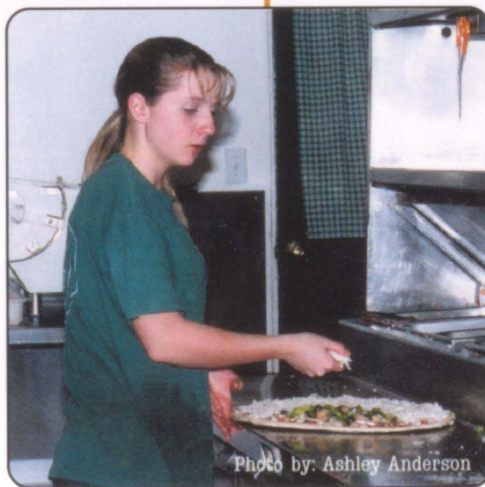

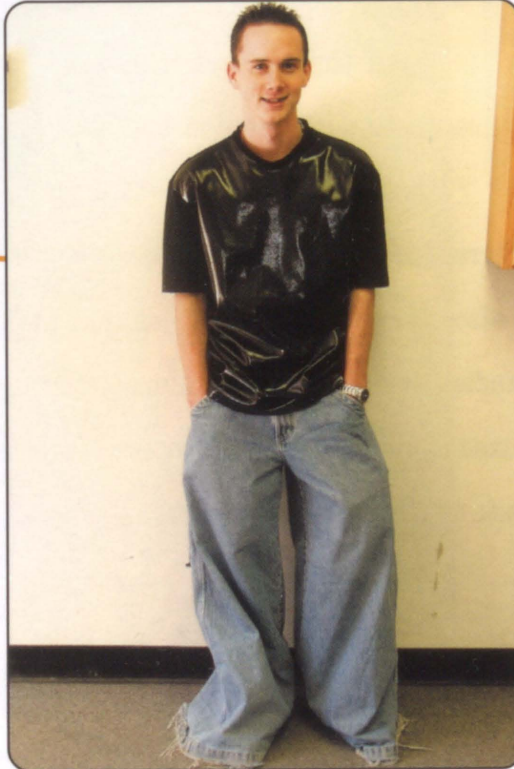

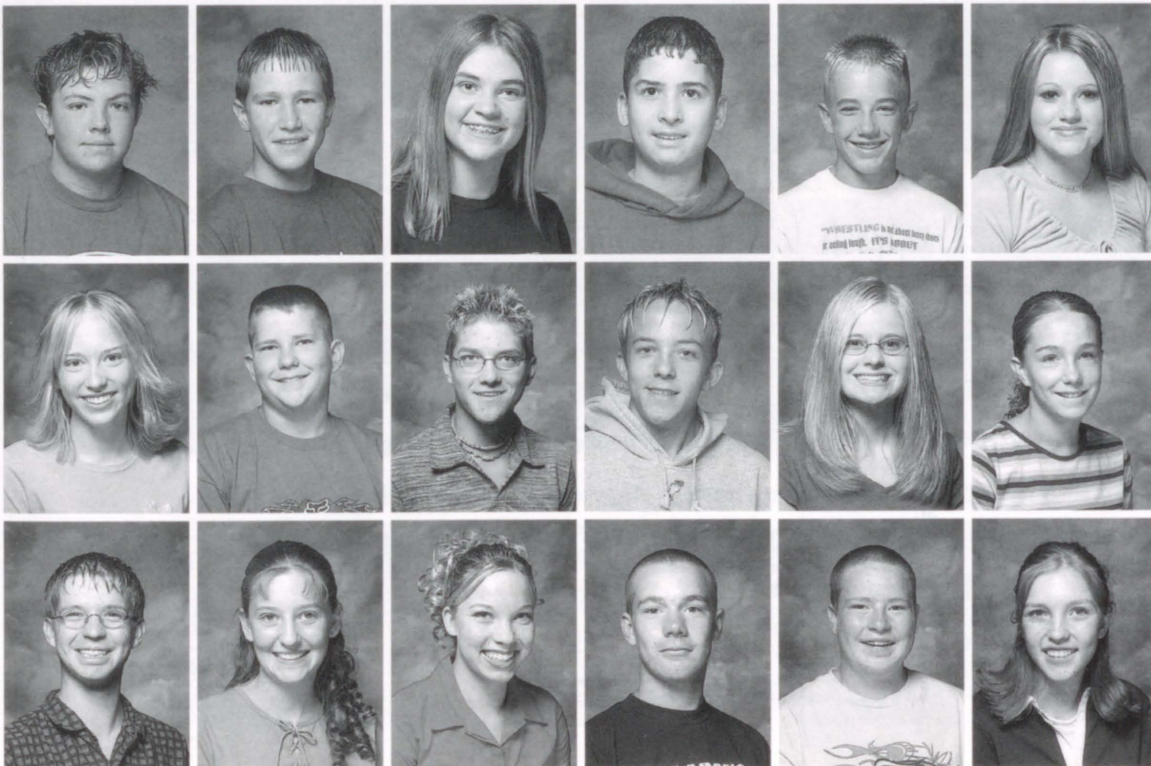
So when asked the question, "If you had the chance, what would you do to initiate the seniors?" We found that some people had actually thought about sweet revenge.

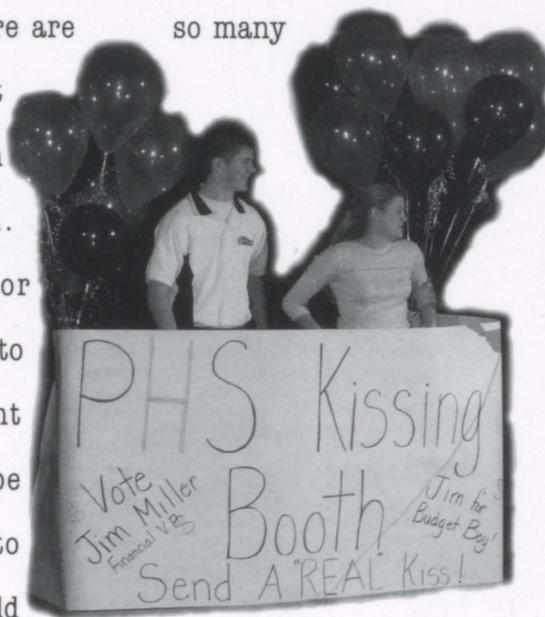

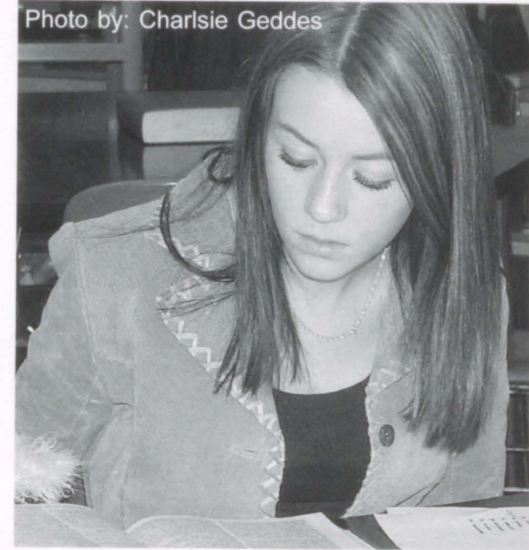
English

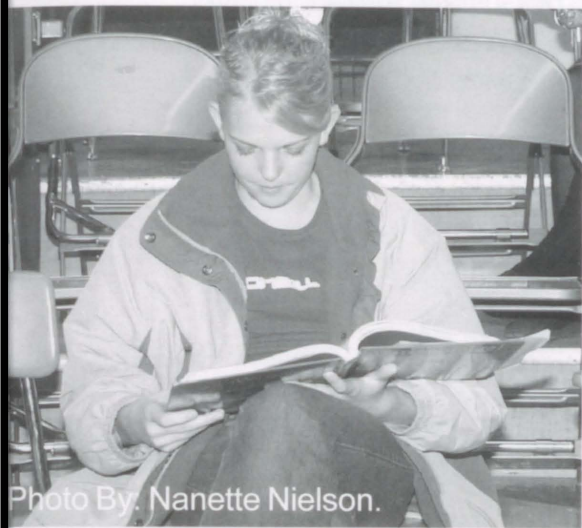

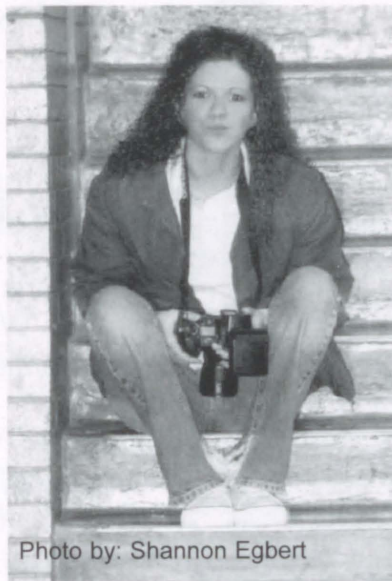

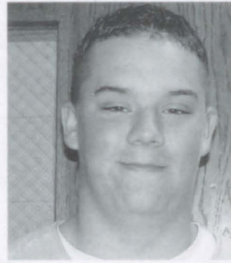
Orchestra

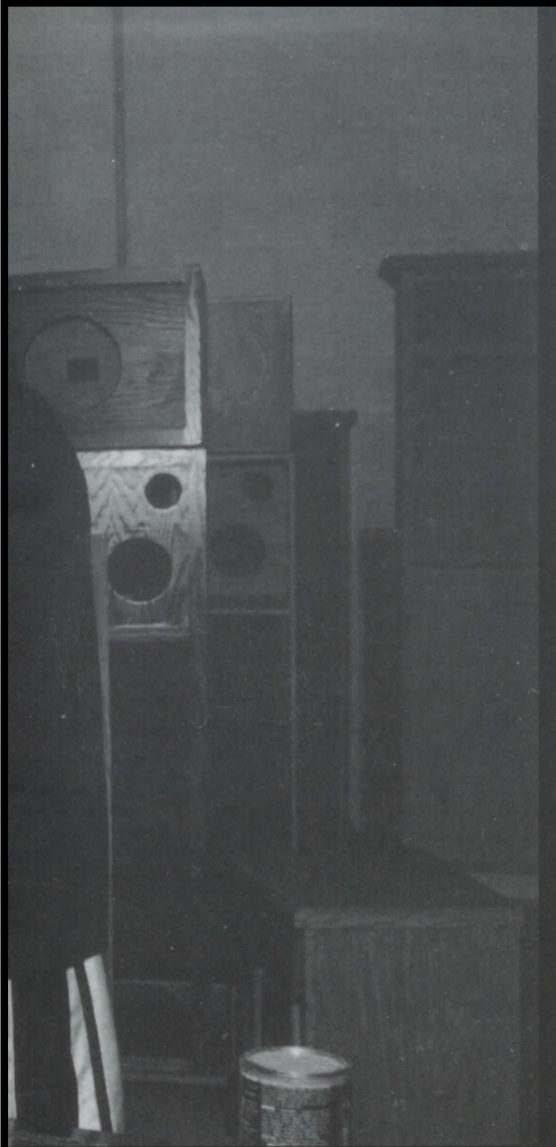

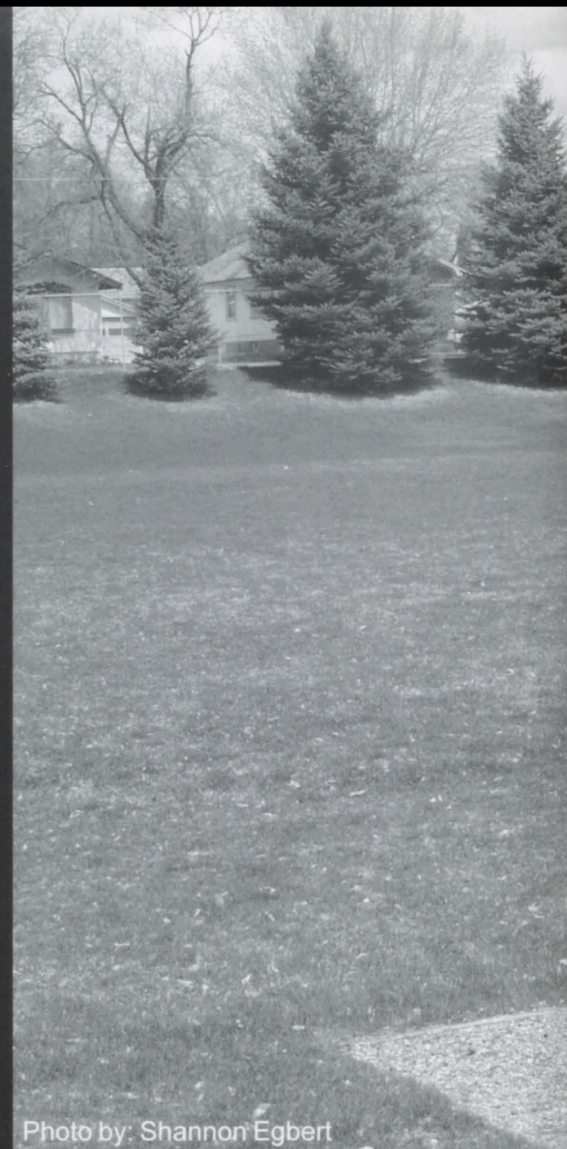

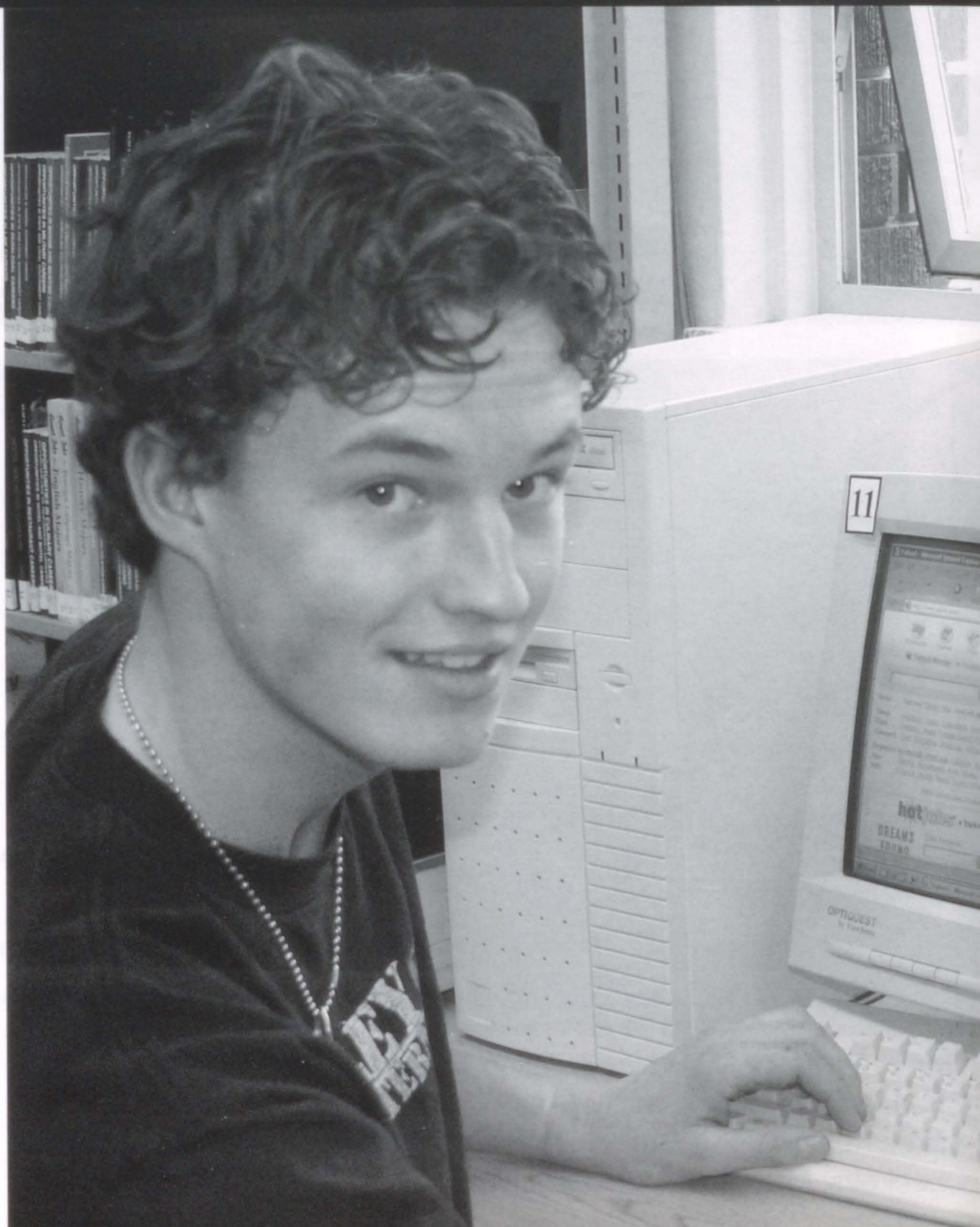

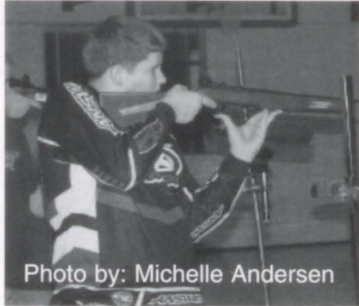

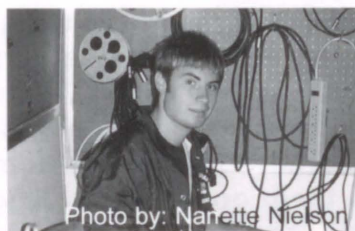

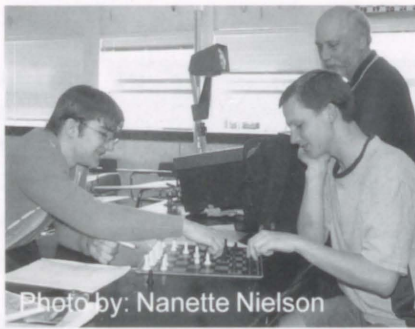

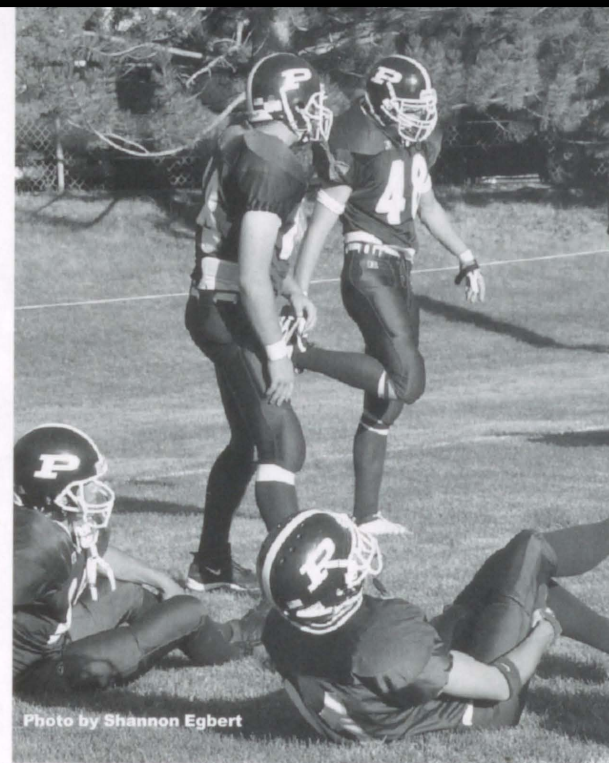

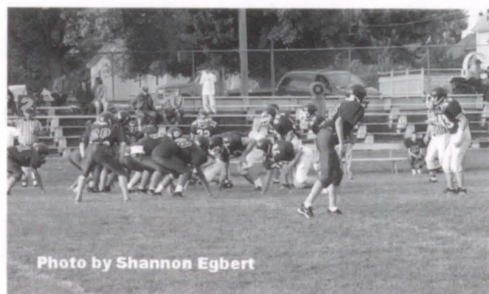

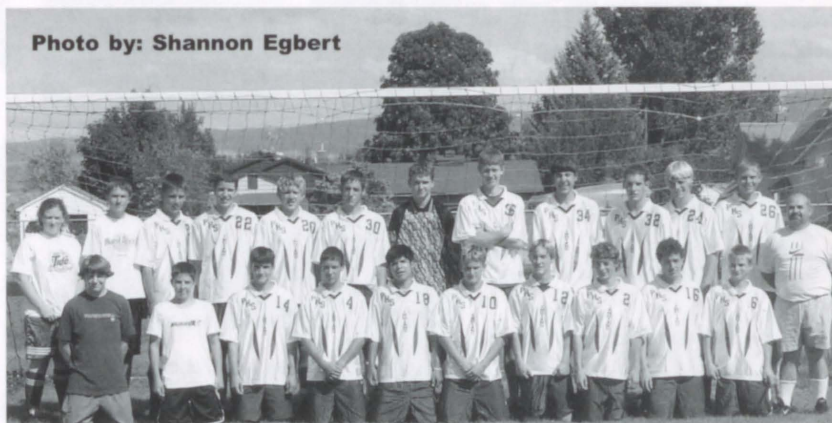

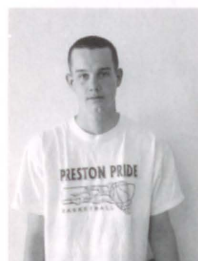

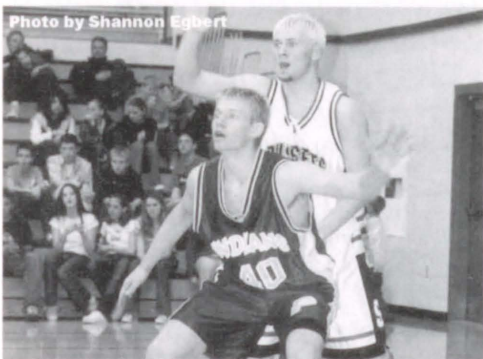

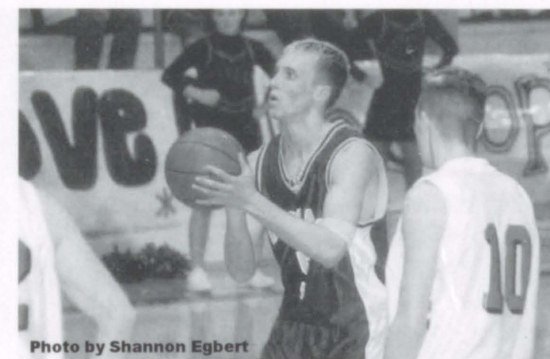

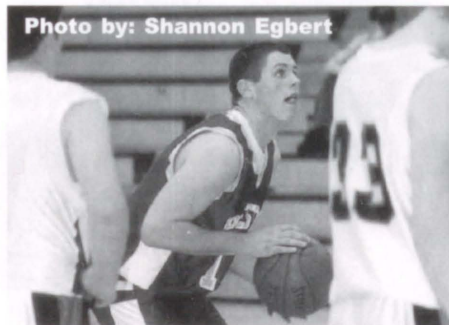

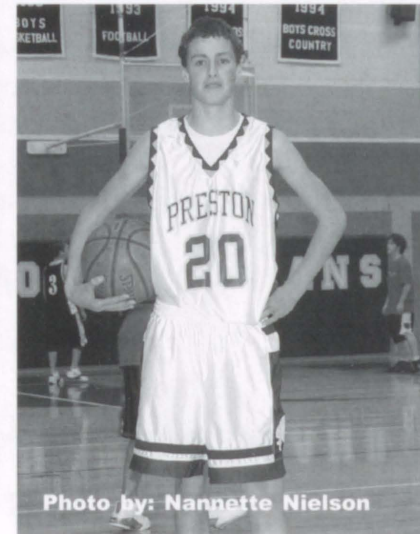

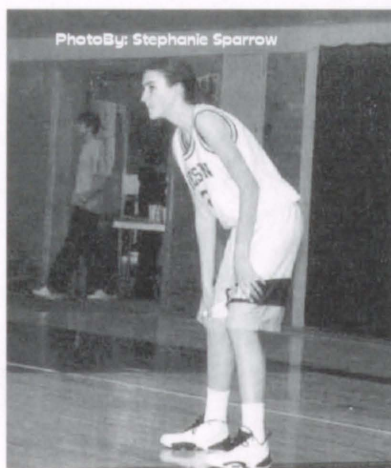

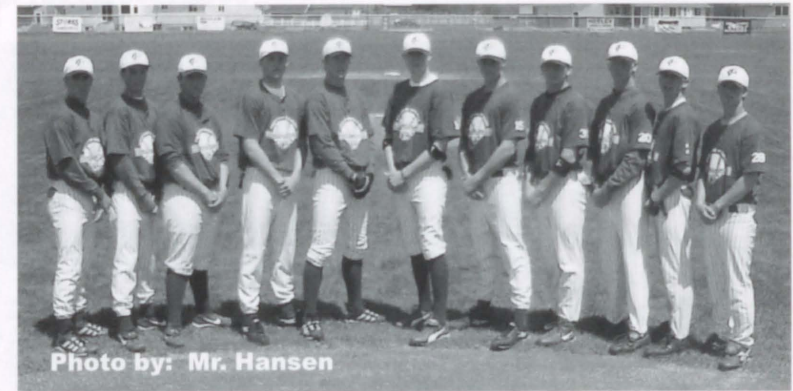

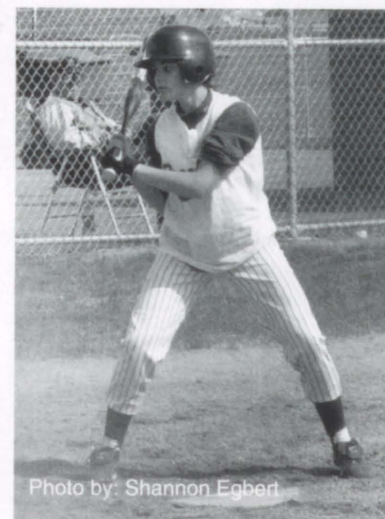

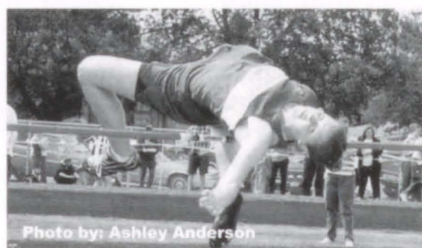
