








English








Mathematics




and meeting deadlines can be a lot of work and take plenty of time in and out of school.

Cheerleading








Choir








Varsity – Football






Basketball




The Preston Wrestling team was young and exciting. Made up seven freshman and two sophomores out of fourteen weights, the team was hard




